



Introduction

This report is a compilation of data collected from Alaska public libraries for fiscal years FY90 and FY91. Included are statistics reported by the libraries as well as selected per capita computations. The libraries included in each year's reporting are those that received the Public Library Assistance Grant for that year.

The statistics collected are based on the Federal State Cooperative System for Public Library Data (FSCS) of the U.S. Department of Education, National Center for Education Statistics. By using this national system and its definitions of terms, Alaska's data is comparable with that of the other 49 states and the District of Columbia. Of course extreme caution should be used in comparing any one library with national or state averages. This is especially true of Alaskan libraries which tend to be atypical in size, and population served. The national data for FY90 is available in a publication entitled *Public Libraries in the U. S. : 1990* by the National Center for Education Statistics, U. S. Department of Education. Data for FY91 is expected to be published in June 1993.

We hope this publication will be useful to administrators and library boards in planning, budgeting and public relations activities. All the information reported in the Annual Reports has been entered into a spreadsheet and specialized tables can be generated upon request. Please contact the State Library if you need special statistical information.

General Information On the Use of the Tables for Public Libraries

The data included in these tables was reported by public libraries in the Annual Reports for FY90 and FY91. Although all libraries reported income and expenditure information, not all libraries collected the same circulation and collection statistics. A number of libraries did not collect attendance, reference or program data. To make the tables more readable, data elements reported as zero and those reported as not collected have been left blank.

The population data was adjusted for some libraries in order to ensure a consistent method of counting and to eliminate double counting. The same sources and methods were used in this publication as in previous editions. In most cases, populations attributed to the *city and borough* libraries correspond to the populations of the area from which they receive tax revenue. The source of this information was the Department of Community and Regional Affairs' ***Certification of Population: July 1, 1990*** and ***Certification of Population: July 1, 1991***. In the case of libraries located in unincorporated areas not certified by DCRA, the figures reported on the Annual Report were used. The population of legal service area for libraries in the *Mat-Su* and *Kenai Boroughs* were calculated as in previous years. Using DCRA figures, each library was credited with the population base of the city and a percentage of the borough wide population based on the percentage of materials circulated by each library. *A. Holmes Johnson Memorial Library* in Kodiak was given the population of the *Kodiak Borough* minus the populations of Chiniak, Old Harbor and Port Lions for the years those libraries reported data.

In compiling the FY90 and FY91 data, we added a library entity called *Bush Services*. The data entered here is a total of the statistics reported for the Books by Mail programs run by the three Regional Libraries in Anchorage, Fairbanks and Juneau. The population assigned to this "library" is the official state population, minus the populations of those communities served by libraries. In FY90 this was (545,774 minus 507,722) 38,052. In FY91 it was (574,182 minus 523,116) 51,066.

By using the statewide population figure and reporting *all* public library services, we feel the data more accurately reflects the true status of library services in Alaska. It does however, present problems when comparing statewide per capita figures with the FY88 and FY89 data.

The Tables

Table 1: Public Library Circulation and Interlibrary Loan

This table shows how often different types of library materials (books, magazines, audio tapes, videos, etc.) were checked out of the library as well as how often the library lent or received materials through Interlibrary Loan.

In 1989 we reported the circulations per capita statewide were 6.11, well above the national average of 5.13. In FY90, the Alaska per capita circulations appears to have fallen to 5.48 while the national average has risen to 5.75. Why? When we take a closer look at the figures we find that in FY89, the population figure used was 502,270 (the sum of the populations served for each of the reporting libraries). This figure **did not** include people living in unincorporated areas or those served by Regional Services. A more valid comparison can be made using the FY90 data of 5.48 per capita with the 5.97 figure in FY91.

Table 2: Public Library Collections

Table 2 provides an overview of the size of a library's book, audio, video and magazine collections, the number of book volumes added during the year, and the number of book volumes per capita. In FY90 the national volumes per capita was 2.53, in Alaska it was 2.95. In FY91 the figure increase again to 3.10.

Table 3: Public Library Income

This table provides information on the sources of income for Alaskan libraries: Local (city or borough), State, or Federal Government funding, and Other. **Other** is important for many of Alaska's smaller libraries because they are operated by private, non-profit organizations. The income from these nongovernmental sources is reported under this category. Although it is hard to make comparisons year by year for the individual data elements in this table, generally, state and federal funding has remained stable, and local support is increasing. Income statewide increased by 1.06% over the previous year in FY90 and 1.22% in FY91.

Table 4: Public Library Expenditures

This table shows how libraries spend their budgets. Columns are included for salaries, benefits, collections (books, magazines, audiovisual materials, etc.), operating expenditures (maintenance, travel, services and supplies), and capital expenditures (if any). Nationally, in FY90, salaries and benefits accounted for 62.5% of the total operating budget; library collections 15.7% and all other expenditures 21.8%. The total operating expenditures per capita was \$16.28. For FY90 in Alaska, 68.5% was spent on staff expenditures; 14.7% on collections; and 16.8% on other. Per capita operational expenditures were \$23.65. In FY91 staffing costs were 60.1% of the budget; collections were 12.7%; and other had increased to 26.7%. The per capita costs rose to \$28.59.

Dollarwise, Alaskan libraries spent almost \$2.5 million more in FY91 than in FY90 and the largest increase was in the other expenditures category. A quick look at the data reveals that in FY90 Anchorage Municipal Libraries reported less than \$500,000 in other expenditures. In FY91 Anchorage reported \$2.5 million. Why the increase? Expenditures for *Building Operations* in FY91 include over \$1.6 million in support provided by Municipal Property and Facilities Management. These monies are expended through a charge-back system within the municipal government and were not previously reported as part of the library budget. This change in accounting practices is significant. It raised the per capita expenditures for Anchorage from \$20.07 (FY90) to \$29.84 (FY91), and further explains the statewide per capita cost rise from \$23.65 to \$28.59.

Table 5: Public Library Expenditures on Collections

Table 5 subdivides the library collection expenditures by format: books, subscriptions, audiovisuals and other (microforms, software, maps, etc.) Collection expenditures per capita rose from \$3.47 in FY90 to \$3.62 in FY91. In FY90 libraries spent 63.8% of their collections budget on books and serials; 18.5% on periodicals; 5.6% on audiovisuals; and 12.1% on other materials. In FY91 expenditures for books and serials represented 67.3% of the collections budget; 21.1% for periodicals; 7% for audiovisuals and only 4.6% for other materials.

Table 6: Public Library Staff and Volunteers

This table shows the composition of the library staff: librarians with a masters degree in library science (MLS), all people working as librarians, and the technical and clerical staff. It also includes information on volunteers and the number of hours contributed to the library by volunteers. Although there was no real difference in the number of library employees between FY90 (254.58) and FY91 (254.50), libraries employed more people as librarians and fewer as technical or clerical staff. The most disturbing comparison of FY90-FY91 figures are those reported for volunteers and volunteer hours. In FY90, 1900 volunteers contributed 46,006 hours. In FY91, 1651 volunteers contributed 42,418 hours.

Table 7: Public Library Hours, Attendance, Reference, and Programs

Table 7 covers the number of hours per week the library is open, annual library attendance, the number of reference questions answered, and the number of programs presented during the year. The last three are indicators of how heavily the library is used. It is the attendance and reference question data elements that small libraries find the most difficult to count and report accurately. The State Library encourages libraries to use a sampling technique as described in the *Manual for Small Libraries* to increase the reliability of this information.




