Left Eng. 9/16/1785, rounded Cape Horn, to Hawaiian Ids. and on July 16, 1786 arr. Cook Inlet. From here they went east and south along the coast as far as Nootka, then to the Hawaiian Ids. They wintered there then in the spring again sailed for Pr. Wm. Sd. Portlock cruised S.E. to Sitka and vicinity and then via Hawaiian Ids. and China to Eng. Dixon followed later.

In 1904 he was in charge of survey of Kiska Hbr and approaches including Kiska Id. and Little Kiska etc.
