TACOMA

Full rigged ship

Caught in ice and crushed. Sank May 19, 1918 with 115 men on board. 94 of the men made it to the main ice feeld and were picked up by various vessels in the vicinity and transferred to the A.P.A. ship "Nushagak" at Dutch Hor. The other 21 men were on a large drifting ice flow and were in considerable danger of being blown to sea and drowning when the ice melted. Forthmately they were found by the U.S.Fisheries vessel, "Roosevelt" on June 8, 1918 and all saved. The "Roosevelt" was under command of Capt. H.Bierd.
