## Welcome!

Welcome to the 18th Annual Alaska Folk Festival, a week long celebration of the folk music tradition in Alaska, with folks from all parts of Alaska, as well as the Yukon, British Columbia, Washington, Oregon, California, and yes, even Hawaii. This year the number of performers is rivaled only by the record number of inches of rainfall in Juneau. Indeed, 176 performances, including dances and children's concerts, is a record number. Nevertheless here it is, so sit back and enjoy the music.

Performances begin on Monday, April 6th. Each night of the week there will be performances beginning at 7. Then on Saturday and Sunday afternoons there will be performances beginning at noon as well as workshops on various instruments and dance, beginning around 11 a.m. Mainstage sets are limited to 15 minutes so there is always something different!

Because of the large number of dance bands, this year we are running dances in the National Guard Armory concurrent with the mainstage acts in Centennial Hall. Dances begin on Thursday night at 9 and run until midnight or so. Friday and Saturday nights, dancing begins at 7. Dance sets are one hour. For a listing, please consult your schedule.

Believe it or not, there are actually folks who make it to all the shows. However, if you are not that ambitious, keep your radio tuned to KTOO-FM where the entire festival will be broadcast live.

We will also have special children's concerts in the Armory from Noon until 2 p.m. They will be followed by dance and callers workshops with live music.

A special Songwriters' Showcase will be hosted by Kent Greentree in the Voices Stage in Merchant's Wharf on Saturday at 5 p.m.

Child care is provided (for children over 3) in the Egan Room during the evening concerts at Centennial Hall.

There will be a food fair at the Armory Thursday to Saturday. Ethnic foods and drink will be available. We ask that food **not** be taken into Centennial Hall.

If you have any questions about the schedule, would like to volunteer, or become a member, please stop by the Festival Membership Table in the lobby.

Be sure to attend the Annual Membership Meeting of Alaska Folk Festival, Inc. at the Woodcarver Room in the Westmark Hotel on Friday, April 10th at 5:30 p.m. Please make an effort to attend, as it is **your** festival.



## 1992 Festival Guest Artists


**Josh Graves and Kenny Baker** are two of the most important names in bluegrass music. Their innovative styles have influenced bluegrass musicians for almost four decades now.

Josh is a native of Tellico Plains, Tennessee, where he began his career in 1942. Josh grew up listening to the music of Jimmy Rodgers. He has worked with Wilma Lee & Stony Cooper, Mac Wiseman, and Lester Flatt & Earl Scruggs. Josh's innovative style brought the dobro out of near extinction.

Kenny was born in the small coal mining town of Jenkins, Kentucky. His father, Thaddeus Baker, and his grandfather, Richard Baker, were both outstanding fiddle players. Kenny first began playing fiddle professionally in 1953, at which time he met Josh. In his early years, Kenny played with the Baily Brothers and Don Gibson, but he is best remembered for his 22 years playing with Bill Monroe.

Although Josh and Kenny have been performing together as a duo since October, 1984, they have been friends for almost 40 years now. It is an honor to welcome them to the Alaska Folk Festival!

Josh Graves and Kenny Baker will be playing on Thursday and Sunday nights, and will offer workshops on both Saturday and Sunday.


