Green Book Oct. 7, 1929

HAGEN

Large tanker

1/15/1938/8 Tanker "Hagen" crashed into the
West Seattle Shiyards in fog today.

HAIDA

Ocean frtr.

1/15/1938 Frt. "Haida" with crew of 38 feared lost in gale off Vancouver Island, B.C. near Carmanah Pt. Wreckage found, also life buoy with her name near by. She was bound from Seattle to China with 5000 tons of sulphur--to run the blockade. Registry changed to British.

Green Book Nov. 30, 1930

Emp. 12/1/1925/6 St. sch. "Halco" of the Hammond S.S.Co. is ashore in a gale on the S side of the Gray's Hbr. jetty. Some of the crew have made shore.....

Emp. 12/2/1925/6 "Halco" total loss, Capt. L.A. Nelson and 21 crewmen saved.

HALCYON

Gas. No. 95914

Green Book Nov. 12, 1918

Empire 12/20/1918 pp.3; story on "Elihu Thompson" tells of worst storm at Unalaska in which five schooners were blown ashore, but the only one wrecked was the whaler "Halcyon" of 'Sea Wolf' fame.

9/20/1946/2 Unit of Grace Lines. Aground on
East Coast of U.S. and reported breaking up.

(off Naked Id.) today and Eng. Carter was killed.
Balance of crew and pass. saved.

5/30/1931 Hard aground on rocks about 229 mi. South of S.F. Most of her 400 pass have been removed by the U.S.S. cruiser "Louisville" Her position is near the place the 7 U.S. destroyers piled up in 1921

6/3/1931/2 "Harvard" doomed. Capt Hillsinger is still on board. C.G. "Tamara" standing by. Heavy seas are pounding her apart.

6/8/1931/2 "Harvard" was off her course when she piled up on the 'graveyard shoals' of Point Arguello. Capt. L.H. Hillsinger was called to the bridge too late to prevent the grounding No fog. Salvage efforts abandoned.

6/13/1931 A.V.G. pict. of the "Harvard" on rocks
on Front page of Empire of this date.

6/23/1931/ Another V.G. pict. of "Harvard"
breaking up on rocks.

7/3/1931/4 Capt. 4 months, 2nd Mate Geo. M.
McVicar, one year, and 3rd Officer Oscar S.
Anderson, 15 days license suspension for the
gross negligence in "Harvard" wreck.

2/27/1929/6 The Frt "Havelas", (Havilla) which is to be scrapped in Japan has a load of 4-million ft. of lumber on board. She will be sold at Dutch Hbr. and towed to Japan.

3/11/1929/6 The Canadian tug "Salvage King" is at Dutch Hbr. and will tow the "Havilah" to Japan.

Old M.S. 1924

Emp. 6/26/1924/6 The M.S. "Helen Hanlen" foundered off Cape Mendocino yesterday. She was loaded with iron rails and ties from Albion, Calif. to Astoria, Ore. Her 10 men crew rowed in to Albion without mishap.
