9/3/1931/3 Undesireables will be 'blue-ticketed' says
Chief of Police Geo. Getchel.

UNEMPLOYMENT

Problems, etc.

- 9/19/1931 Juneau has bad unemployment problem. An employment bureau is to be set up by the Mayor in City Hall.
- 11/27/1931 Effects of depression felt in Alaska last year for the first time say Gov. Geo. Parks. (VG) Latouche operations discontinued and Kennecott greatly reduced.
- 12/3/1931/8 Juneau unemployed men to cut Xmas trees.
- 1/7/1932 Thousands of unemployed storm National Capitol. See card, this file on DEPRESSION
- 3/5/1932/8 165 unemployed in Juneau. See card on ROBBERIES, a conjunctive with unemployment.
- 10/3/1933/3 VG Alaska fisherman with no teeth, forced to buy brush and tooth paste etc. in S.F. in order to get a job in Alaska.
- 12/7/1933/4 No work, no eat" says Chief of Police Martin.
- 12/5/1934 50 to 75 unemployed men march on Fed. Bldg. Led by Fred Patrick, Lloyd H. Bayers, etc.
- 3/27/1936/6 J.C of C. makes protest against influx of unemployed men from States. Contests misinformation in Seattle Times 3/1/1936 exploiting work in Alaska!

12/15/1938/3 Flakne says after 1st of year, unemployment
money will be paid---\$15.00 for 16 weeks.

in what was later Ellingen Apts. then the
Merle Rhodes Apts.

(Geo Nostrand and Geo. Mock were associated in
an undertaking parlor in back of the C.W.
Young Hdwe. in 1918 when "Pr. Sophia" sunk.
