How Does the Commission Work?

The Alaska Legislature created the Regulatory Commission of Alaska in 1999, giving it broad authority to regulate 198 utilities and 21 pipeline carriers throughout the State. As of this annual report, the Commission monitors 630 active certificates for public utilities and pipelines. These certificates cover a broad range of activities, from provisional certificates for small village water and wastewater systems to fully regulated telecommunications, electric, and natural gas monopolies.

Authority

Alaska Statutes 42.04 - 42.06 authorize the Commission to regulate public utilities and pipeline carriers by certifying qualified providers of public utility and pipeline services and to ensure that they provide safe and adequate services and facilities at just and reasonable rates, terms, and conditions. This keeps rates as low as possible while allowing the regulated entities an opportunity (but not a guarantee) to earn a fair return. The Commission also determines the per kilowatt-hour support for eligible customers of electric utilities under the Power Cost Equalization program (AS 42.45).

Structure

Five full-time Commissioners are appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Legislature for six-year terms. Each year, the Commission elects a Chairman for a one-year term. Upon election, the Chairman assumes responsibility for administrative functions of the Commission, becomes the policy spokesperson, assigns dockets, and coordinates public meeting activities, in addition to shouldering regular commissioner docket work. The Chairman is ultimately responsible for the timeliness

of the Commission's adjudication process, meeting statutory timelines, and serving as the Commission's liaison to the legislative and the executive branches of state government.

The Commission's staff includes administrative law judges, engineers, financial analysts, telecommunications specialists, tariff analysts, consumer protection officers, paralegals, administrative and support staff.

Process

As a regulatory decision making body, the Commission exercises delegated legislative power in two ways. First, the Commission is authorized to adopt regulations it deems necessary to carry out its mission. As with other state agencies, the Commission's regulations are adopted through a public process, subject to the Administrative Procedure Act (APA). Second, the Commission decides dockets (cases) brought before it or opened on its own motion. Each decision is reached quasi-judicially – that is to say, the decision must be based on evidence of record gathered in docketed proceedings. All dockets are closely scheduled, but the due process rights of parties, carefully observed by the Commission, mainly govern their timing.

In the course of a hearing, parties participating may include the subject public utility, the pipeline carrier, and the Regulatory Affairs Public Advocacy section of the Attorney General's Office.

In cases where millions of dollars may be at stake, or important issues of regulatory policy arise, a number of intervenors, representing interests as diverse as low-income customers and large industrial customers, may also participate. They too may employ expert witnesses and attorneys. Intervenors often seek involvement because regulatory decisions can result in gains or losses even for those who do not participate. Cases raise issues of law, economics, accounting, finance and engineering that can establish legal precedent for future cases.

Parties present sworn testimony and evidence of expert witnesses on matters at issue. Witnesses may be cross-examined by the attorneys representing each party.

Reaching decisions, which consider the often-competing interests of concerned parties, in pursuit of outcomes which protect and promote the overall public interest is one way to view the Commission's role. Each decision, which can be appealed to state or federal court, must be supported by the evidentiary record and applicable laws and regulations.

When do we need the Regulatory Commission of Alaska?

In most cases, when utilities or pipeline carriers request changes in either their rates or types of services they provide, the Commission provides notice to the public and allows thirty days for comments. The Commission then acts to

approve or disapprove the proposal. Public notices appear as advertisements in the local newspaper or are otherwise distributed or published as our statutes or regulations require. Some notices are also provided directly by the utilities in the form of flyers mailed with utility bills.

What does the Regulatory Commission of Alaska regulate?

Most entities providing telecommunications, electric, natural gas, water, sewer, garbage, or steam services to ten or more customers are required to have a certificate to operate. A public utility or pipeline carrier must obtain a certificate of public convenience and necessity, which describes the authorized service area and scope of operations of the utility or pipeline carrier. A certificate may be issued when the Commission finds the applicant to be fit, willing, and able to provide the service. The Commission regulates the rates, services, and practices of utilities and pipeline carriers that meet the criteria for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to provide service to the public for compensation. However, there are utilities that are not economically regulated; these include some local, government-owned utilities, very small utilities, most cable television providers, cellular phone providers, and cooperatives whose members have voted to become deregulated.

Statutory Deadlines



s part of its Sunset Review Report issued in October 2006, the Division of Legislative Audit

found “[o]ur review of RCA’s decisions indicated the commission is consistently meeting the timelines set out in statute. This demonstrates RCA is committed to being as timely as possible. We urge the commission to take the additional step of putting timelines, for the actions not covered by statute, into regulation.”¹

The Commission improved its internal procedures, to include issuing initiating orders in dockets which specify the applicable statutory deadline date or indicate that the date will be provided once the docket information necessary to set the date is available. The Commission employs administrative law judges who oversee the procedural schedule of every docketed matter to ensure timely movement. The Commission is anticipating going “live” with its new case management system and its associated web portals by early Fiscal Year 2008. This system will improve the setting, communication, and achievement of deadlines. For instance, the general public and the parties in a proceeding will have immediate web access to view all the important dates affecting any proceeding before the Commission. Commission staff will have powerful calendaring and tracking tools not previously available to them, as well as better and quicker access to data, to help them perform the research needed for high quality analysis necessary to complete their tasks.

The Commission is forging ahead with external self-improvement projects as well. In R-06-1—In the Matter of the Consideration of Changes to Regulations Addressing Completeness Determinations for Applications—the Commission is currently working with interested

parties on regulations which may affect deadlines and streamline public notice requirements. In R-06-10—In the Matter of the Consideration of Potential Changes to Statutes Governing the Procedures and Operations of the Regulatory Commission of Alaska—the Commission proposed to the legislature adding new statutory timelines for those matters not currently covered by statutes or regulations. The legislature passed HB 209 (Chapter 36, SLA 2007), which sets a new timeline of 180 days for adjudicated docket matters that come before the Commission that are not otherwise subject to an existing timeline. The majority of the provisions in the bill became effective July 3, 2007; their affect will be more fully reported in the Commission’s FY 08 annual report, covering July 1, 2007 to June 30, 2008.

General Rules

Pursuant to AS 42.05.175 and unless a federal requirement applies, most Commission dockets are subject to timelines of between 180 and 450 days. Regulations dockets have a 730 day timeline.

Pursuant to AS 42.05.175(f), the Commission may extend the statutory timeline for up to 90 days if the Commission (1) reasonably finds good cause to extend the deadline, and (2) issues a written order setting out good cause and extending the timeline.

Pursuant to AS 42.05.175(h)and(j), if the Commission does not issue and serve a final order on most kinds of dockets or suspended tariffs within the statutory timeline, including any extension(s), the application, petition, or tariff is considered approved and goes into effect immediately.

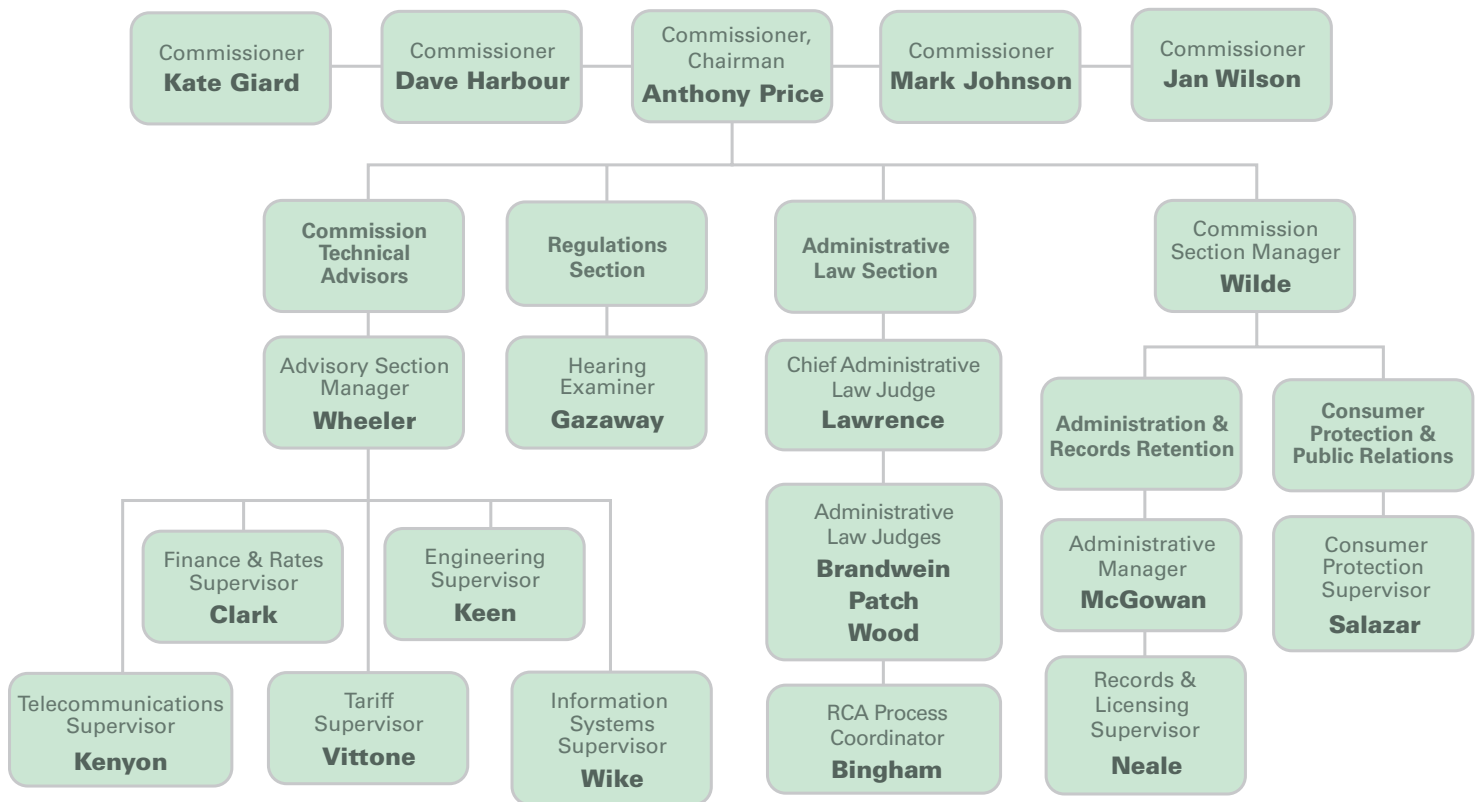

Commissioner Price has experience working in a wide and diverse range of business and public sector positions. Prior to his appointment to the Commission, Commissioner Price had been the Director of Public Finance for the Municipality of Anchorage. In addition to his position with the Municipality of Anchorage, Commissioner Price worked as a financial consultant and spent 10 years as cash manager for the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation. Throughout the 1980s, Commissioner Price held a variety of positions with Veco, Inc., Calista Corporation, and Alaska Finance and Insurance Company. Commissioner Giard's work experience includes ten years as a public accountant working for national CPA firms in Massachusetts, Michigan, and Alaska. As a practicing CPA, Commissioner Giard's clients covered a wide spectrum of industry including manufacturing, banking, natural resources, and retail companies.

In addition to working for KPMG as a public accountant in Alaska, Chairman Giard served as the chief operating officer of Alaskan Choice Television, promoting wireless cable services over UHF frequencies in Anchorage, Fairbanks, and Wasilla and working on Federal Communications Commission regulatory issues.

Commissioner Harbour completed undergraduate work at Colorado State University and earned a Master of Science degree in Communications-Journalism from Murray State University. The former Army officer is a graduate of the Defense Information School and lifetime civilian alumnus of the Air War College. He coordinated public affairs strategy for the two dozen producer and gas pipeline members of Arctic Gas Consortium, arranging public support for passage of the Alaska Natural Gas Transportation Act of 1976.

He serves as Co-Vice Chairman of the Gas Committee for the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners (NARUC) and as Chairman of the Gas Committee for the Western Conference of Public Utility Commissioners. He is NARUC's official representative to the Interstate Oil and Gas Compact Commission. In those roles he assisted in coordinating national support for passage of the Alaska Natural Gas Pipeline Act of 2004.

He served as Alaska director of government relations for Atlantic Richfield Company, as CEO of a municipal authority and a statewide

security company, and as a management consultant to businesses, government, and non-profit organizations.

Commissioner Harbour is the recipient of various citations and awards for community service, having served as Chairman of the Anchorage Chamber of Commerce, Alaska Council on Economic Education, and Hugh O'Brien Youth Foundation-Alaska. He was President of the American Bald Eagle Foundation and the Alaska Press Club. He assisted in founding Anchorage's Saturday Market, the Eisenhower-Alaska Statehood Monument Foundation, Arctic Power, the Alliance, the Anchorage Downtown Partnership, and served as a commissioner of Anchorage's Heritage Land Bank, the Anchorage Organizing Committee, and the Anchorage Bicentennial Commission. Jan Wilson

Commissioner

Appointment: April 11, 2006 - March 1, 2012

Commissioner Wilson is an attorney, admitted to practice law in Alaska since 1975. She was a commissioner and the last chairman of the Alaska Pipeline Commission (APC), the agency created to administer AS 42.06, the Pipeline Act. In 1981 the APC merged into the Alaska Public Utilities Commission (APUC). Commissioner Wilson served as an administrative law judge for the APUC and its successor agency, the Regulatory Commission of Alaska (RCA) from the time of the merger until her appointment to the Commission in 2006.

Commissioner Wilson has extensive experience in oil and gas pipeline issues. As an APC commissioner and an administrative law judge she worked closely with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC), which regulates interstate oil and gas pipelines. She conducted all proceedings the APC, APUC, or RCA held concurrently with the FERC from 1980 to 2006. Earlier in her career, Commissioner Wilson was

City Attorney for the City of Kenai and an Assistant Attorney General in Juneau, serving in the Oil and Gas Special Litigation section.

Commissioner Wilson earned an undergraduate degree in Economics from Mount Holyoke College and a law degree from the University of Denver.

Significant Events: Engineering

July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2007

Oil Pipeline

Docket P-07-8 - We granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (Certificate) to Marathon Oil Company and Union Oil Company of Californian d/b/a Cook Inlet Gas Gathering System (CIGGS). CIGGS was constructed in 1971 and 1972 to move natural gas from the west side of the Cook Inlet to newly-created markets along the east of the inlet such as Kenai, Soldotna, and Anchorage. With CIGGS being constructed prior to January 1, 1974 and having operated without major modifications since that time, a statutory provision allowing grandfathering of older systems enabled us to issue a Certificate for a pipeline without conducting hearings.

Dockets U-06-112 and P-07-6 -The North Slope Borough (NSB) submitted separate applications for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (Certificate) for a natural gas distribution system located within the community of Nuiqsut and for a natural gas pipeline from the Alpine Field to the community of Nuiqsut. We granted NSB a Certificate for the natural gas distribution system under our public utility statutes. However, we did not certificate NSB's natural gas pipeline as a public utility. Based on the information provided in the application, we determined that the existing natural gas pipeline was a common carrier pipeline and should be addressed under our pipeline statutes. We therefore opened a separate proceeding Docket P 07-6, and conducted a public hearing. An order will be issued in the near future determining the disposition of the application.

Electric

Docket U-07-1 – After receiving informal complaints about power outages of extended duration in the Eagle River area, we opened a formal investigation into the quality of services provided by Matanuska Electric Association, Inc. (MEA). The hearings conducted during the investigation revealed technical deficiencies in the Briggs Tap, owned by MEA. The deficiencies made the line susceptible to outages during heavy snow load conditions. Limited communication between the line and MEA's dispatch center rendered MEA incapable of remotely operating the switch. MEA took steps to remediate the deficiencies and is working on long-term plans to improve communication and cooperation with neighboring utilities to prevent outages and improve response time in the result of outages.

Docket R-06-5 – We opened this proceeding to consider the adoption of regulations, implementing the amendments to the Public Utilities Regulatory Policies Act of 1978 by the Energy Policy Act of 2005 (EPAAct). The EPAAct amendments address smart metering, interconnection standards, net metering, fuel source diversification, and fossil fuel generation efficiency standards. We bifurcated this proceeding into Tracks A and B, based on the timelines provided by the EPAAct for consideration of the amendments. Track A includes smart metering and interconnection standards. Track B of this proceeding will address net metering, fuel source diversification, and fossil fuel generation efficiency standards. It will be investigated during the 2008 fiscal year.

Natural Gas

Docket U-06-107 – ENSTAR Natural Gas Company (ENSTAR) sought to enter into a special contract with Fairbanks Natural Gas, LLC (FNG) for gas sales and transportation service. The special contract was

filed on September 26, 2006, with a requested effective date of October 1, 2006. FNG's contract with Aurora Power Resources and Aurora Gas LLC (Aurora) expired without FNG successfully negotiating a new agreement for the supply of natural gas. FNG sought to purchase natural gas from ENSTAR and have it delivered to its Point Mackenzie facility where it liquefies natural gas and transports it via the road system to Fairbanks. We approved the special contract on an interim and refundable basis and later clarified the terms and conditions under which FNG was to purchase gas from ENSTAR. We also required FNG to file audited financial statements every three years and provide bimonthly updates on its progress in securing a contract with another natural gas producer.

Water/Wastewater

Docket U-06-120 – Harvest Properties, LLC (Harvest) submitted an application for an Initial Finding of Public Convenience and Necessary for a proposed stand-alone community water system and a sanitary sewer collection system to serve a subdivision located within the Municipality of Anchorage. Harvest was unable to provide supplemental information on the proposed sanitary sewer collection system as requested. As a result, we rejected, without prejudice for refiling, the portion of the application concerning the proposed sanitary sewer collection system. We also could not find the public convenience and necessity required the service of the stand alone community water system because of the close proximity of another certificated utility, which had adequate capacity to serve the potential customers.

Refuse

Docket U-06-115 – Based on complaints filed by other regulated refuse utilities, we opened an informal investigation which found Ramsey & Sons Trucking (RST) delinquent in filing annual reports and paying regulatory cost charges (RCC). We scheduled a hearing for RST to show cause why its Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (Certificate) should not be revoked and why it should not be assessed regulatory costs and civil penalties. After the hearing was completed, we required RST to file annual reports and pay RCCs for the years ending 2005 and 2006, by the end of April, 2007, and to continue filing annual reports and pay RCCs on a timely basis in the future. RST initially failed to file annual reports and pay RCCs as required. After scheduling a date certain at which RST's Certificate would be revoked unless it complied with our order, RST filed the required annual reports and paid its RCCs.

Small Hydroelectric

We were given the statutory responsibility to develop a set of hydropower licensing regulations to establish a regulatory program allowing small scale (less than 5 MW) hydroelectric projects to achieve permitting within the State of Alaska rather than with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC). The initial proceeding was closed due to time limitations under AS 42.05.175. We awarded a contract to an experienced consultant in January 2007. The consultant is working with us to draft hydropower licensing regulations using the draft regulations that were completed under Docket R-03-5 before it was closed. Any proposed regulatory program, including a set of proposed regulations, must also be approved by FERC.

Significant Events: Finance Rate Cases

July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2007



At the beginning of Fiscal Year 2007 there were five utility rate cases pending before the Commission.

During the course of Fiscal Year 2007 the Commission initiated seven new rate investigations and issued final orders on four rate cases.

Dockets U-05-43 and U-05-44 – Following public hearings in Fairbanks the last week of August 2006, the Commission issued its ruling determining final rates and requiring partial refunds of interim rates on a request for water and wastewater rate increase and redesign by Golden Heart Utilities and College Utilities Corporation (Orders U-05-43(15) and U-05-44(15), dated January 8, 2007). The Commission's ruling is currently under appeal (Case No. 4FA-07-01360CI) in the Superior Court for the State of Alaska, Fourth Judicial District.

Docket U-05-103 – The Commission accepted a settlement on the request for a 10.6 percent wastewater rate increase, effective January 2006, by the Municipality of Anchorage d/b/a Anchorage Water and Wastewater Utility (AWWU). (Order U-05-103(8), dated October 27, 2006). AWWU's request in this docket followed recent requests to increase wastewater rates by 8.06 percent, effective February 2004, and by 6.83 percent, effective January 2005.

Docket U-06-20 – The Commission accepted a settlement of an investigation regarding the cost allocations and rate structures of the subsidiaries of Alaska Pacific Environmental Services I, LLC (APES), which provide refuse collection service in Juneau, Ketchikan, Dutch Harbor, and Nome. (Order U-06-20(4), dated October 10, 2006). This docket was the second phase of a general investigation of the rates adopted

by APES' subsidiaries following their purchase of the business in these service areas from Waste Management of Alaska.

Docket U-06-45 – The Commission held public hearings on a request for an 8.9 percent water rate increase, effective July 2006, by the Municipality of Anchorage d/b/a Anchorage Water and Wastewater Utility (AWWU). The Commission issued its ruling requiring rate reductions and refunds on July 16, 2007 (Order U-06-45(7)). AWWU's request in this docket followed recent requests to increase water rates by 14.2 percent, effective February 2004, and by 7.17 percent, effective January 2005. The Commission issued its ruling requiring rate reductions and refunds on July 16, 2007 (Order U-06-45(7)).

Dockets U-06-76 and U-06-77 – The Commission initiated an investigation of a request for a 7.6 percent water rate increase and a 14.9 percent wastewater rate increase by Golden Heart Utilities (GHU) and College Utilities Corp (CUC). The Commission accepted a settlement of this case on July 23, 2007 (Orders U-06-76(7)/U-06-77(7)).

Dockets U-06-138 and U-06-139 – The Commission initiated an investigation of a request for a 14.5 percent water rate increase and a 13.0 percent wastewater rate increase, effective January 1, 2007, by the Municipality of Anchorage d/b/a Anchorage Water and Wastewater Utility (AWWU). AWWU's request in this docket followed its recent request to increase water rates 8.9 percent effective July 2006, and its request to increase wastewater rates by 10.6 percent effective January 2006.

Significant Events: Tariffs

July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2007

Tariffs are the written terms, conditions, rules and rates governing a utility's or pipeline carrier's conduct in providing service. They are similar to bylaws of a corporation. In approving a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, Registration, or Provisional Certification, the Commission also reviews the tariff of the applicant. All regulated utilities and pipeline carriers are required to maintain a tariff and to operate under the terms of the tariff.

Regulated utilities and pipeline carriers must notify the Commission of any proposed changes to their tariffs. Generally, the Commission must approve the tariff revisions before the revisions can take effect. The Commission considers most tariff filings at "tariff action meetings" which are conducted twice monthly. However, the Commission allows certain types of utility tariff revisions to take effect automatically upon filing, or at the end of a 30-day period. Most tariff revisions for

long distance telephone services, competitive refuse services, and steam heat may take effect automatically after 30 days. Some non-dominant, competitive local telephone service tariff filings become effective upon filing with the Commission. The review process prescribed by AS 42.05.361 – AS 42.05.441 includes a period for public comment and allows the Commission to approve, reject, or suspend a tariff filing for further investigation.

Review, analysis and disposition of tariff filings are substantial elements of the Commission's workload. During fiscal year 2007 there were 618 tariff filings submitted to the Commission. 429 tariff filings were approved after analysis. Of the remaining filings, 37 were suspended for further investigation, 10 were withdrawn, 21 were rejected, and 2 were pending as of June 30, 2007.

Significant Events: Telecommunications

July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2007

Docket U-05-84 – The Commission concluded its investigation into the proposal by Interior Telephone Company to offer exchange specific local rates and eliminate its historic postage stamp rate structure in light of potential competition by GCI. The Commission conditionally accepted a stipulation submitted by the parties resolving issues. (Order U-05-84(12), issued March 1, 2007).

Docket U-06-42 – The Commission designated Matanuska Telephone Association, Inc. (MTA) study area as a competitive local exchange market. The Commission also designated MTA as a nondominant carrier for most retail services in the Big Lake, Chugiak, Eagle River, Palmer, and Wasilla exchanges as of August 25, 2006. (Order U-06-42(2), issued August 25, 2006). On a related matter, the Commission reopened Docket U-06-119 regarding a petition by GCI to investigate MTA's status as a nondominant carrier for certain exchanges. (Order U-06-119(2), issued February 20, 2007).

Docket U-06-47 – The Commission designated the Copper Valley Telephone Cooperative, Inc. (CVTC) study area as a competitive local exchange market. The Commission also designated CVTC as a nondominant carrier subject to conditions for most retail services in its exchanges, with nondominant status becoming effective upon GCI filing a ninety-day notice of intent to commence service within the exchange. (Order U-06-47(2), dated August 25, 2006).

Docket U-06-54 – On May 17, 2006, GCI filed a notice of request for interconnection with Copper Valley Telephone Coop., Inc. (CVTC). Federal law requires that such a request for interconnection triggers an investigation by the Commission into whether CVTC's rural exemption should end. CVTC's rural exemption limits the interconnection services that it must provide to a competitor. The investigation of U-06-54 progressed until the Commission accepted GCI's notice of withdrawal

of its request, terminating the proceeding. (Order U-06-54(9), dated August 8, 2006).

Docket U-06-58 – The Commission designated the ACS of the Northland, Inc. Sitka study area exchanges as competitive local exchange markets. The Commission also designated ACS of the Northland, Inc. a nondominant carrier in both the Sitka and Glacier State study areas for most retail services. The nondominant status is effective in an exchange upon GCI filing a ninety-day notice of intent to commence service within the exchange, subject to conditions. (Order U-06-58(2), dated October 02, 2006).

Docket U-06-65 – The Commission granted the application of Alaska Telephone Co. to expand its local exchange telephone service to Lutak, Alaska, subject to conditions. (Order U-06-65(4), dated May 7, 2007).

Docket U-06-75 – The Commission granted the petition filed by ACS of Alaska, Inc., and designated it a nondominant carrier in the Ft. Wainwright and Eielson exchanges areas for most retail services. (Order U-06-75(2), dated February 22, 2007).

Docket U-06-85/ U-06-88 – The Commission directed MTA and United Utilities, Inc. (UUI) to pass through to consumers the benefit from redemption of Rural Telephone Bank patronage stock. The consumer benefit calculated by MTA and UUI is \$3.19 M and \$352,726 respectively. Consumers will obtain a credit towards their monthly Network Access Fee over a period of six years. Details on the exact amount of credit remain under review and are contested. Order U-06-85(9) /U-06-88(9), dated 4/20/07).

Docket U-06-92 – The Commission reviewed the annual certification to the Federal Communications Commission of the use by companies of 2007 federal universal service funds. The certification letter was filed September 29, 2006.

Docket U-06-109 – The Commission investigated the Interior Telephone Co. petition to change its network configuration in Cooper Landing over the objection of AT&T Alascom and GCI. The Alaska Exchange Carrier’s Association, Inc. (AECA) appealed the Commission’s decision to deny AECA intervention and obtained a stay of the proceeding. On April 10, 2007, the superior court upheld the Commission’s decision denying intervention and Docket U-06-109 was allowed to progress. Hearing on substantive issues occurred during the week of June 11, 2007.

Docket U-06-117 – Pending an investigation, the Commission directed MCI Communications Services, Inc. not to raise its prepaid calling card rates from roughly 3 cents per minute to 35 cents per minute in light of numerous consumer complaints, concerns of proper customer disclosure, and other issues. (Order U-06-117(1), dated October 20, 2006). Prior to conclusion of the investigation, MCI withdrew its rate increase. This docket was closed after allowing opportunity for public comment at a consumer input hearing. (Order U-06-117(2), dated February 21, 2007).

Docket U-06-121 – After investigation, the Commission conditionally granted a request by Summit Telephone and Telegraph Co. of Alaska, Inc. (Summit) for an extension of the exemption to meet the State Telecommunications Modernization Plan (STMP) until November 1, 2008. Twenty-one BETRS¹ customers in Cleary Summit/Chatanika and eleven BETRS customers in Coldfoot/Wiseman were affected by the extension. If Summit follows its plan submitted to the Commission, the number of customers remaining on BETRS after November 1, 2008 would be limited and would primarily be those who were expensive to serve due to their distance from Summit’s wireline network. The Commission stated it would convene a hearing if

¹ BETRS is a rural radio service used in place of wireline service, typically in areas where wireline service is especially costly given the customer’s location. BETRS based service is typically incapable of meeting STMP requirements.

Summit failed to meet its expected build out plans by November 1, 2008. Summit must file status reports quarterly and Capital Improvement Plans bi-annually. (Order U-06-121(2), dated May 1, 2007).

Dockets U-06-128/ U-06-130 – On November 13, 2006, GCI filed a notice of request for interconnection with both Interior Telephone Co., Inc. (ITC) and Mukluk Telephone Co., Inc. (Mukluk). Federal law requires that such requests for interconnection trigger investigations by the Commission into whether the ITC’s and Mukluk’s rural exemptions should end. The companies rural exemptions limit the interconnection services that they must provide to a competitor. The investigations in Dockets U-06-128 and U-06-130 progressed until January 22, 2007, when the Commission accepted stipulations from the parties to terminate each proceeding. (Order U-06-128(2), dated January 22, 2007) and Order U-06-130(2), dated January 22, 2007).

Docket U-07-19 – In response to a petition filed by GCI, the Commission designated the City of Ketchikan d/b/a Ketchikan Public Utilities’ study area as a competitive local exchange market and declared 3 AAC 53.243 applicable to most retail services in that area. (Order U-07-19(2), dated April 3, 2007)

Docket U-07-22 – In November 2006, the Commission received numerous complaints from consumers reporting they were charged a significantly higher rate than represented at the point of sale for IDT America prepaid calling cards. In light of the complaints, the Commission investigated IDT America’s rate increase, rate disclosure practices, and refund practices. IDT America was directed to issue credit to customers charged the higher rate. (Order U-07-22(1), dated February 21, 2007). This docket was closed after IDT America notified the Commission that it no longer planned to implement a long term rate increase and that the past rate increase was inadvertent. (Order U-07-22(2), dated May 30, 2007).

Docket U-07-27 – On March 28, 2007, a consumer input hearing was held to allow interested persons opportunity to comment on the Telecommunications Relay Service (TRS) provided by the South Dakota Association of the Deaf d/b/a Communication Service for the Deaf (CSD). In light of the record, the Commission continued CSD's authority to provide TRS in Alaska for a minimum of five additional years, subject to conditions. (Order U-07-27(2), dated May 1, 2007).

Docket U-07-61 – On June 12, 2007, the Commission opened an investigation to review updated financial information on public interest pay telephones in the state. (Order U-07-61(1), dated June 12, 2007).

Various Dockets – The Commission granted eligible telecommunications carrier status to various wireless carriers to receive federal universal service funds for serving their requested Alaska market. In addition, GCI was granted eligible telecommunications carrier status in the Matanuska Telephone Association, Inc. area and in the Ketchikan area. (Order U-06-41(2), dated November 14, 2006, and Order U-06-132(2), dated June 29, 2007).

Docket R-05-7 – The Commission continued its review of a telecommunications universal service affordability standard. Comments were filed in August and September 2006 on an Institute of Social Economic Research (ISER) Report on service affordability. The Commission Staff made a presentation on affordability related issues at the December 20, 2006 public meeting. A public hearing was held on February 27, 2007 to receive public input on Staff's presentation. (Order R-05-07(8), dated January 8, 2007).

Docket R-06-2 – The Commission conducted public workshops and a hearing to allow an opportunity to discuss whether the Commission should continue to allow incumbent local exchange carriers to remain in the State's access charge pool in light of competition in their markets. At the November 22, 2006,

public meeting, the Commission Staff presented potential options for access charge policy reform in competitive markets. At a special public meeting conducted February 22, 2007, the Commission determined that incumbent carriers currently in the State pool should remain in the state pool pending conclusion of Docket R-06-2.

Docket R-06-3 – The Commission is investigating procedures that should apply to telecommunications carriers seeking to be designated as Eligible Telecommunications Carriers (ETCs). A carrier must obtain an ETC designation to receive federal and state high cost support. Comments were filed in July and August 2006. (Order R-06-3(1), dated May 31, 2006).

Docket R-06-6 – The Commission opened this docket to investigate the impact on Alaska of a proposal filed before the FCC called the Missoula Inter-carrier Compensation Reform Plan (Missoula Plan). (Order R-04-06(4)/R-06-06(1), issued 9/22/06). As a result of the investigation, the Commission filed reply comments with the FCC in general support of the Missoula Plan.

Docket R-06-8 – The Commission denied a petition by Alascom, Inc. d/b/a AT&T Alascom to open a rulemaking docket to consider expanding the Alaska Universal Service Fund to include support for qualifying interexchange carriers. The Commission stated that although the petition was denied, the company raised valid concerns and that the Commission would consider in Docket R-06-7 whether to open a rulemaking docket addressing AT&T Alascom's concerns. (Order R-06-008(1), dated November 6, 2006).

Competition in Local Telecommunications

Congress enacted the Telecommunications Act of 1996 (the Act), with the goal of promoting local competition across the United States while ensuring universal service and affordable rates. In 1997, the Commission approved the first application for competitive local exchange service in Alaska, allowing GCI Communication Corp. (GCI) to enter the Anchorage market. The Juneau and Fairbanks markets became competitive soon thereafter, with GCI completing phase-in of service to the Fairbanks and Juneau areas in 2001 and 2002 respectively.

The Anchorage, Juneau and Fairbanks markets are now among the most competitive in the United States, based on competitor market share. In recognition of the level of competition in these markets, the Commission granted ACS of Anchorage, Inc., ACS of Fairbanks, Inc. and ACS of Alaska, Inc. nondominant carrier status.

The following additional carriers were granted nondominant status as of June 30, 2007:

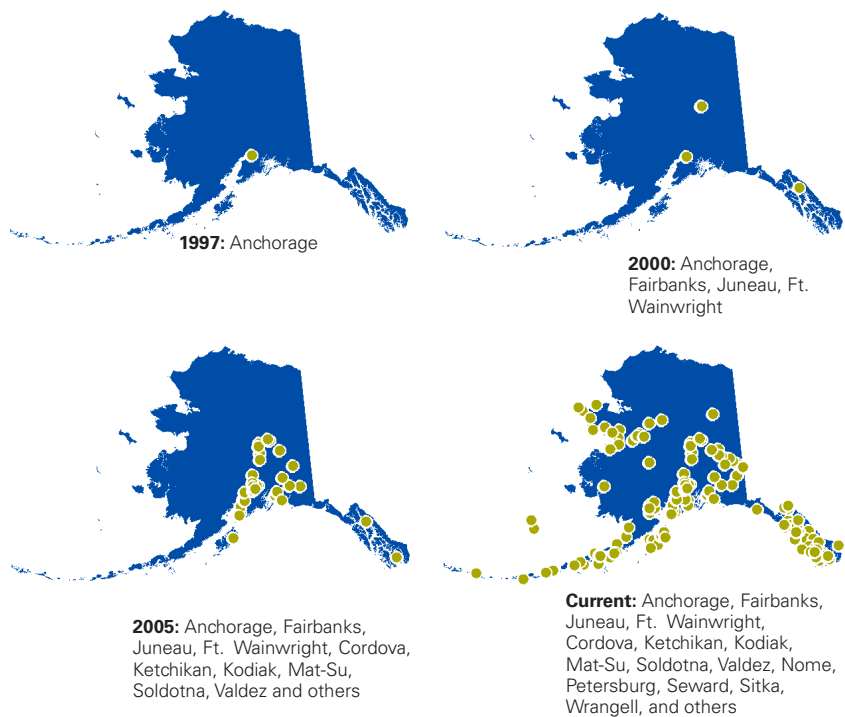
ACS of the Northland, Inc. (North Pole, Kodiak, Sitka exchanges only); Matanuska Telephone Association, Inc. (Big Lake, Chugiak, Eagle River, Palmer, and Wasilla exchanges only); and Interior Telephone Co. (Seward/ Moose Pass exchange only).

Competitive carriers serving in the Ketchikan area are also treated as if the incumbent carrier was nondominant for local exchange services.

In the above mentioned markets, carriers may implement upon filing, and without Commission approval, most local retail rate changes, subject to certain safeguards. All incumbent local exchange carriers in areas not mentioned above remain dominant carriers.

In 2005, GCI sought approval to enter several rural local markets in Alaska (Docket U-05-04). While the Commission granted GCI conditional authority to serve in roughly 90 additional exchanges, by June 30, 2007, GCI was actively serving customers in the North Pole, Ketchikan, Eagle River, and Chugiak areas.

GCI is expected to serve all 90 locations by 2011. The Commission's key decisions in Docket U-05-04 are under appeal.

Order U-96-24(1), dated February 4, 1997.

ACS became conditionally nondominant in these markets on February 22, 2006, with the exception of the Greatland study area where ACS became conditionally nondominant on February 22, 2007.

The City of Ketchikan is the incumbent local exchange carrier serving the Ketchikan area and is not economically regulated by the Commission. Telecommunications has entered a phase of dramatic technological changes, allowing more companies to offer more services to more customers and challenging traditional regulatory methods. The Commission is now managing the conditions associated with these changes, including addressing impacts to rural systems and consumers as competition appears in the telephone exchanges serving these areas.

Administrative Law

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he Administrative Law Section includes four administrative law judges (ALJs), a process coordinator, paralegals, and law office assistants. The ALJs have authority to make procedural rulings, conduct public hearings and consumer input hearings, advise the Commission on legal issues in pending dockets, analyze parties' positions, outline decision options, prepare legal memoranda, and draft orders. An ALJ is assigned to each docket shortly after it is opened and, along with an assigned Commissioner and staff member, manages the docket until it is closed.

During the past year, some hearings and meetings were conducted in locations outside of Anchorage, including Fairbanks, Kenai, Nikiski, Eagle River, and Adak. During the year, all of the judges completed two weeks of intensive training at the National Judicial College. ALJ David A. Lawrence, with the assistance of a working group of regulatory counsel who practice before the Commission and the other law judges, developed and recommended 40 improvements to Commission hearing procedures and regulations.

Consumer Protection and Information

The Consumer Protection and Information section investigates and resolves informal complaints, educates consumers, and disseminates information regarding Commission proceedings and utility rates and services. Staff helps consumers resolve disputes with their telephone, electric, natural gas, water, sewer, and refuse utilities to assure they have adequate, safe and reliable services in return for payment of just, fair and reasonable rates.

In informal investigations, the staff works with utilities and customers to resolve differences. Through these informal investigations, customers may better understand their responsibilities as a utility consumer or utilities may change their practices to better serve their customers.

- After investigation of reports of insufficient water pressure from a small water company in the Matanuska-Susitna area and another in North Pole, the companies were required to adopt and implement usage curtailment plans as an interim measure so that customers would reduce outdoor water use in the summer time. The utilities were also required to develop a plan for long-term corrective action.
- An Anchorage couple received a refund credit to their account after it was discovered that ENSTAR Natural Gas Company charged them a commercial rate rather than the appropriate lower residential rate. The couple saved even more than the refund credit through the lower prospective rates.

In addition to activities associated with informal investigations, the Consumer Protection section advises commissioners on critical consumer protection issues and events.

During Fiscal Year 2007, staff assisted approximately 6,500 consumers with their complaints and inquiries regarding utility billing and services.

Of particular interest this year, the section recommended formal investigations of the following matters.

- Significant rate increases on IDT/Kroger and MCI/Verizon prepaid calling cards were avoided when the Commission ultimately ordered the companies not to implement the rate increases.
- Winter power outages experienced by Matanuska Electric Association customers resulted in a Commission investigation in which MEA ultimately reached an agreement with ML&P that will decrease the likelihood of similar extended future outages.

- Winter power outages experienced by Adak Electric customers resulted in a consumer input hearing in Adak and an investigation of the quality of service provided by Adak Electric is pending before the Commission in Docket U-07-5.

Electric and telephone utilities continue to generate the majority of informal complaints as shown on the table below. Since 2004, there has been a 70 percent growth in consumer complaints. About 90 percent of all complaints were resolved and closed within 30 days, and approximately 260 letters were sent to customers and utility representatives. These results represent a tremendous effort by consumer protection staff.

In light of the increasing number of significant complaints, the Consumer Protection & Information staff has become more involved in educating consumers about their rights and responsibilities as a utility customer. Staff attended meetings and booth fairs such as the Annual Alaska Federation of Natives' Youth & Elders Conference.

In a joint venture with AARP Alaska, the staff participated in several workshops in 2007 for outreach in financial education and consumer protection. As part of the consumer protection workshops, staff taught classes to educate consumers on utilities, partnering with the State of Alaska Attorney General's office, Consumer Credit Counseling Services of Alaska (a non-profit organization), Anchorage/Fairbanks Neighborhood Housing Services, Alaska Housing Finance Corporation, and the State of Alaska Division of Banking and Securities in providing education and resources to more than 1,225 Alaskans.

Ninety-nine percent of the participants of the 2007 workshops rated their experience as either "good" or "very good." These workshops will continue in the fall in Barrow, Bethel, Kodiak and Dillingham.

This table displays all active certificate types on record with the Commission, including types which are not normally thought of as Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN), such as Registered entities, which are indicated by the 3000 series of Certificate numbers and are of the type Intrastate Interexchange Carrier. The table also includes Provisionally Certificated water or sewer utilities, which are indicated by the 6000 series of Certificate numbers. In addition to the division of the utilities by their type (Electric, Garbage/Refuse, etc.), the Commission has for purposes of this table divided the utilities into two broader categories: Economically Regulated and Exempt from Economic Regulation. Although there are exceptions, this division generally indicates whether a utility's request to change its rates requires Commission approval.

Power Cost Equalization

Under the Power Cost Equalization (PCE) program, the State of Alaska pays a portion of the electric bills for consumers served by utilities participating in the program. Generally, PCE reduces the effective rate per kWh for up to 500 kWh per month per customer. The PCE program is administered by the Alaska Energy Authority (AEA).

The Commission establishes the PCE rate (cents/kWh) applicable to each utility participant's billings, regardless of whether the utility is otherwise subject to economic regulation. The Commission's Fiscal Year 2007 PCE rate setting activity is summarized below.

Revised PCE rates issued for regulated utilities

Funding level change directives from AEA – 84
Review of fuel cost reports – 118

Revised PCE rates issued for non-regulated utilities

Funding level change directives from AEA – 265
Review of fuel cost reports – 114
Review of annual reports – 13

Additionally, AS 42.45.110(c)(2) provides that the Commission will, during each fiscal year, adjust the power costs for which PCE may be paid to an electric utility based on the weighted average retail residential rate in Anchorage, Fairbanks, and Juneau. In Fiscal Year 2007 the Commission issued 92 letter orders notifying each electric utility receiving PCE of the Commission's calculation of the base amount for PCE calculations as required by 3 AAC 52.610(c) and to inform participants that the base amount of 12 cents per kWh remained unchanged.

Performance Measures

A: Timely decisions. If the Commission does not issue a final decision under AS 42.05 prior to the expiration of a statutory deadline, the filing will go into effect by force of law.

Target: Final decisions of the Commission issued within existing statutory deadlines during fiscal year:

Analysis of results and challenges: The Commission met all statutory deadlines in Fiscal Year 2007. The addition of administrative law judges in FY07 provided additional personnel with legal expertise. In addition, the deadlines were identified and promptly communicated early in the docket process. Then, with the statutory deadline established, the Commission planned its calendar to

complete scheduled hearings, consider the issues, and prepare final orders no later than the established deadline.

B: The Commission's caseload consists of current and active cases.

Target: The number of resolved cases roughly equal the number of cases received each year, excepting those cases on appeal. See table.

Analysis of results and challenges: New filings with the commission resulted in 17 percent more new dockets than in the previous year. By being responsive to the number and complexity of filings and by adjusting its adjudications and docket reviews, the Commission aggressively managed its new and ongoing dockets. Thus the Commission ended the year with about the same number of dockets it had at the beginning of the year.

C: The Commission's final decisions are based on an evidential record and contain justification for the decision reached.

Target: The Commission's decisions are upheld on appeal.

Analysis of results and challenges: The Commission has had two cases remanded to it in the past 4 years, one of which was then appealed up to a higher court and has not yet been returned to the Commission.
