Welcome to the 19th Annual Alaska Folk Festival...a full week of music, dance, laughter, enthusiasm, excitement, and merriment. From the living rooms, kitchens, and back porches of Alaska, the Yukon, and the great Northwest comes some of the finest music you're likely to hear on this planet. This year we have over 150 different acts, all bringing you their best. So sit back or kick up your heels to the sounds of the Alaska Folk Festival.

From Monday until Sunday, evening performances begin at 7 p.m. and last until about 11:00 or so. In addition, afternoon concerts begin at Noon on Saturday and Sunday. Also on Saturday and Sunday, workshops take place in the Egan, Hammond, and Hickel Rooms as well as Sheffield Ballroom One. All Main Stage performances in Centennial Hall are broadcast live on KTOO-FM.

Supervised child care is available in the Hickel Room (for children at least three years of age) during the evening performances, with occasional entertainment by children's singers and storytellers. On Saturday afternoon at 2:30, there is a special Children's Concert in Sheffield Ballroom One.

The dances at the Armory were such a huge success last year that we are bringing them back this year. The first dance starts on Thursday evening after the guest artists perform. From there, the dances run concurrently with the performances on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday nights. There's coffee and cookies available at the Armory for that sugar and caffeine high to keep you dancing till midnight and beyond.

The annual meeting of Alaska Folk Festival, Inc. will be held in the Armory on Friday, April 16th at 6 p.m. Election of board members and scheduling are on the agenda. Please attend, as it is your festival. Members make it happen, so our members' voices are important to the process.

On Friday, from 8:30 a.m. until 3 p.m., Juneau's Thursday Night Contra group has organized an informal Coffee & Jam at McPhetres Hall (4th & Gold). And on Saturday from 4 to 6 p.m., and Sunday, from 3 to 5 p.m., come to the Songwriter's Showcase upstairs at The Fiddlehead Restaurant. The Juneau Pioneer Home has also extended an invitation to performers to come out and meet and play for some Alaskan pioneers.

We hope you enjoy this year's festival and we look forward to seeing you all again in the years to come.



Benoît Bourque is one of Québec's leading traditional dancers and dance teachers. He is a veteran member of many of the Province's leading dance ensembles, and was a charter member of the well-known musical group, Eritage, with whom he toured throughout Canada, the United States, and Europe in the 1980's. In addition to being an accomplished step-dancer, Benoît is a talented percussionist, singer, and bon vivant with a gift for teaching. His step dance workshops inspire excellence and helpless giggling in equally generous quantities.

Lisa Ornstein's intense, effervescent style of fiddling reflect years of house visiting with older players across the Province of Québec, and a deep love for the "dance orchestra of one" fiddle tradition. She is well-known throughout Canada and the U.S. as a performer, teacher, advocate, and scholar of traditional Québec fiddling. Born in New England and raised in the Midwest, Lisa took up the violin at an early age. In 1978, she left for Québec on a fellowship to do independent research on French-Canadian fiddling. What started out as a one year venture turned into a 14-year stay, during which she performed and toured with some of the finest musicians and ensembles in the Province. Now living in Maine, Lisa works with her husband, Nick Hawes at the Acadian Archives/Archives Acadiennes at the University of Maine at Fort Kent.



At age twenty-seven, **Sabin Jacques** is a veteran musician and one of the finest Québécois button accordion players of his generation. Born in Amquis, a small village on the Gaspé peninsula of Québec, Sabin got his start in music at the age of fourteen with the help of an uncle who played accordion. By the time he was twenty, he was playing back-up for some of Québec's best-known dance troupes. Since 1986, Sabin has toured in Bulgaria, England, Spain, and Italy, as well as performing at concerts and festivals throughout Québec. Most recently, he signed on as a back-up musician for well-known Acadian singer Edith Butler. An accomplished single, two-, and three-row player, Sabin plays the standard dance repertory of virtuoso accordionists such as Phillippe Bruneau with a sparkling light touch.



Nick Hawes is a musician, folklorist, dance caller, and teacher who has performed at festivals, camps, and dances all across the United States (including Alaska!) and Canada. Born to a musical family, Nick began playing traditional music at a very early age, and he has played and taught literally dozens of different instruments over the years. A talented dance caller and dance composer as well, he was for many years a mainstay of the New England dance scene, performing with virtually all of the major figures in the contra dance revival. Nick's interest in the music and dance of Québec began with a chance meeting with Louis Beaudoin in 1975; eventually, he followed his interest to the source and lived in Québec for several years. Formerly Deputy Director of the National Council for the Traditional Arts, Nick currently works as Assistant Director of the Acadian Archives/Archives Acadiennes at the University of Maine at Fort Kent.
