ZAGOSKIN

1842-44

(Lt. Laurenti Alexief ---)

Made explorations on the lower Yukon, the Kuskokwim, and in Norton Sd. in this period, uder a comm. from the Russ.-Am. Co. Of this exploration he published an account in Russ. in 2 Vols. at St. Petersburg, 1847-48.

ZAMORA, MIGUEL D.

(Mike)

10/6/1947/8 Governor Gruening pardons Zamora who was serving 20 years for setting fire to his father-in-laws house in Petersburg in 1939. This is the first time this has ever been done by any Alaska Governor.

ZAMORA, MIKE

Juneau Phillipino  
troller.

Sunk his boat early in June about 75 yards from the S. end of Kochu Island (Lynn Canal) about 59° 08.4' N. 135° 23.5' W. Submerged at high tide. (She was raised by Woody Reynolds and towed to Juneau for repairs. Mike told me his wife was steering and ran on the rocks.) 6/12/58 towed to Juneau.

ZAVODSKY, JACK

Juneau pioneer

2/23/1951/8 Died in Juneau at age of 86

ZAREMBO

(Capt. Lt. Dionysius Fedorovich--)

In command of the Russ. Am. Co. ship "Prince Alexander" sailed from Cronstadt Aug. 14, 1840, and via Cape Horn, arr. Sitka Apr. 3, 1841. With him went Lt. Zagoskin. Zarembo had previously been in the Russ. colonies, having gonē there first as a pilot in 1816 with Ponafidin in the "Suworof" and again in 1819 with the same officer in the "Borodino". He surveyed Wrangell harbor in 1834 and Woe-wodski harbor in 1838.

Zarembo, in command of the brig "Chichagof", founded the present town of Wrangell in the spring of 1834, building there a stockade or fort, which after him was named Dionysius.

4/16/1932/2 Age 70, died. Came to Alaske in  
1896 and to Juneau in 1898.

ZIMMERMAN, J.G. 'TEX'

Juneau old timer.

2/28/1930/6 Age. 65, died at St. Anns. Came to  
Juneau in 1900

ZUSMAN, NATHAN

~~P.H. Mar. 9, 1957 PICT. Under investigation by Senate comm. for being involved with the Teamsters Union in rackets in Portland, Ore.~~  
He owns a night club in Portland.

ZYNDA, S

Juneau Hotel man.

1/28;1937/8 Sold his Zynda Hotel to Clarence Wise  
who was formerly with the New Washington Hotel  
in Seattle.

Zynda came to Douglas in 1914 as brewmaster then  
a month later moved to the Juneau Brewery and  
paid the Douglas plant not to operate, etc.
