Concerned with voyages on the Russian vessel Olga and American Russian Company vessel Cesarewitch; commencing as Superintendent of iceworks on Wood Island, Kodiak and Kenai. Covers period December 6, 1864 to January, 1869.

1. Letter from Maksoutoff, D. San Francisco, dated 21 March 1868 to Capt. David B. Walker, with instructions regarding ship Cesarewitch. 1ℓ
2. Letter from Charles Baum, secretary American Russian Commercial Co., San Francisco, dated 4 April 1868 to Captain D. Walker with instructions for taking ship Cesarewitch to Sitka and Wood Island. 1ℓ
- 3-4. Letter from Hutchinson, Kohl and Co., San Francisco, dated 18 June 1868 to General John Franklin Miller, Collector of Customs, San Francisco, requesting permission to take Cesarewitch to Kodiak with goods. 1ℓ

On reverse side:

Letter from L. M. Kellog, Deputy Collector of Customs at San Francisco dated 19 June 1868, giving Capt. David Walker permission to load ship *Cesarewitch* with goods for Kodiak.

5. Letter from Charles Baum, Secretary, American Russian Commercial Co., San Francisco, dated 20 June 1868 to Capt. David B. Walker, instructing him to take *Cesarewitch* and cargo to Wood Island and return with cargo of ice. 1ℓ
6. Letter from I. Mora Moss, President, American Russian Commercial Co., and Charles Baum, Secretary, San Francisco, dated 2 November 1868, appointing David Walker as superintendent of the Company at Wood Island. 1ℓ
7. Letter from I. Mora Moss, President American Russian Commercial Co., and Charles Baum, Secretary, San Francisco, dated 2 November 1868 with a notice to all men that Capt. David Walker is appointed Superintendent of the Iceworks and Company operation at Wood Island and District of Kodiak and Kenai. 1ℓ
