Andrews. Three of the photos were taken by Mary Fleek in the early 1930s. Also included are photos of the Juneau Douglas ferryboat "Teddy" and a Chinese Grave Marker in a Douglas Island cemetery. There are several other donations from Mary Fleek which are located in the Core File.
