The Regulatory Commission of Alaska (Commission) presents its Annual Report for the fiscal year 2013. This report presents data and describes regulatory activities from July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013.

In October of 2012, hearings held concurrently with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission regarding the strategic reconfiguration of the Trans Alaskan Pipeline System ended. These proceedings took place in Anchorage, Alaska and in Washington D.C. After the year-long hearing, parties filed briefs and reply briefs with both commissions. Each Commission is currently deciding the issues before it.

Improved procedures have streamlined rate case management resulting in sooner promulgated decisions for the consumers, carriers and utilities of Alaska.

The Commission has actively partnered with commissions and other State of Alaska entities to provide a forum in which utilities, pipeline carriers and consumers can consider how best to develop affordable and workable energy solutions that will sustain and nurture all those who live and work here, visit here and invest here in Alaska.

We continue to effectively utilize the resources entrusted to us and examine developing best practices so that we can ably serve the people of the State of Alaska.

Commissioner Biographies

Five full-time Commissioners are appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Legislature for staggered six-year terms. Commissioners elect a Chair each year whose administrative duties include employing staff, assigning work, coordinating public meeting activities, and monitoring the adjudication process to ensure timely decisions and a myriad of other duties. The Chair acts as agency liaison to the legislative and executive branches of state government, and as the Commission spokesperson on policy.

T.W. Patch **Commission Chairman**

Appointed March 1, 2010 – March 1, 2016

Chair: July 1, 2011 – Present

Commissioner Patch earned a B.A. in Economics and a J.D. from Willamette University in Salem Oregon. Commissioner Patch is admitted to practice law in both Iowa and Alaska. He returned to Alaska in 1974 while in the United States Air Force and served as Deputy Staff Judge Advocate for the 21st Air Base Group at Elmendorf Air Force Base. He was also designated for special duty with the Alaskan Command.

Upon leaving military service Commissioner Patch practiced law with an emphasis on litigation. His litigation experience includes: personal injury, complex multi-party business litigation, construction disputes, and derivative corporate actions. He represented clients in both state and federal courts. Commissioner Patch developed an alternative dispute resolution practice, mediating and arbitrating matters, predominantly in western states. He remains a member of national arbitration and mediation panels. He served throughout the Pacific Northwest with the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service, the National Mediation Board, and the National Association of Securities Dealers. He served as Alaska's representative to the American Arbitration Association. He served on permanent dispute resolution and interest arbitration panels maintained by Pacific Northwest states, served Alaska and Northwest Municipalities, and served on ad hoc industry dispute resolution panels. He was designated Chair on multiple party, labor, business, construction, and complex matters as a result of his lengthy and recognized service as a senior arbitrator. He provided training to alternative dispute resolution practitioners, employers, and unions. Commissioner Patch has advised and served on boards of directors of many non-profit corporations serving Alaskans.



Commissioner Patch served as an administrative law judge for the Regulatory Commission of Alaska. Since appointment to the office of Commissioner he has been elected to three consecutive terms as Commission Chairman. He is a member of the Board of Directors of the National Regulatory Research Institute and serves on the Audit Committee for the body. He is also a member of the Board of Directors for the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners.

Paul F. Lisankie

Appointed: March 2, 2009 – March 1, 2015

Born in New York City, Commissioner Lisankie settled in Alaska in 1982 after his discharge from active duty as a Lieutenant in the U. S. Coast Guard. He holds an undergraduate degree in economics conferred with honors and departmental distinction by Rutgers University and a law degree from Duke University. He is a member of Omicron Delta Epsilon international honor society in economics.

Commissioner Lisankie was admitted to the practice of law in Alaska in 1985 and focused on administrative law. As staff counsel for the non-profit Alaska Consumer Advocacy Program he represented consumers before the former Alaska Public Utilities Commission. Commissioner Lisankie has over twenty years of state service in the Department of Law as an assistant attorney general and the Department of Labor and Workforce Development as a hearing officer, chief of adjudications, and finally director of the Division of Workers' Compensation.

Between 1987 and 1989 Commissioner Lisankie served on the board of directors of Chugach Electric Association, Inc. He has lived in Kodiak, Juneau, and Anchorage.

Appointed : March 7, 2008 – March 1, 2014

Chair: July 1, 2008– June 30, 2011

Before his appointment to the Commission, Commissioner Pickett had more than 30 years of statewide experience in Alaska's housing industry, in both the private and public sectors. For twenty-one years, Commissioner Pickett worked for Alaska Housing Finance Corporation in a number of roles including Property Disposition Manager, Planner, and Program Manager. Promotion of public-private partnerships in the housing industry, and interagency coordination with housing related infrastructure were areas of Commissioner Pickett's emphasis while working at Alaska Housing Finance Corporation.

His prior work experience also includes consulting, real estate sales and marketing, management of a materials testing laboratory for the Alaska Department of Transportation, and surveying for the U.S. Forest Service in Southeast Alaska. Commissioner Pickett has an undergraduate degree in Public Administration/Political Science from the University of Idaho, and has done graduate work in finance and economic policy through the University of London. Commissioner Pickett has been married to his wife Jane for twenty-nine years.

Commissioner Pickett currently serves on the Natural Gas Committee of the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners.

Norman Rokeberg

Appointed: February 19, 2013

Commissioner Rokeberg is a lifelong Alaskan. He graduated from Anchorage High School (1961.) He served in the US Army Signal Corps, 7th Army, Europe (1964 -1966) and returned to Alaska where since 1967 he has been a successful small businessman. In 1971 he earned a degree from Willamette University (Political Science).



Commissioner Rokeberg was for many years a successful Commercial Real Estate Broker specializing in leasing and development of major office buildings. He established the commercial properties leasing and property management departments at the state's largest real estate firm. He worked with a number of Fortune 500 companies, dozens of oil industry firms, numerous local and international businesses, and with state and federal agencies to provide his clients with solutions for their commercial real estate requirements.

In 1995 Commissioner Rokeberg was elected to the Alaska State House of Representatives where he served for six consecutive terms. During his service to Alaska in the State Legislature he was selected by his peers to serve as Chairman of the Rules, Judiciary, Labor & Commerce, and Oil & Gas Committees. He also served on the Board of Directors for the Council of State Governments (West) and the Energy Council. From 2007 to 2010, he was Chairman of various State of Alaska Advisory Working Group(s) including the Alaska Railbelt Electric Grid Authority (REGA) and the Alaska Railbelt Regional Integrated Resource Planning Group (RIPA) administered by the Alaska Energy Authority.

Jan Wilson

Appointed: April 11, 2006 – March 1, 2012

Reappointed: March , 2012 – March 1, 2018

Commissioner Wilson is an attorney, admitted to practice law in Alaska since 1975. She was a Commissioner and the last Chairman of the Alaska Pipeline Commission (APC), the agency created to administer AS 42.06, the Pipeline Act. In 1981 the APC merged into the Alaska Public Utilities Commission. Commissioner Wilson served as an administrative law judge for the Alaska Public Utilities Commission and its successor agency, the Regulatory Commission of Alaska, from the time of the merger until her appointment to the Commission in 2006.



Commissioner Wilson has extensive experience in oil and gas pipeline issues. As an Alaska Pipeline Commission commissioner and an administrative law judge she worked closely with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, which regulates interstate oil and gas pipelines. She conducted all proceedings the Alaska Pipeline Commission, Alaska Public Utilities Commission, or Regulatory Commission of Alaska held concurrently with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission from 1980 to 2006. Earlier in her career, Commissioner Wilson was City Attorney for the City of Kenai and an Assistant Attorney General in Juneau, serving in the Oil and Gas Special Litigation section.

Commissioner Wilson earned an undergraduate degree in economics from Mount Holyoke College and a law degree from the University of Denver.

How the Commission Works

The Commission is created as an independent agency of the State of Alaska by AS.42.04.010. By statute, the Commission is tasked with the duty to regulate public utilities engaged or proposing to engage in a utility business; pipelines and pipeline carriers and the duty to determine the per kilowatt-hour support for eligible electric utilities participating in the Power Cost Equalization Program (PCE), as set forth at AS 42.45.100 et seq.

The Commission is comprised of five full time Commissioners. The Commission's staff includes administrative law judges, engineers, financial analysts, telecommunications specialists, tariff analysts, consumer protection officers, paralegals, administrative personnel, and support staff. The Commission also receives legal advice from counsel assigned to the agency by the Department of Law.

What does the Commission regulate?

Most utility and pipeline services and entities¹ providing these services:

- Electric,
- Natural Gas,
- Pipelines,
- Refuse (Garbage),
- Telecommunications,
- Steam Heat,
- Water, and
- Wastewater (sewer).

¹ Some utilities are not economically regulated because: 1) their income is under a revenue threshold (e.g. electric or telephone utilities grossing less than \$50,000 annually); 2) they provide a type of service that is exempted by statute (e.g., cable television service providers); 3) or they have a statutory right to seek an exemption (e.g., some local government-owned utilities, cooperative utilities, and electric or telephone utilities grossing less than \$500,000 annually) (AS 42.05.711 and AS 42.05.712). The Commission may also exempt a class of utilities from some or all of AS 42.05 based on a finding that the exemption is in the public interest (AS 42.05.711(d)).

Utilities and Pipeline Carriers

A majority of the entities providing a utility service to ten or more customers for compensation are required to obtain a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (Certificate) before providing service. The Commission monitors over 600 active certificates. A list of certificated entities can be found on our website.²

Who does the Commission Work With? Commission Partners

In performing its duties, the Commission works with other state agencies and commissions when more than one agency or commission has responsibilities or capabilities that compliment those of this Commission.³ Some examples of these would be:

³ As a point of illustration, The Department of Environmental Conservation's Division of Water is tasked with interpreting and enforcing water quality standards, while this Commission is tasked with ascertaining the fitness of the utility and regulating the rates charged by the utility delivering that water.

How the Commission Works

How does the Commission perform its duties?

- Reviewing applications for Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity and determining that applicants are fit, willing, and able to provide service and that service is required for the public convenience and necessity,
- Reviewing tariff filings made by utilities or pipeline carriers that seek to change their rates or terms of service, and suspending tariff filings for further investigation when warranted,
- Determining that the rates a utility charges its customers are just and reasonable and that rates, services, and practices of public utilities and pipeline carriers comport with their filed tariffs and are neither discriminatory or unduly preferential,
- Calculating subsidy rates for the Power Cost Equalization program,
- Investigating complaints regarding utility service quality or management practices,
- By proposing, considering and adopting new or amended regulations,
- And, seeking consumer and utility input in informational public meeting settings.

Commission Proceedings

The Commission's quasi-judicial functions include an informal public adjudication process to address utility tariff filings, and issuing written decisions to resolve docketed matters with or without a hearing

- Tariff proceedings, with an adjudicatory docket opened if initial review results in suspension of the filing for investigation.
- Adjudicatory dockets are used to address most issues involving the regulation of public utilities and pipeline carriers, with intervention limited to those parties demonstrating a legally sufficient interest in the outcome of the proceeding.
- Rulemaking proceedings are used to consider amending Commission regulations and allow interested parties the opportunity to comment on regulation proposals.

Consumer Complaints

Consumer complaints may be informal, and addressed by the Consumer Protection & Information Section, or formal complaints adjudicated by a panel of Commissioners.

How the Commission Works

Public Meetings

The Commission performs a quasi-legislative function by holding informational public meetings and adopting regulations considered in Rulemaking Dockets through a public process that complies with the Administrative Procedure Act. Public Meetings provide a forum to consider, discuss, inform about, and investigate matters that might not otherwise fall into a particular adjudicatory docket proceeding. They also provide the opportunity for consumers and other interested parties to address the Commission, bring forward concerns and contribute ideas for consideration that may not otherwise find a forum. The Commission's web page provides information regarding the public meeting schedule.⁴ In FY2013 the Commission held eighteen public meetings which included presentations by agencies, consumers and utilities. Some of the presented topics covered:

- Natural Gas Fuel Supply Agreement Updates;
- Responsibilities and Oversight by the United States of Oil and Natural Gas Pipelines in the State of Alaska;
- The condition of and the need for improvement of Railbelt Electric Grid;
- Natural Gas Distribution in Fairbanks;
- CSSSHB 4, In-State Gasline Development Corporation; and
- Overview of Cook Inlet Natural Gas Storage Alaska, LLC First Year Operations.



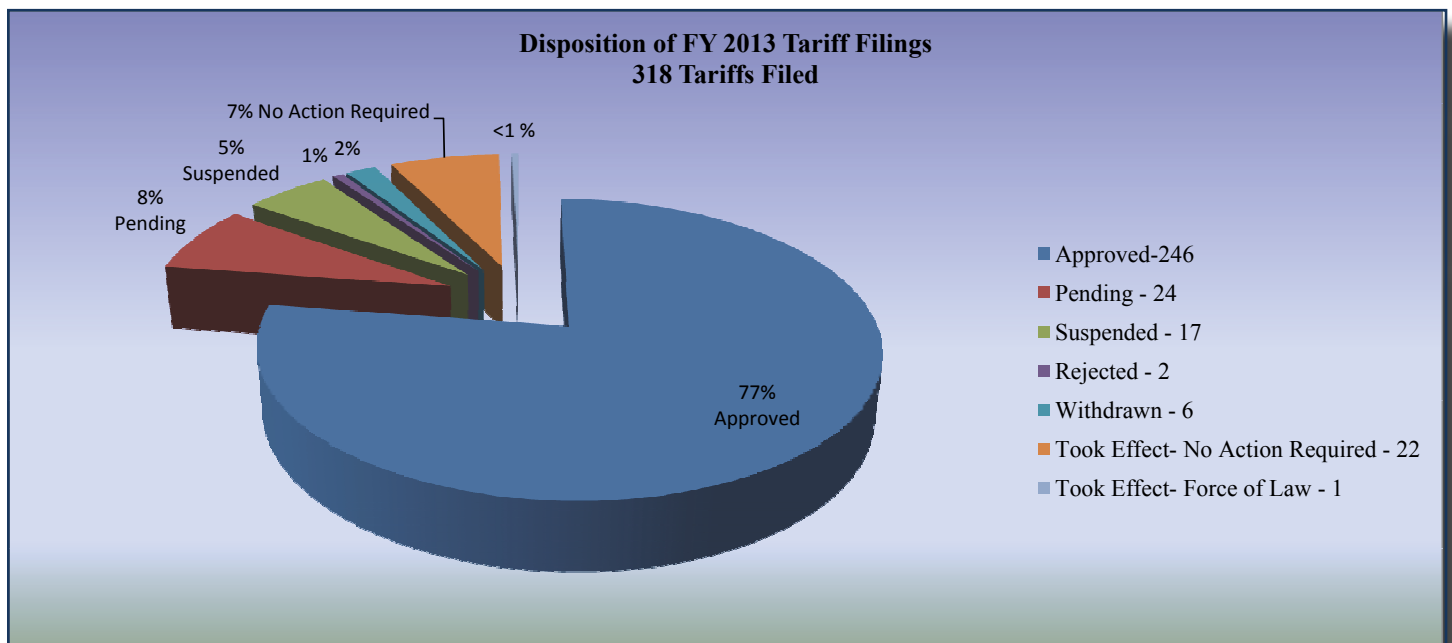
In addition to Public Meetings, in May of 2013, the Commission also hosted a cybersecurity workshop which provided utility and gas and oil pipeline carriers a forum to learn about and engage in discussion about protecting infrastructure in Alaska. Tariff Information

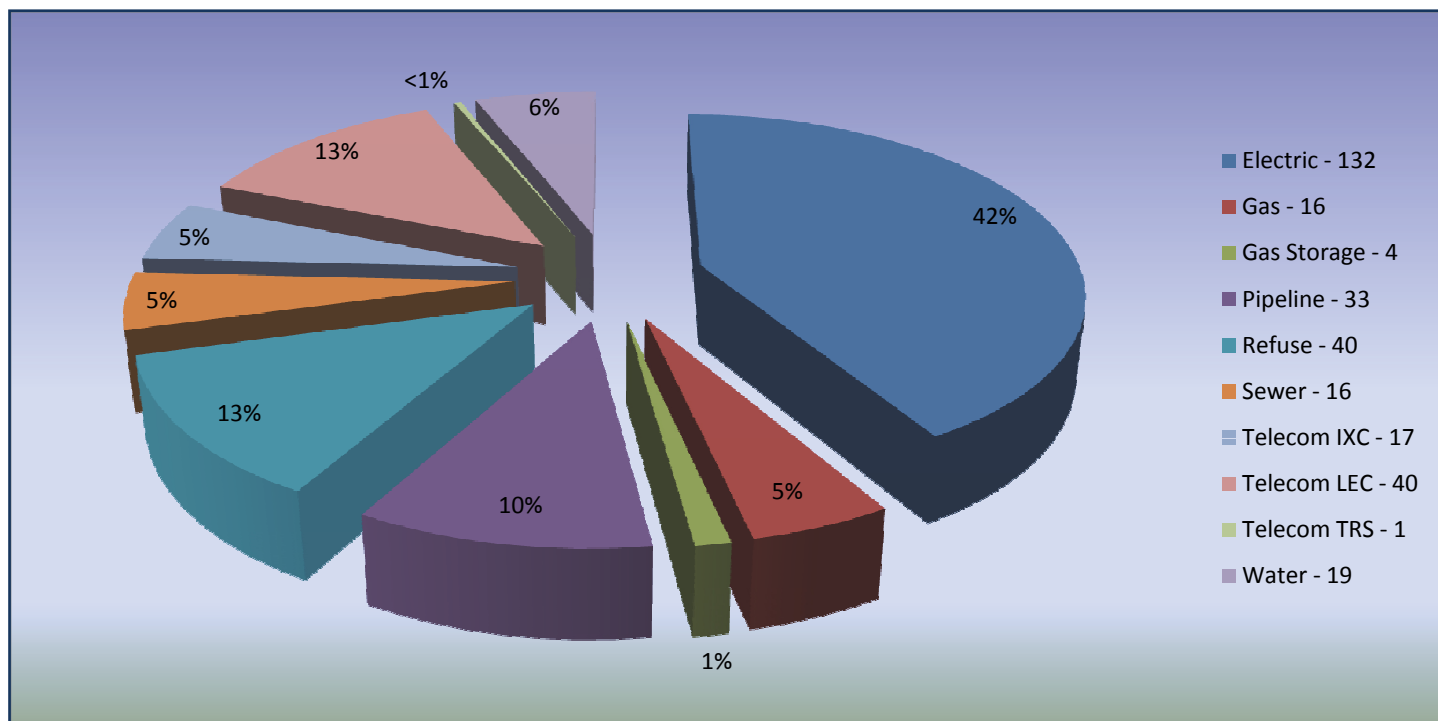
A tariff is an open contract between a utility or a pipeline carrier and its customer, usually the general public. The tariff outlines and sets forth the terms, conditions, rules and rates governing a utility or pipeline carrier's conduct in providing the utility service, as well as a consumer's responsibilities in procuring the utility service. In Alaska, for every service that a utility or pipeline carrier offers that is regulated by the Commission, the effective tariff must set forth the rates, charges, terms, and conditions applicable to that service. Initial tariffs are submitted with certificate applications, registrations filed by eligible interexchange carriers, or provisional certification applications filed by eligible water and wastewater utilities. The Commission reviews all initial tariffs and subsequent tariff revisions. After initial approval, regulated utilities and pipeline carriers must notify the Commission of any proposed changes to their tariffs.

The tariff review process prescribed by AS 42.05.361 through AS 42.05.441, includes a public comment period and allows the Commission to approve, reject or suspend a tariff filing. In most cases, the Commission must approve tariff revisions before the revisions can take effect. However, certain types of revisions can take effect automatically or at the end of a 30-day period. Review, analysis and disposition of tariff filings are substantial elements of the Commission's workload. During FY 2013, 318 tariff filings were submitted and acted on by the Commission.

Notable Tariffs Events

TA3-720, TA7-717-719, TA7-726, TA8-724, TA10-721-723, TA11-725, TA12-727-728 Doyon Utilities, LLC (Doyon) recently acquired from the U.S. Department of Defense (DOD) the heating, water, wastewater, and electric utilities for Fort Wainwright, Fort Richardson, and Fort Greely military installations. Prior to acquisition the infrastructure at these installations was dilapidated, and since acquisition Doyon has been making significant capital improvements to modernize and improve the infrastructure. On May 22, 2012, Doyon filed its first set of revenue requirement studies for each of its twelve utilities since acquiring these utilities. The revenue requirement studies requested rate increases ranging from 6.39% to 99.87%, depending on the installation and type of utility. The Commission granted varying interim and refundable rates effective August 21, 2012. On January 18, 2013, the Commission

ordered the dockets stayed after Doyon and the DOD filed a joint motion for a stay of the proceedings. The stay was granted in order to allow Doyon and the DOD time to engage in settlement discussions. In a status report filed September 3, 2013 the parties stated that the settlement meetings have been progressive and constructive.

TA10-733 - Chugach Electric Association, Inc., proposed to reduce its Injection 1 Withdrawal Fuel Use Percentage from 1.5% to 0.5% for the period May 1, 2013 to April 30, 2014. CINGSA requested the proposed changes be effective May 1, 2013. The Commission suspended TA 10-733 for further investigation to allow additional time for review. See Order U-13-1 07(1).

Tariff Information

TA144-122, TA143-126 - Anchorage Water Utility (AWU) and Anchorage Sewer Utility (ASU), collectively Anchorage Water and Wastewater Utility (AWWU), filed revenue requirement studies designated as TA144-122 and TA143-126, requesting an across-the-board rate increase of 6 percent for AWU and 4.5 percent for ASU. In December 2012 the Commission issued Letter Order L1200756, approving the tariff sheets as proposed.

TA226-4 - ENSTAR Natural Gas Company (ENSTAR) proposed a modification to its Homer Extension Surcharge. The Homer extension was not constructed at the time of filing, but its costs and scope were known and a grant was provided to pay by the State of Alaska for a significant portion of the anticipated costs. ENSTAR's modification reflected the receipt of the state grant and a reduction in the area that would be subject

to the surcharge, as Anchor Point and Nikolaevsk were already being served by ENSTAR. The modification did not affect the amount of the surcharge, currently set at \$1.00 per Mcf. Under the revised surcharge, Homer and Kachemak City are the only communities subject to the surcharge and only until the net expense (actual cost minus the grant) is recovered. The Commission approved the surcharge modification in August, 2012.

TA365-8 - Chugach Electric Association proposed to substantially decrease its Fuel and Purchased Power Cost Adjustment (COPA) surcharge and Non-Firm Purchased Power Rate for qualified cogeneration and small power production facilities (NFPPR) to reflect a decrease in fuel expenses resulting from the anticipated operation of the Southcentral Power Plant.

Power Cost Equalization

The Power Cost Equalization (PCE) program seeks to equalize power costs on a per kilowatt-hour (kWh) basis statewide by approximating higher rural electric costs closer to the average cost per kilowatt hour paid by customers in Anchorage, Fairbanks, and Juneau. To accomplish this goal, the PCE program provides economic assistance payments from the Power Cost Equalization Fund, which was established in 1993.⁵

The Alaska Energy Authority (AEA) administers the both the PCE Fund and Program based on PCE level determinations made by this Commission. Participating electric utilities are required to reduce each eligible customer's bill by the amount that is offset by the PCE funding. In addition to authorizing payment from the PCE Fund to participating electric utilities, based upon levels determined by the RCA, the AEA determines the eligibility of community facilities and individual residential customers.

On an annual basis,⁶ the Commission establishes a base rate for the subsequent year.⁷ Recent PCE base rates set by the Commission for are set forth in the table below:

After the base rate has been determined, the Commission reviews the cost of power filings that each participating utility must file⁹ and then calculates PCE levels for each utility based upon these cost of power filings.¹⁰ The Commission then notifies each utility of the appropriate PCE level so that in turn, each utility can adjust billings to their customers.

In order for the Commission to determine just and reasonable PCE levels, participating utilities are obligated to file particular reports on an annual and monthly basis.¹¹ In FY2013, the Commission recalculated PCE levels, prepared tariff sheets, and reviewed 51 fuel cost reports for the sixteen economically regulated electric utilities eligible to receive PCE support set forth below:

Power Cost Equalization

Non Economically Regulated

In order for the Commission to determine just and reasonable PCE levels, participating utilities are obligated to file particular reports on an annual and monthly basis.¹² In FY 2013, the Commission reviewed 192 Non-Regulated PCE Fuel and Purchased Power Cost Reports and 23 Annual Reports in determining PCE levels for the 71 non-economically regulated electric utilities eligible to receive PCE support set forth below:

Docket Information

Information that the Commission collects, analyses, and uses as the basis for a decision in a formal proceeding involving matters of fact, law or policy is maintained in a docket. A docket is the listing of and records repository maintained for a formal proceeding. Thus it is in a docketed proceeding that the Commission reviews utility and/or pipeline carrier applications, i.e., an application for a certificate of public convenience and necessity; complaints that are not resolved informally; tariff filings that are suspended within the statutory notice period; and changes to existing or newly proposed regulations. Dockets are designated as “U,” for utility matters; “P,” for pipeline matters; and “R,” for rulemaking proceedings. Occasionally a docket is otherwise employed, for example an “I,” docket is for information gathering. Dockets are typically administered by a panel of three commissioners. Some proceedings involve all five commissioners.

When a docket is opened, an administrative law judge and advisory section staff member are assigned to work closely with commission panels. Rate cases, in particular, raise issues of law, economics, accounting, finance, and engineering that can establish legal precedent for future cases. In cases that go to hearing, parties present sworn testimony and documentary evidence on the matters at issue. Witnesses may be cross-examined and their opinions and the facts and basis for their opinions are carefully tested.

Formal proceedings afford all participants due process and decisions are based on evidence of record. Participants may include the subject public utility or pipeline carrier, the Attorney General’s Regulatory Affairs and Public Advocacy Section, and interested entities that have been permitted to intervene in a proceeding. In a regulations docket, any person is allowed to submit comments during the public comment period. One of the Commission’s most important duties is to reach decisions that consider competing interests of concerned parties and promote the public interest. Decisions may be appealed to state or federal court, and must be consistent with applicable law and supported by evidence in the record.



On January 31, 2013, Chugach Electric Co., accepted “care, custody and control” of the newly Southcentral Power Plant located in Anchorage.

Docketed Case Highlights

Electric

U-12-009/U-13-001-Chugach Electric Association, Inc. (Chugach) sought approval of inception depreciation rates for its new Southcentral Power Plant (SPP). The SPP is a 183 megawatt, gas-fired three-by-one combined cycle power plant, jointly owned by Chugach (70%) and the Municipality of Anchorage d/b/a Municipal Light & Power (ML&P) (30%). The depreciation study suggests an initial projected life of

35 years for the plant. After the Commission approved Chugach's depreciation study within Docket U-12-009, ML&P filed a petition to adopt the depreciation rates approved by the Commission for their portion of SPP. ML&P's petition was also approved. Both Chugach and ML&P are seeking to incorporate the new depreciation rates into their overall rate scheme in ongoing revenue requirement studies.

Docket U-12-075 - TDX North Slope Generating, Inc. (TNSG) filed a revenue requirement study designated as TA154-227, whereby TNSG requested a permanent across-the-board rate increase of 22.67 percent, and an interim and refundable across-the-board rate increase of 21 percent. The Commission granted a 21 percent across-the-board interim and refundable rate increase. The Attorney General (AG) participated in the proceeding. TNSG and the AG jointly filed a stipulation resolving all disputed issues. The Commission issued Order U-12-75(10), which accepted the stipulation in April 2013, which reflected a 19.66 percent across-the-board permanent rate increase.

Pipeline

TAPS; P-08-009, et al. ~The final hearing phase of a very lengthy and complex proceeding that consolidates twelve (12) Commission dockets, forty (40) Federal Energy Regulatory Commission dockets, involving ten parties, and is jointly presided over by the Commission and FERC, concluded October 2, 2012. The parties were ordered to file a chronology of the over 2000 exhibits presented during the course of the proceeding, as well as briefs summarizing their legal arguments and the facts upon which those arguments are supported. The parties were then provided the opportunity to file reply briefs. The parties filed their reply briefs at the end of January 2013. On June 25, 2013, the Chief Administrative Law Judge for FERC extended the deadline for a decision to October 31, 2013.* The record upon which this case will be decided includes:

- 48 hearing days,
- > 12,000 transcript pages,
- > 2000 exhibits, and
- > 1800 pages of briefing.

P-12-007, P-12-008, P-12-009, P-12-010

Marathon Oil Company and Hilcorp Alaska, LLC (Hilcorp Alaska) filed joint applications to transfer Marathon Oil Company's ownership shares in the Cook Inlet Gas Gathering System (CPCN No. 711), Kenai Kachemak Pipeline, LLC (CPCN No. 668), Beluga Pipe Line Company (CPCN No. 448), and Kenai Nikiski Pipeline, LLC (CPCN No. 689), to Hilcorp Alaska. All four pipelines transport natural gas in the Cook Inlet Basin. The Commission approved the transfers, effective the date of closing of the transaction or upon the date the Alaska Department of Natural Resources approves the right-of-way leases for each of the four pipelines, whichever occurs later. The transfer was effective January 31, 2013.

Telecom

R-12-005 (Long Distance Statewide Service Requirements) – This proceeding was opened to address repeal or modification of the long distance carrier statewide service requirements. The long distance market in Alaska has changed significantly since the long distance statewide service regulations were initially adopted. A number of long distance carriers agreed that certain statewide service requirements imposed unnecessary costs on providers while providing little to no benefit to customers and requested that these requirements be repealed or modified. The Commission adopted regulations repealing 3 AAC 52.370(e) and amending 3 AAC 52.390(l) and 3 AAC 53.295(b). The newly adopted regulations require long distance carriers to provide service only where they have facilities, with the exception of AT&T Alaska. The regulations went into effect on October 6, 2013.

U-11-126 (Local Exchange Residential Directories) – This proceeding was opened to address compliance with the requirements that local exchange carriers automatically deliver a printed directory to each of their subscribers. The Administrative Law Judge in the proceeding issued a proposed decision accepting a stipulation submitted by the parties in this docket. In FY13, the Commission modified the Administrative Law Judge’s proposed decision, waived certain provisions in 3 AAC 52.250(a), amended the regulatory definition of “directory” under 3 AAC 52.340(23) and established interim standards for the publication of residential directories, which allow local exchange carriers to furnish a paperbound directory to only those subscribers that request one (Subscribers must opt-in), within the ACS of Anchorage, ACS of Alaska, ACS of Fairbanks, ACS of the Northland and Matanuska Telephone Association study areas.

U-12-088 (Selection of a Telecommunications Rely Service Provider for Alaska) – In June 2012, the Commission issued an order requesting applications from carriers that seek to provide Telecommunications Rely Service in Alaska. The Commission received applications from Hamilton Telephone Company d/b/a Hamilton Telecommunications and Sprint

Communications Company L.P (Sprint). A consumer input hearing was held. The Commission evaluated the applications on a number of criteria some of which included: price for basic TRS, quality of service, proposed budget for outreach and educational expenditures and knowledge of Alaska and the Alaska TRS user community. In FY13, the Commission selected Sprint to serve as the TRS provider in Alaska, through July 1, 2018

Water/Wastewater

U-11-077, U-11-078- Golden Heart Utilities, Inc. and College Utilities Corporation (GHU/CUC) filed revenue requirement studies designated as TA51-118 and TA97-97 for water service, as well as revenue requirement studies designated as TA46-290 and TA103-307 for wastewater service. GHU/CUC sought a combined rate increase of 10.265% for water service and a combined increase of 14.293% for wastewater service. JL Properties, Inc and IMIK Alaska, LLC d/b/a Water Wagon were designated as parties and the Attorney General elected to participate in the proceedings. Interim rate relief was granted and a procedural schedule was established. The parties entered into settlement discussions and a stipulation was ultimately reached. The parties agreed to a combined increase of 8.126% for water service and a combined increase of 11.63% for wastewater service. The Commission accepted the stipulation by issuing Order U-11-77(14)/U-11-78(14) in May 2012.

Administrative

R- 11-001 (Discovery) – The Commission adopted regulations governing discovery in cases handled under AS 42.05 and 42.06 in May 2013 with an effective date of August 18, 2013. The regulations are designed to refine and streamline the discovery process in contested cases in order to accelerate the conduct of hearings and issuance of final orders.

Statutory Extensions

The Commission is tasked with rendering a final determination regarding docketed utility and regulations matters pursuant to timelines set forth at AS 42.05.175. Timelines of dockets may be extended for various reasons. For example, a party may request the Commission to extend a timeline to allow for it to prepare its case or accommodate witness schedules, and sometimes wherein materials requested by the Commission are provided in an untimely fashion there are times wherein more time is needed so that adequate consideration may be afforded to an issue. In FY2013 the Commission issued twenty-one (21) orders that extended timelines of docketed matters. The table below provides additional details.

Consumer Protection and Information Section

The Consumer Protection & Information Section is an important section linking the Commission and the general public. Among its many duties the Consumer Protection & Information Section handles complaints from citizens and ratepayers about utility services and billings. Staff members work with consumers and utilities to informally and mutually resolve disputes when possible. If, however, a customer is not satisfied with the result, the section advises how a petition for alternative dispute resolution or a formal complaint may be filed with the Commission. The Consumer Protection & Information Section also conducts public outreach and media relations services.

Consumer Outreach and Education

Consumer Protection & Information continued its collaboration with AARP Alaska to educate ratepayers about utility rates and services. Consumer Protection & Information staff participated with AARP Alaska in consumer protection and financial education at the Alaska State Fair and at AARP Wise Consumer Workshops in Anchorage, Ketchikan, and Sitka. Consumer Protection & Information staff also represented the Commission energy fairs sponsored by Homer Electric Association in Homer and Kenai, and at the Elders and Youth Conference.

In both FY 2012 and 2013, the Consumer Information and Protection Section worked on matters that had been filed in the previous fiscal year.

Consumer Protection and Information Section

During FY2013, Consumer Protection & Information handled over 200 consumer-related complaints, including:

Docket C-12-190 Customer complained a local electric company was back-billing her for monies owed, even though she was on a level-pay program. CP researched the issue and determined the customer had not been paying the full amount of the level-pay for several months. Customer was advised to contact the utility to arrange a payment plan.

C-12-217 Customer complained that a water utility overcharged her and she and other customers of the utility were due a refund in May 2012 as the result of an RCA decision. CP investigated the complaint and concluded the customer's account had been in delinquent status and sent to collections. The refund to this customer was used to offset a portion of the amount in collections.

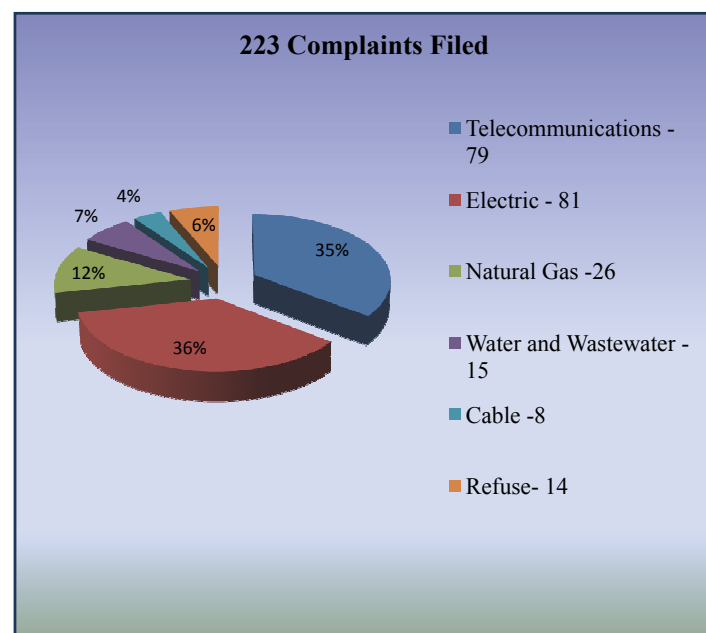
Docket C-12-262 Customer complained that her business phone was not ringing on her end of the connection (when someone would call her). The customer lives in a remote area of Alaska. The utility investigated the complaint and conducted numerous tests after which the issue was corrected

Docket C-12-282 Customer complained when he moved from one house in the same village to another, the phone company did not establish service at his new location. He also complained that service was terminated at his old location even though his son lives there. The utility has been to the village several times and restored service to old location. The new location requires a line extension agreement and other paperwork. The utility has placed the order on hold pending a response from the customer.

Docket C-13-012 Customer complained that a pre-paid calling card company increased its long distance charges from 28.4 cents to 57 cents per minute without any prior notice to its customers. CP performed a fact-finding investigation on this non-jurisdictional issue. To resolve the complaint, the company applied a \$20 credit to the card.

Docket C-13-018 Customer complained that a local electrical utility withheld a transfer of service application and the utility was charging him for damages he caused in 2003 and 2006 without proving him documentation. CP investigated the complaint and instructed the utility to provide service to the customer and to issue him a refund of \$1,804.05.

Docket C-13-062 Customer complained an electric company was billing in excess of \$18,000 due to the power not being turned off at the end of the customer's seasonal operations. The utility recalculated the customer's bill under the small commercial rate and adjusted \$15,800 off the customer's account balance.



Commission Finances

The table below summarizes the Commission's expenditures for the past five fiscal years. The funding source for almost all of these expenditures was the regulatory cost charges paid by regulated entities.

Regulated public utilities and pipeline carriers operating in Alaska are required by law to pay an annual Regulatory Cost Charge (RCC). In turn, utilities pass the RCCs on to consumers as part of their rates and are set forth in utility tariffs. RCC program receipts have been our principal revenue source since FY 1993. Regulations establishing procedures for calculating and setting the RCC rates for regulated utilities and pipeline carriers are set forth at 3 AAC 47.010–3 AAC 47.999. We establish RCC rates annually by commission order using formulas in 3 AAC 47.040.¹³ After this agency's annual budget is determined by the legislature, we notify the public and each regulated utility and pipeline carrier of the RCC rate to be imposed.

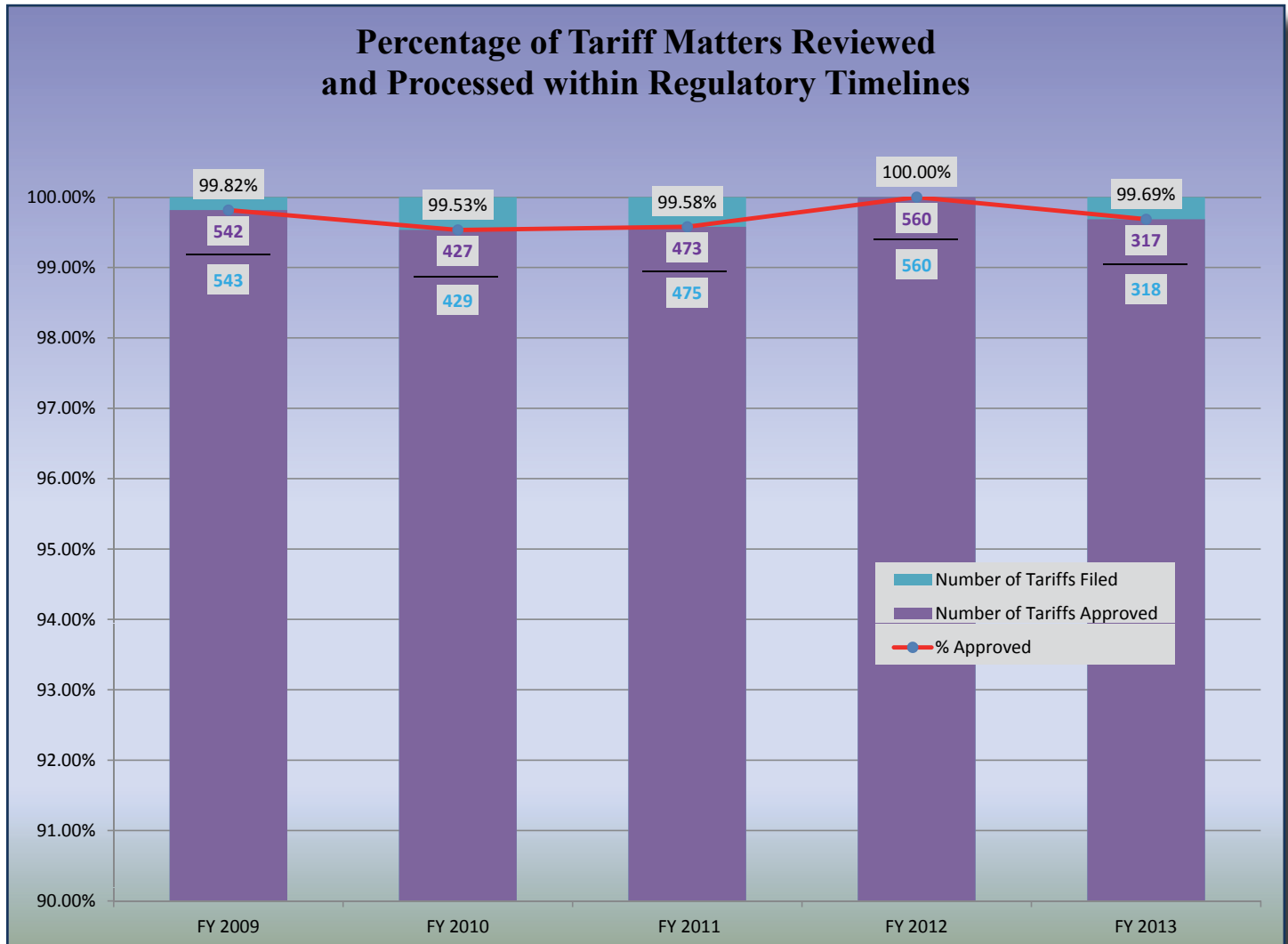
Commission Measures

Mission

The Commission assures that safe, efficient, and reliable utility and pipeline services are provided to the public at just, fair, and reasonable rates thereby promoting consumer interests and promoting economic development.

Results

In assuring that utility and pipeline services are provided to consumers, in Alaska at just and reasonable rates, the Commission reviewed and processed 99.69 % of filed tariffs within statutory timelines.

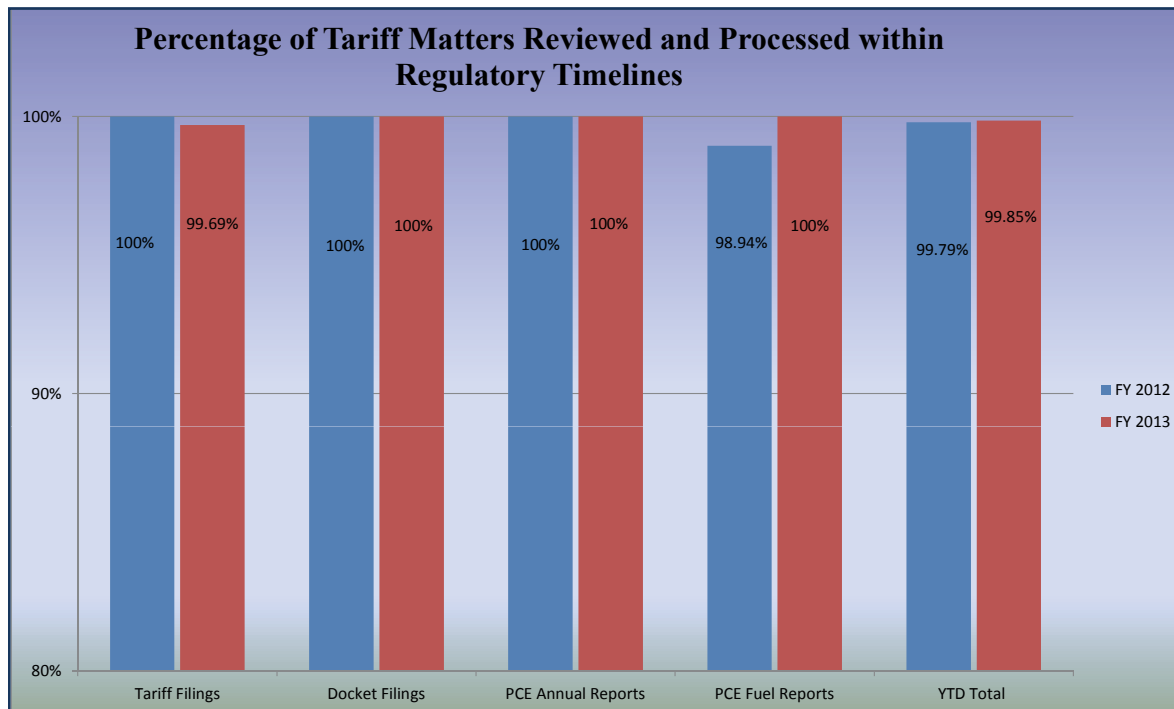


A tariff controls how a utility or pipeline conducts, provides or sells its services. When a utility or pipeline makes a tariff filing, the Commission must complete a review of the tariff filing and either approve or suspend the filing into a docket or the requested change in rates become effective by force of law. In FY2013, one tariff filing went into effect without RCA action. RCA staff reviewed the tariff filing and recommended approval of the utility request. However, the filing and accompanying approval recommendation was inadvertently not formally acted on by commissioners. The filing, therefore, took effect by force of law.

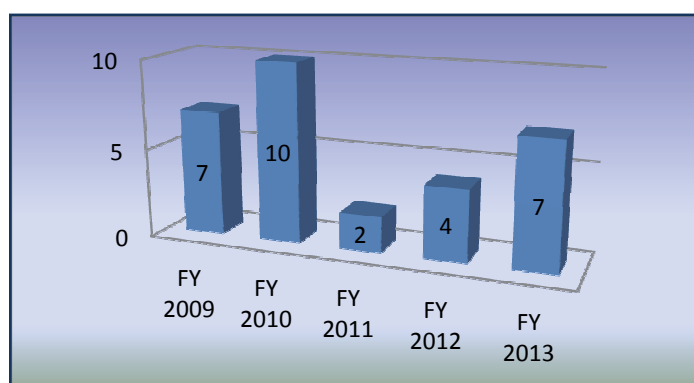

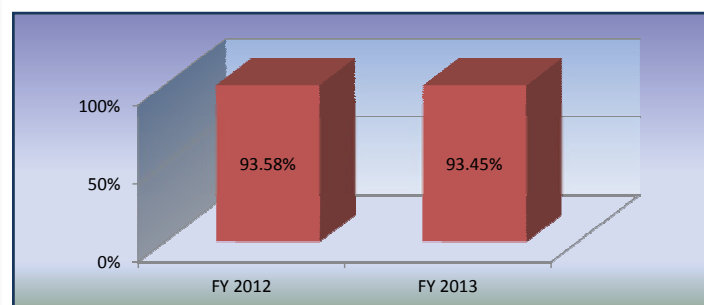


Consumer Outreach Events



In FY2013, the RCA continued its collaboration with AARP Alaska to educate ratepayers about utility rates and services, participating in consumer protection and financial education at the Alaska State Fair, and at AARP Wise Consumer Workshops in Wasilla, Sitka, and Ketchikan. Consumer Protection and Information staff represented the Commission at an information booth at the Elders and Youth Conference and provided consumer information and outreach in Kenai and Homer at events sponsored by a local electric company.

Resolve disputes between consumers and regulated utilities within established timelines.



In FY2013, 214 of 229 dispositions were completed within established timelines. Complaints took longer to resolve in situations when the service location slowed fact-finding or repairs, when multiple service providers were involved, when complexity of issues required additional review, and when service providers required additional time to respond.
