States S.S.Co.

9/29/1932/8 Frt. "Nevada" is ashore on Amatignak Island in the Aleutians. Jap. frtr. "Ore. Maru" is standing by. She is reported breaking up; and men are seen on the rocks nearby. It is believed the entire crew is safe on shore.

Liner "Pres. Madison" is only 4 hrs. away and proceeding to the scene. 5645 gross; 4105 net; 2800 h.p. Built 1920 at L.A. Calif.

9/30/1932 Only 3 men saved from "Nevada" 32

lives lost. Survivors are on "Pres. Madison"

Left Portland Sept. 16 for Japan. Sent her

**BOB** three days ago. 410.5' x 54.3' x 27.2'

10/1/1932 A 22 year old seaman, one E. Blomberg,

D.A.Disp. 9/8/1915 pp.5. Old account of the loss  
of this boat on Cape Prince of Wales which was  
caught in ice 10/17/1914 with 5 men on board.  
O.W.Rank, Joe Ezina and 3 Eskimo's. all lost.  
Owned by the Women's Home Mission Society of  
Calif. Valued at \$3175.00

1889

On Mar. 28, 1889 the U.S. Men-of-War "Nipsic",  
"Trenton" and "Vandalia" and the German Men-of-  
War, "Adler", "Olga", and "Eber" were all  
blown ashore at Samoa by a hurricane and wreck-  
ed. 4 Officers and 46 men were lost by U.S.  
and 9 Officers and 87 men lost by Germans.

101 saved -----664 lives lost.

NORGE

Large Atlantic  
Liner.

Scandinavian-American Line steamship with  
800 people on board hit a reef on the Island of  
Rockall, 290 miles of the West coast of Scotland  
June 28, 1904. Commanded by Capt. Gundel. Only  
27 were known to be saved.
