

General Information On the Use of the Tables for Public Libraries

The data included in these tables was reported by public libraries in the *Annual Reports* for FY1999 and FY2000. Although all libraries reported income and expenditure information, not all libraries collected the same circulation and collection statistics. A number of libraries did not collect attendance, reference, or program data. To make the tables more readable, data elements reported as zero and those reported as not collected have been left blank.

The population data was adjusted for some libraries in order to ensure a consistent method of counting and to eliminate double counting. The same sources and methods were used in this publication as in previous editions. In most cases, populations attributed to the *city and borough* libraries correspond to the populations of the area from which they receive tax revenue. The source of population information was the Department of Community and Economic Development's **Community Profiles** for FY1999 and the U.S. Bureau of the Census for FY2000.

The populations of legal service areas for libraries in the Mat-Su and Kenai Boroughs were calculated as in previous years. Using DCED figures, each library was credited with the population base of the city and a percentage of the borough-wide population based on the percentage of materials circulated by each library. A. Holmes Johnson Memorial Library in Kodiak was given the population of the Kodiak Borough minus the populations of Chiniak, Old Harbor, Ouzinkie, and Port Lions.

The last library entity listed in each table is identified as *Regional Services*. The data entered here are a total of the statistics reported for the *Books by Mail* programs run by the two Regional Libraries in Fairbanks and Juneau. The population assigned to this "library" is the official state population, minus the populations of those communities served by libraries. By using the statewide population figure and reporting *all* public library services, we feel the data more accurately reflects the true status of library services in Alaska.

The Tables

Table 1: Circulation and Interlibrary Loan

This table shows how often different types of library materials (books, magazines, audio tapes, videos, etc.) were checked out of the library, as well as how often the library lent or received materials through interlibrary loan.

- In FY1999 and FY2000, Alaska's circulation per capita was 6.16 and 5.84 respectively. The FY1998 national per capita circulation was 6.6.
- The national average for interlibrary loan lending in FY1998 was 52.0 items per 1,000 population. In Alaska, it was 29.7 in FY1999 and 38.2 in FY2000.
- The number of items borrowed by Alaskan libraries is lower than the national average. In FY1999 and FY2000, Alaskan libraries borrowed 47.2 and 45.5 items respectively per 1,000 population, compared to the FY1998 national figure of 52.1.

Table 2: Collections

Table 2 provides an overview of the size of a library's book, audio, video, electronic, and magazine collections, the number of book volumes added during the year, and the number of book volumes per capita.

- In FY1998, per capita national book and serial volumes were 2.9. In Alaska, the FY1999 per capita volumes were 3.46 and the FY2000 per capita volumes were 3.55.
- Statistics continue to show changes in public library collections from print to media formats. In FY1990, Alaskan libraries reported 32.8 videos per 1,000 population. This increased to 137.6 videos per 1,000 in FY2000.
- It is interesting to note that holdings for audio materials have decreased from over 93,375 items in FY1990 to just 81,000 items in FY2000.

Table 3: Income

This table provides information on the sources of income for Alaskan libraries: local (city or borough), state, federal government, and other funding. **Other** is important for many of Alaska's smaller libraries because they are operated by private, non-profit organizations. The income from these non-governmental sources is reported under this category.

- Although it is hard to make comparisons year by year for the individual data elements in this table, generally, local support has remained constant, state funding has decreased, and federal and other funding has increased.
- Nationally, in FY1998, 77% of public library income was provided by local sources, 13% by the state government, 1% by federal government, and 9% other. This compares with Alaska's FY2000 numbers of 83.6% local, 3.0% state, 4.9% federal, and 8.5% other.

Table 4: Expenditures

This table shows how libraries spend their budgets. Columns are included for salaries, benefits, collections (books, magazines, audiovisual materials, etc.), operating expenditures (maintenance, travel, services and supplies), and capital expenditures (if any).

- Nationally, in FY1998, salaries and benefits accounted for over 64% of the total operating budget, library collections 15%, and all other expenditures 21%. The total operating expenditures per capita were \$23.92.
- For FY1999, Alaska's libraries spent 63.1% on staff; 12.2% on collections; and 24.7% on other. Per capita operational expenditures were \$35.20.
- For FY2000, Alaska's libraries spent 63.4% on staff; 12.3% on collections; and 24.3% on other. Per capita operational expenditures were \$36.13.

Table 5: Expenditures on Collections

Table 5 subdivides the library collection expenditures by format: books, subscriptions, audiovisuals and other (microforms, computer software, maps, etc.).

- Collection expenditures per capita rose from \$3.47 in FY1990 to \$4.43 in FY2000. In FY1990, Alaskan libraries spent 63.8% of their collections budget on books and serials; 18.5% on periodicals; 5.6% on audiovisuals; and 12.1% on other materials.
- In FY2000, expenditures for books and serials in Alaskan libraries represented 53.1% of the collections budget; 29.5% for periodicals; 8.1% for audiovisuals and 9.3% for other materials.

Table 6: Staff and Volunteers

This table shows the composition of the library staff: librarians with a Masters Degree in Library Science (MLS), all people working as librarians, and the technical and clerical staff. It also includes information on volunteers and the number of hours contributed to the library by volunteers, although these numbers may not be as reliable as the numbers reported for paid staff.

- Staffing levels have improved over the last decade. In FY1990, the average number of patrons for each staff member was 2,256 in Alaska. In FY2000, each staff member served an average of 1,935 Alaskans.
- Nationally in FY1998, the average number of staff members for each patron was 2,164.

Table 7: Hours, Attendance, Reference, and Programs

Table 7 covers the number of hours per week the library is open, annual library attendance, the number of reference questions answered, and the number of programs presented during the year. The last three are indicators of how heavily the library is used.

It is the attendance and reference question data elements that small libraries find the most difficult to count and report accurately. The State Library encourages libraries each year to run a week-long survey held during a typical month (a month with few holidays and without school vacations) to increase the reliability of this information.

- Alaskans use reference service much less often than patrons nationally. During FY1990 and FY2000, Alaskans participated in .60 and .57 reference transactions respectively per capita. Nationally in FY1998, Americans engaged in 1.1 reference transactions per capita.









FY2000 Income by Source








Annual Attendance
