BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Scott C. Bone, the 10th Territorial Governor of Alaska, was appointed by President Warren Harding, June, 1921 until Aug., 1925.

Governor Bone and his wife Mary Worth Bone had 7 children. Marguerite was the youngest of the seven children born to Scott and Mary Bone. The Bone's son, Carroll Bone lived in New York City and Los Angeles where he was pursuing a music (voice) career.
