


Introduction

In the following pages, the Alaska State Library presents a summary of the public library statistics collected from FY88 through FY93. The tables and graphs in Part I offer a comparison by fiscal year with a breakout for the 3 major public libraries. Parts II and III are the tables for FY92 and FY93 by library name and population. Included are statistics reported by the libraries as well as selected per capita computations. The libraries included in each year's reporting are those that received the *Public Library Assistance Grant* for that year.

The statistics collected are based on the Federal State Cooperative System for Public Library Data (FSCS) of the U.S. Department of Education, National Center for Education Statistics. By using this national system and its definitions of terms, Alaska's data is comparable with that of the other 49 states and the District of Columbia. Of course extreme caution should be used in comparing any one library with national or state averages. This is especially true of Alaskan libraries which tend to be atypical in size, and population served. The national data for FY92 is available in a publication entitled *Public Libraries in the U. S. : 1992* by the National Center for Education Statistics, U. S. Department of Education. Data for FY93 is expected to be published in June 1995.

We hope this publication will be useful to administrators and library boards in planning, budgeting and public relations activities. All the information reported in the Annual Reports has been entered into a spreadsheet and specialized tables can be generated upon request. Please contact the State Library if you need special statistical information.

General Information On the Use of the Tables for Public Libraries

The data included in these tables was reported by public libraries in the *Annual Reports* for FY88 through FY93. Although all libraries reported income and expenditure information, not all libraries collected the same circulation and collection statistics. A number of libraries did not collect attendance, reference or program data. To make the tables more readable, data elements reported as zero and those reported as not collected have been left blank.

The population data was adjusted for some libraries in order to ensure a consistent method of counting and to eliminate double counting. The same sources and methods were used in this publication as in previous editions. In most cases, populations attributed to the *city and borough* libraries correspond to the populations of the area from which they receive tax revenue. The source of this information was the Department of Community and Regional Affairs' *Certification of Population* for the years cited. In the case of libraries located in unincorporated areas not certified by DCRA, the figures reported on the *Annual Report* were used. The population of legal service area for libraries in the Mat-Su and Kenai Boroughs were calculated as in previous years. Using DCRA figures, each library was credited with the population base of the city and a percentage of the borough wide population based on the percentage of materials circulated by each library. A. Holmes Johnson Memorial Library in Kodiak was given the population of the Kodiak Borough minus the populations of Chiniak, Old Harbor and Port Lions for the years those libraries reported data.

In FY90 we added a library entity called *Bush Services*. The data entered here is a total of the statistics reported for the *Books by Mail* programs run by the three Regional Libraries in Anchorage, Fairbanks and Juneau. The population assigned to this "library" is the official state population, minus the populations of those communities served by libraries. The statistics for FY88 and FY89 were adjusted in the same manner to present a valid comparison. By using the statewide population figure and reporting *all* public library services, we feel the data more accurately reflects the true status of library services in Alaska.

In compiling the 6 year summary statistics, some data errors were corrected. Although these errors were not particularly significant, readers should be aware that comparisons of annual totals and per capita calculations may vary from those published in previous editions.

The Tables

Table 1: Public Library Circulation and Interlibrary Loan

This table shows how often different types of library materials (books, magazines, audio tapes, videos, etc.) were checked out of the library as well as how often the library lent or received materials through Interlibrary Loan.

In FY92 Alaska's circulation per capita, 6.32, was just slightly better than the national average of 6.02. The national average for Interlibrary Loan lending in FY92 was 28.5 items per 1,000 population. In Alaska it was 29.45. The Interlibrary Loan borrowing figures however tell a different story. Alaskan libraries borrow almost twice as many items. In FY92 they borrowed 45.66 items per 1,000 population compared to 27.59 nationally.

Table 2: Public Library Collections

Table 2 provides an overview of the size of a library's book, audio, video and magazine collections, the number of book volumes added during the year, and the number of book volumes per capita. In FY92 national volumes per capita was 2.7 up from 2.53 in FY89. In Alaska, per capita volumes rose to 3.36 from 3.08. This follows the national.

Statistics show a dramatic change in public library collections from print to media formats in recent years. This change is even more emphatic in Alaska. In FY89 public libraries nationally reported 77.53 audio materials and 1.37 videos per 1,000 population. Alaska reported 176.9 audio and 28 video. In FY92 the national numbers were 94.8 audio and 28.4 video while Alaska reported 158.89 audio and 44.94 video items per 1,000 population.

Table 3: Public Library Income

This table provides information on the sources of income for Alaskan libraries: Local (city or borough), State, Federal Government, and Other funding. *Other* is important for many of Alaska's smaller libraries because they are operated by private, non-profit organizations. The income from these non governmental sources is reported under this category. Although it is hard to make comparisons year by year for the individual data elements in this table, generally, local support as represented by local governments and other has increased. State funding has decreased, and federal funding has risen slightly. In FY89 local government funding represented 86.62% of library budgets statewide. 8.93% was provided by state government, 1.41% by federal dollars and 2.55% other. In FY93 local government provided 87.96% of the funding for libraries, only 5.39% was income from state government, the federal share has increased to 2.36%, and other increased to 4.29%.

Table 4: Public Library Expenditures

This table shows how libraries spend their budgets. Columns are included for salaries, benefits, collections (books, magazines, audiovisual materials, etc.), operating expenditures (maintenance, travel, services and supplies), and capital expenditures (if any). Nationally, in

FY89, salaries and benefits accounted for 62.4% of the total operating budget, library collections 15.9% and all other expenditures 21.7%. The total operating expenditures per capita was \$15.10. For FY89 in Alaska, 68.9% was spent on staff expenditures; 14.6% on collections; and 16.5% on other. Per capita operational expenditures were \$24.96

In FY93 in Alaskan libraries, staffing costs were 64% of the budget, collections were 11.7%, and other had increased to 24.1%. The per capita costs rose to \$29.52. Dollarwise, Alaskan libraries spent almost \$5 million more in FY93 than in FY89.

Table 5: Public Library Expenditures on Collections

Table 5 subdivides the library collection expenditures by format: books, subscriptions, audiovisuals and other (microforms, software, maps, etc.) Collection expenditures per capita rose from \$3.10 in FY88 to \$3.48 in FY93. In FY88 Alaskan libraries spent 73.33% of their collections budget on books and serials; 12.98% on periodicals; 6.66% on audiovisuals; and 7.03% on other materials. In FY93 expenditures for books and serials represented 58.99% of the collections budget; 23.09% for periodicals; 6.38 % for audiovisuals and only 11.54% for other materials. A major portion of this change is due to the increased costs of serials and subscriptions. Libraries are spending a greater portion of their budgets on microform editions of the titles they previously purchased in paper.

Table 6: Public Library Staff and Volunteers

This table shows the composition of the library staff: Librarians with a masters degree in library science (MLS), all people working as librarians, and the technical and clerical staff. It also includes information on volunteers and the number of hours contributed to the library by volunteers, although these numbers may not be as reliable as the numbers reported for paid staff.

The FY88-FY93 Statewide chart indicates that in the area of staffing, libraries have scarcely kept up with population growth, and the increase is in the ranks of technicians and clerks. Alaska's net gain of MLS librarians in this 6 year period was less than 7. It will be interesting to see if in FY94 and FY95 this number increases due to the University of Arizona Distance Delivery MLS program.

Table 7: Public Library Hours, Attendance, Reference, and Programs

Table 7 covers the number of hours per week the library is open, annual library attendance, the number of reference questions answered, and the number of programs presented during the year. The last three are indicators of how heavily the library is used. It is the attendance and reference question data elements that small libraries find the most difficult to count and report accurately. The State Library encourages libraries to use a sampling technique as described in the *Manual for Small Libraries* to increase the reliability of this information.














