Returned to Fisco in fall of '65 and went north again to the Yukon in 1866 to 1868 the published book "Alaska and its Resources" 1871 entered Coast Survey and made reconnaissance surveys along coast from Sitka west to end of Aleutians and north in Bering Sea to Nunivak and the Pribloffs. His assistant was Mr. Mark Walrod Harrington. Returned to Wash. D.C. 1874 and employed in Coast Survey Office on Alaskan matters to 1880. Marcus Baker worked with him as assist on U.S.Coast Pilot 1873 to July, 1882. Back in the field in 1880 and surveyed from Sitka to Unalaska and then to Pt. Barrow.

In 1884 he quit and joined the Geological Survey in company with Mr. G.F.Becker made cruise from Sitka to Unalaska to study coal resources. He was a member of the Harriman Alaska Expedition in 1899 and wrote "The Discovery and Exploration of Alaska"

4/21/1956 M.D. ---Devine awarded 25% of value of a barge and cargo he salvaged in 1953, by Federal Judge Geo. H. Boldt, who heard the case in Tacoma this week. The award amounted to approximately \$125,000. Devine was represented by W.T.Beeks, admiralty lawyer, of the Seattle firm of Evans, McLaren, Blaine, Powell and Beeks.

Testimony showed the barge owned by the United Trans. Co broke loose from the tug "Sea Lion" and went aground on Clatsop Spit at mouth of Col. River. She carried benzol owed by the U.S.Gov't. The court took into consideration the dangers faced by Devine in the salvage operations because of the benzol fumes and the fact that he prevented the barge and cargo from becoming a total loss on the Spit.

Believed in thrift and saved his money He won a promotion and when he was 27 he had enough money to buy timberland in Canada----was about to start when a nationwide panic wiped him out. Found a job as manager of a lumber corporation and proved so efficient that the owners took him into partnership. From then, until 1888 he engaged in lumbering in Canada and Mich. U.S.A. Lumber became scarce so he sold out and went to Calif. and in 1893 he founded a lumber camp in Mendocino, County and operated for 6 years. He found it difficult to find vessels to carry his lumber so started obtaining carriers and placed them in the coastwise service----Thus, began his steamship career. His Co. grew until he had a mighty fleet with his ships operating all over the globe. He also acquired vast timberlands in the Pacific N.W.

Died in May, 1932 at the age of 88.
