Hayes discusses portions of her writing that examine our society's histories and heroes from a deeper perspective. Photo courtesy of the Rasmuson Foundation.

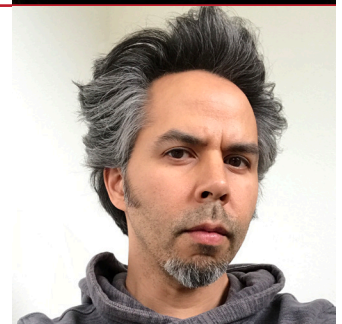


SEPT

Carver and visual artist Jackson Polys (aka Stephen Jackson and Stron Softi) shows his work on the third iteration of the Seward shame pole, which was raised in April 2017 in Saxman Totem Park near Ketchikan. The original pole was erected on Tongass Island by Chief Ebbit in the 1880s and a replica was raised in 1930s.
