Now What?

Start using NoveList, the database for readers and those who care about readers.

Searching

Find a Favorite Author. Browse a list of all authors in the database. Enter an author's name or part of a name with * and bring up a listing of their works. Sort the list by author, title, or publication year. Click on a title and you will find publishing information, subject headings, and often lexile rating, description, series, reviews, lists, guides, links to appropriate book discussions, websites, and suggestions for similar books as well.

Find a Favorite Title. Browse a list of all titles in the database. Enter a title or part of one with an * and bring up a list. Click on one of the titles to display information.

Find a Series Name. Enter the name of a series, like Star Trek, or part of a name like harl* for Harlequin and retrieve a list of titles. Click on one of the titles to display information.

Describe a Plot. Here is where NoveList really gets fun! What kind of stories do you like? Women detectives who are lawyers in Chicago? 18th century mysteries set in England? Just enter terms like mystery + England +

18th century, etc. and you'll retrieve a list. Click on a title link and find a page of information on that title plus a link to similar titles.

Boolean Search. Use a series of dropdown lists to enter just the terms you want.

Browsing

Best Fiction. First select a reading level from adult, young adult, children's, or easy. Choose an item, then one of the awards lists, then a subcategory, and you will get a list of authors.

Explore Fiction. Do a Best Fiction search and choose a title. You'll always have the option to click on the *Find Similar Books* from a book title page.

Search Authors, Titles, Series Names, and Subjects within all the lists in the key fields in NoveList. For an alphabetical search, enter a letter, a word, or part of a word and NoveList will jump to that point. Choose relevancy ranked if you want to enter one or more complete words.

Additional Help

Author Read-alikes. Find short essays on popular authors and suggestions and links to other authors that are similar.

Book Discussion Guides. Got a book group? NoveList offers guides to keep the discussion lively in both adult and young adult levels. Guides also list titles for further discussion and include a list of forthcoming guides to aid groups in their choice of material.

Book Talks. For teachers, librarians, or anyone who leads talks on young adult or children's level.

Feature Articles. A great place to go to find all sorts of surprising items. Definitely for the booklover, this area provides an index for a variety of sections for adults, young adults, and children. There is also a browseable list of articles on various topics. A bibliophile's paradise!
