The Regulatory Commission of Alaska is pleased to present its FY 2014 Annual Report. A high priority for the Commission in FY2014 was focusing its limited resources to encourage forward progress in the 49 utility rate case proceedings and that focus will continue to be a priority in FY2015. Approximately \$1.2 billion dollars in electric generation has been constructed or is currently under construction in the Railbelt. These significant additions to utility rate bases will drive new depreciation studies and rate cases through 2018, placing great demands on the Commission. The Commission also supported the Governor's Interior Energy Project by considering and ruling on applications from Fairbanks Natural Gas and Interior Alaska Natural Gas Utility for an expanded service area and a new service area, respectively, in the Fairbanks North Star Borough, in shortened time and seeking substantial community input. The Commission also addressed issues of aging water and wastewater infrastructure, by adopting a plant replacement surcharge mechanism enabling qualifying utility companies to recover plant replacement costs in a timely fashion and established safeguards to assure timely replacements, minimize risk of failures, and protect against rate shock. The Commission continues to advocate for continued federal support to ensure that investment in telecommunication and broadband networks are capable of providing the necessary highspeed telecommunication and broadband services that our citizens deserve and are more readily available in the lower 48. FY2014 saw the sunset date of this Commission extended out to June 30, 2022, and we expect to continue to effectively utilize the resources entrusted to us to continue to serve the people of the State of Alaska.

COMMISSIONER BIOGRAPHIES

Five full-time Commissioners are appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Legislature for staggered six-year terms. Commissioners elect a Chair each year whose administrative duties include employing staff, assigning work, coordinating public meeting activities, and monitoring the adjudication process to ensure timely decisions and a myriad of other duties. The Chair acts as agency liaison to the legislative and executive branches of state government, and as the Commission spokesperson on policy.



Robert M. Pickett Chairman

Appointed: March 2008 - March 2020

Reappointed: 2014

Chair: July 2008 -June 2011

June 2014 - present

Before his appointment to the Commission, Commissioner Pickett had more than 30 years of statewide experience in Alaska's housing industry, in both the private and public sectors. For twenty-one years, Commissioner Pickett worked for Alaska Housing Finance Corporation in a number of roles including Property Disposition Manager, Planner, and Program Manager. Promotion of public-private partnerships in the housing industry, and interagency coordination with housing related infrastructure were areas of Commissioner Pickett's emphasis while working at Alaska Housing Finance Corporation.

His prior work experience also includes consulting, real estate sales and marketing, management of a materials testing laboratory for the Alaska Department of Transportation, and surveying for the U.S. Forest Service in Southeast Alaska. Commissioner Pickett has an undergraduate degree in Public Administration/ Political Science from the University of Idaho, and has done graduate work in finance and economic policy through the University of London. Commissioner Pickett has been married to his wife Jane for thirty years.



Paul F. Lisankie

Appointed: March 2009 – March 2015

Born in New York City, Commissioner Lisankie settled in Alaska in 1982 after his discharge from active duty as a Lieutenant in the U. S. Coast Guard. He holds an undergraduate degree in economics conferred with honors and departmental distinction by Rutgers University and a law degree from Duke University. He is a member of Omicron Delta Epsilon international honor society in economics.

Commissioner Lisankie was admitted to the practice of law in Alaska in 1985 and focused on administrative law. As staff counsel for the non-profit Alaska Consumer Advocacy Program he represented consumers before the former Alaska Public Utilities Commission. Commissioner Lisankie has over twenty years of state service in the Department of Law as an assistant attorney general and the Department of Labor and Workforce Development as a hearing officer, chief of adjudications, and finally director of the Division of Workers' Compensation.

Between 1987 and 1989 Commissioner Lisankie served on the board of directors of Chugach Electric Association, Inc. He has lived in Kodiak, Juneau, and Anchorage.



T.W. Patch

Appointed: March 2010 – March 2016

Chair: July 2011 - June 2014

Commissioner Patch earned a B.A. in Economics and a J.D. from Willamette University. While in the United States Air Force he served as Deputy Staff Judge Advocate for the 21st Air Base Group at Elmendorf Air Force Base.

Upon leaving military service, Commissioner Patch practiced law with an emphasis on complex multi-party business litigation, construction disputes, and derivative corporate actions. He also developed an alternative dispute resolution practice, mediating and arbitrating matters in the Western States and Pacific Rim.. He remains a member of national arbitration and mediation panels, and served as Alaska's representative to the American Arbitration Association. Commissioner Patch has advised and served on boards of directors for many non-profit corporations serving Alaskans.

Commissioner Patch is the Vice Chairman of the Board of Directors of the National Regulatory Research Institute and a member of its Audit Committee. He is also a member of the Board of Directors for the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners.

Appointed: February 2013 – March 2019

Commissioner Rokeberg is a lifelong Alaskan. He graduated from Anchorage High School, served in the U.S. Army and since 1967 has been a small business owner. In 1971 he earned a degree from Willamette University (Political Science). Commissioner Rokeberg was a successful commercial real estate broker specializing in leasing and the development of major office buildings. He worked with a number of Fortune 500 companies, dozens of oil industry firms, numerous local and international businesses, and with state and federal agencies.

In 1995 Commissioner Rokeberg was elected to the Alaska State House of Representatives where he served for six consecutive terms. During his service to Alaska in the State Legislature he was selected by his peers to serve as Chairman of the Rules, Judiciary, Labor & Commerce, and Oil and Gas Committees. He also served on the Board of Directors for the Council of State Governments (West) and the Energy Council. From 2007 to 2010, he was the Chairman of various State of Alaska advisory working group(s) including the Alaska Railbelt Electric Grid Authority (REGA) and the Alaska Railbelt Regional Integrated Resource Planning Group (RIPA).



Norman Rokeberg

Appointed: April 2006 – March 2018

Reappointed 2012

Commissioner Wilson is an attorney, admitted to practice law in Alaska since 1975. She was a Commissioner and the last Chairman of the Alaska Pipeline Commission (APC).

Commissioner Wilson has extensive experience in oil and gas pipeline issues. As an Alaska Pipeline Commission commissioner and an administrative law judge she worked closely with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, which regulates interstate oil and gas pipelines. She conducted all proceedings the Alaska Pipeline Commission, Alaska Public Utilities Commission, or Regulatory Commission of Alaska held concurrently with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission from 1980 to 2006. Earlier in her career, Commissioner Wilson was City Attorney for the City of Kenai and an Assistant Attorney General in Juneau, serving in the Oil and Gas Special Litigation section.



Jan Wilson

Commissioner Wilson earned an undergraduate degree in economics from Mount Holyoke College and a law degree from the University of Denver.

ABOUT THE COMMISSION

The Regulatory Commission of Alaska was created in 1999, as an independent agency of the State of Alaska. The Commission regulates public utilities, pipeline carriers and determines the per kilowatt-hour support for eligible electric utilities participating in the Power Cost Equalization Program (PCE). In FY 2014, the legislature extended the sunset date of the RCA to June 30, 2022.

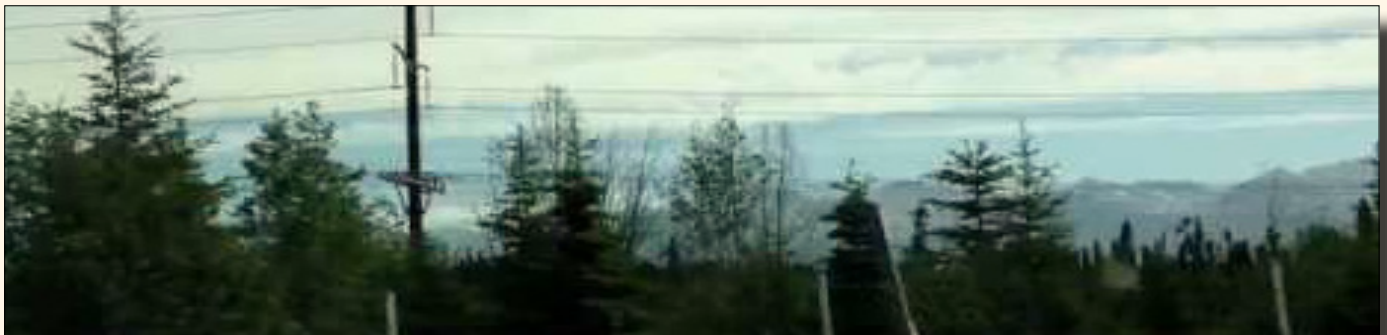
97% of the Commission's FY2014 budget is directly funded by Regulatory Cost Charges (RCCs). After the Commission's annual budget is set by the legislature, the Commission calculates RCCs in an open process using formulas set forth at 3 AAC 47.010- 3 AAC 47.999 and then notifies the public, utilities and pipeline carriers of the RCC rate. RCC program receipts have been the Commission's principal revenue source since FY 1993.

RCCs are paid by rate payers who directly benefit from the services provided by the Commission. Economically regulated utilities and pipeline carriers are required to remit RCC's to the Alaska Department of Revenue as set forth at AS 42.05.254 and 3 ACC 47 47.010- 3 AAC 47.999.

What the Commission does:

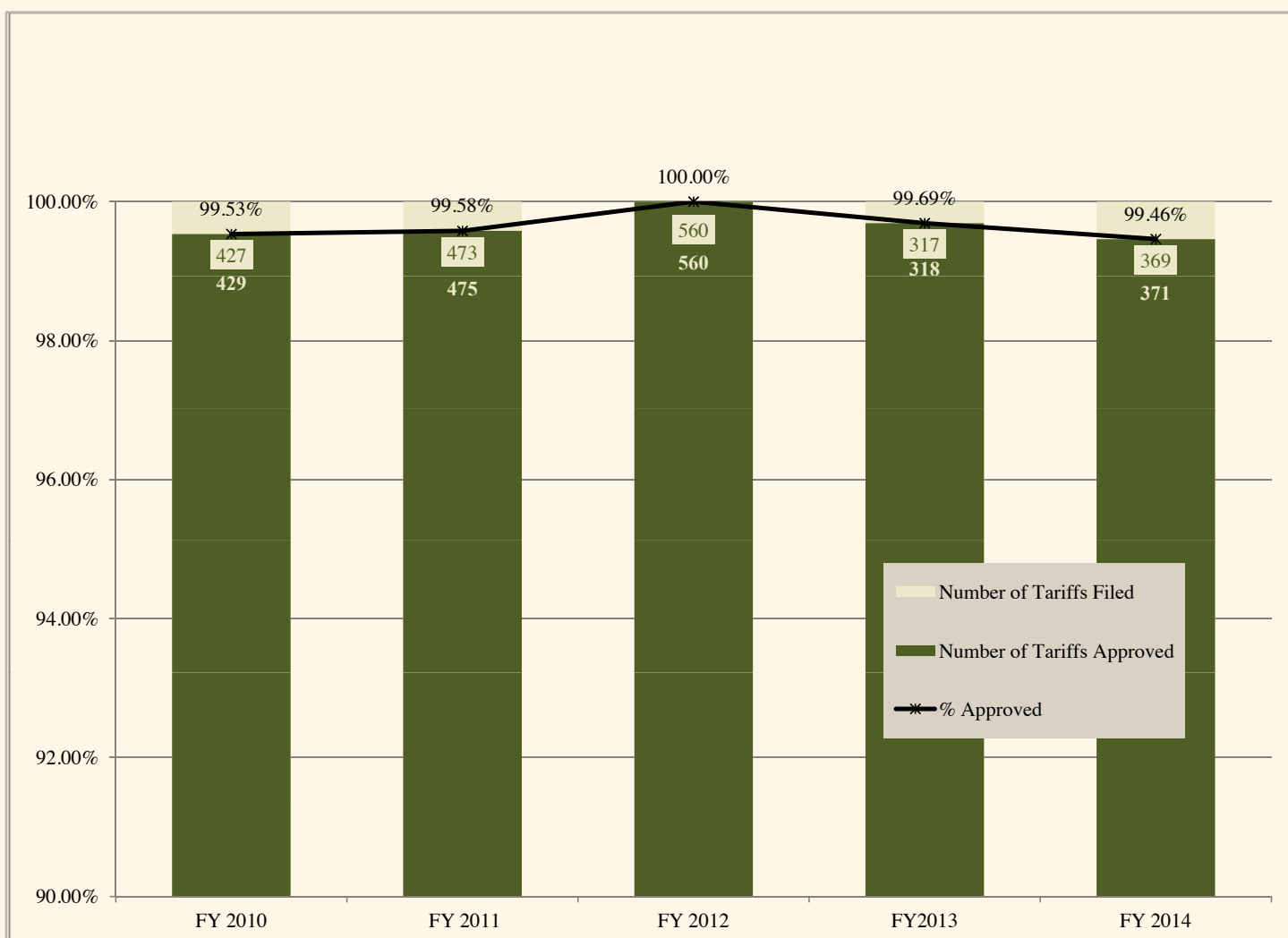
- Reviews applications for Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity and determines that applicants are fit, willing, and able to provide service and that service is required for the public convenience and necessity,
- Reviews tariff filings made by utilities or pipeline carriers that seek to change their rates or terms of service, and suspends tariff filings for further investigation when warranted,
- Determines that the rates a utility charges its customers are just and reasonable and that rates, services, and practices of public utilities and pipeline carriers comport with their filed tariffs and are neither discriminatory or unduly preferential,
- Calculates subsidy rates for the Power Cost Equalization program,
- Investigates complaints regarding utility service quality or management practices,
- Proposes, considers and adopts new or amended regulations,
- And, seeks consumer and utility input in informational public meeting settings.

COMMISSION MEASURES

The Commission assures that safe, efficient, and reliable utility and pipeline services are provided to the public at just, fair, and reasonable rates thereby promoting consumer interests and promoting economic development.

Results

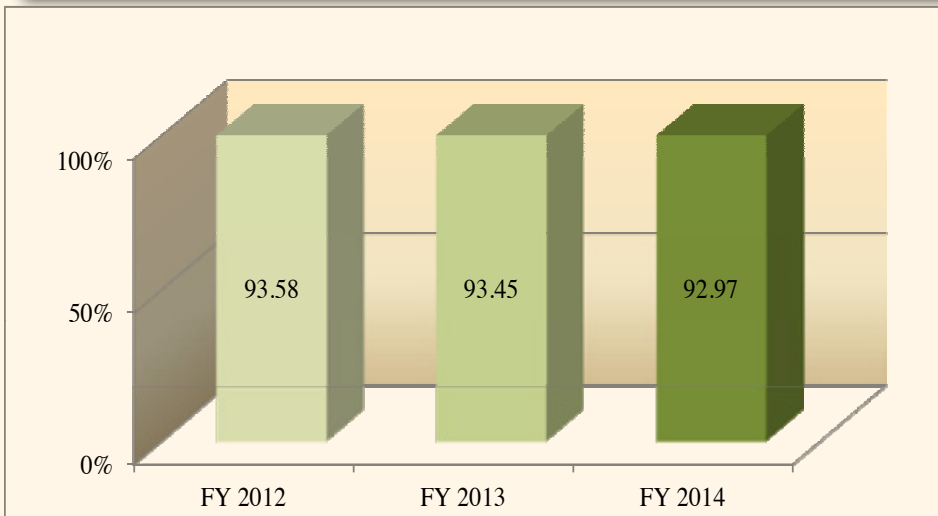
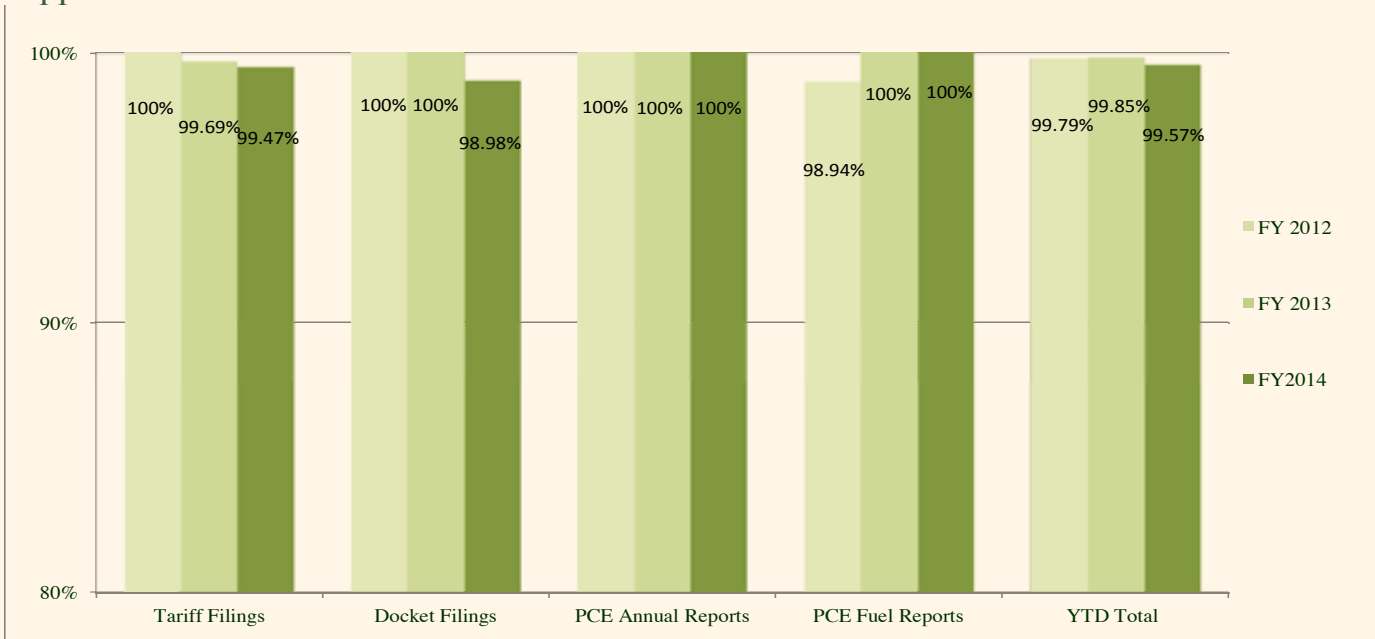
In assuring that utility and pipeline services are provided to consumers, in Alaska at just and reasonable rates, the Commission reviewed and processed 99.46 % of filed tariffs within statutory timelines.



The Commission reviews all initial tariffs and subsequent tariff revisions. The tariff review process prescribed by AS 42.05.361 through AS 42.05.441, includes a public comment period and allows the Commission to approve, reject or suspend a tariff filing. Review, analysis and disposition of tariff filings are substantial elements of the Commission's workload.

Core Service Measurements:

Review utility and pipeline filings for compliance with state and federal requirements within applicable timelines.

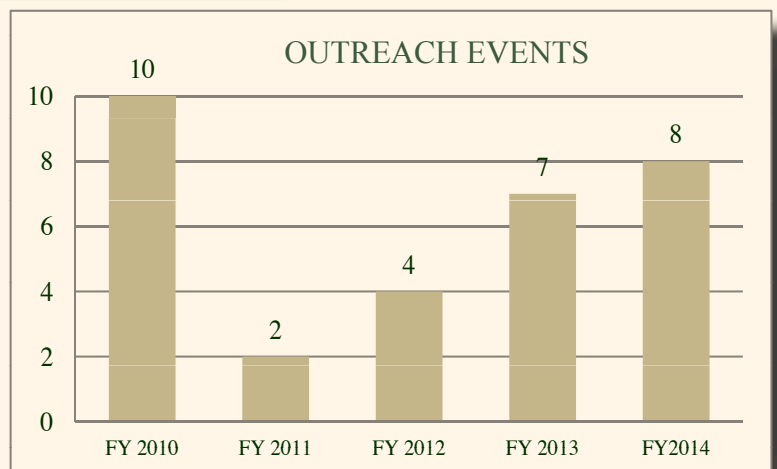


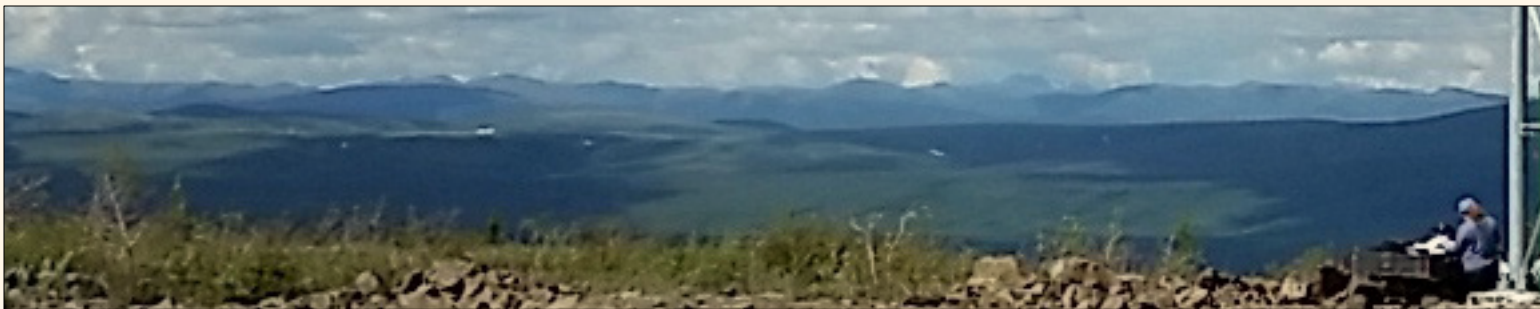
Informal complaint resolution within established timelines.

In FY2014, 119 of 128 complaint dispositions were completed within thirty days. Some complaints took longer to resolve due to the complexity of issues, when the service location slowed fact-finding or repairs, and when service providers required additional time to respond.

Number of Consumer Outreach Events

In FY 2014, the RCA continued its collaboration with AARP Alaska educating ratepayers about utility rates and services at the Alaska State Fair. Consumer Protection and Information staff represented the Commission at the Elders and Youth Conference and in Kenai and Homer at events sponsored by a local electric company. Staff also provided consumer information and outreach at the Anchorage Senior Activity Center, Community Action Council at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson and at the Scenic Foothills Community Council.



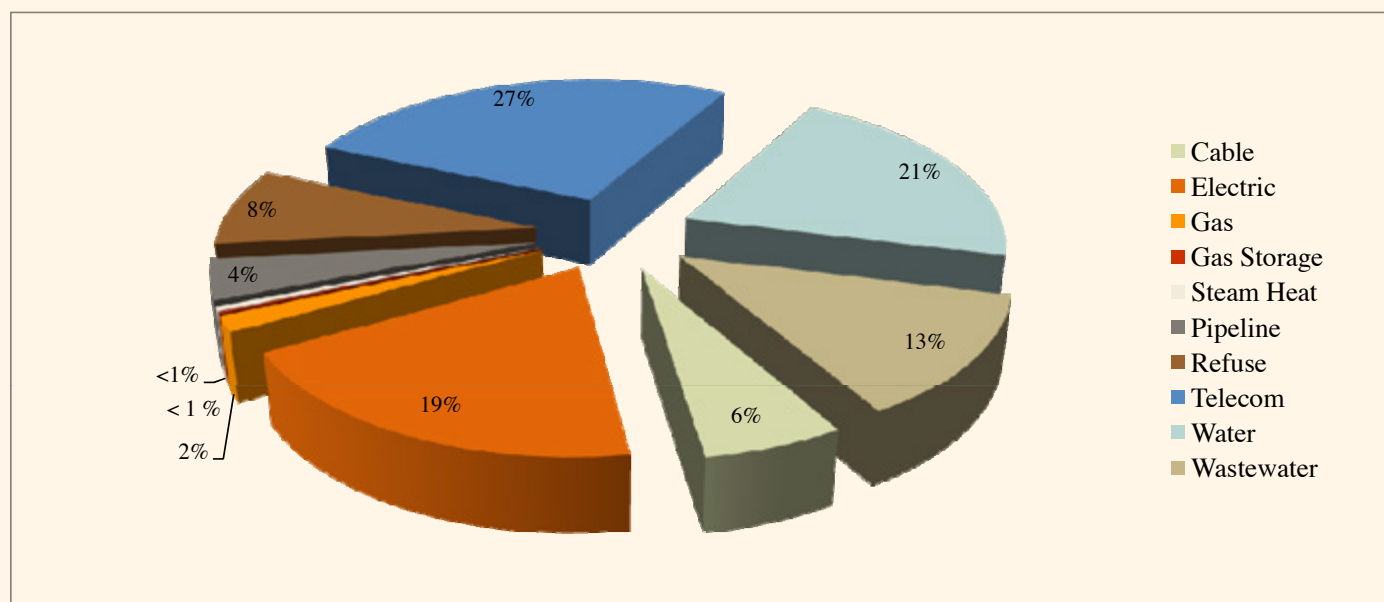


What does the Commission regulate?

Most utility and pipeline services and entities¹ providing these services:

This chart illustrates of the types of utility and pipeline services that are in some measure, regulated by the Commission.



¹ Some utilities are not economically regulated because: 1) their income is under a revenue threshold (e.g. electric or telephone utilities grossing less than \$50,000 annually); 2) they provide a type of service that is exempted by statute (e.g., cable television service providers); 3) or they have a statutory right to seek an exemption (e.g., some local government-owned utilities, cooperative utilities, and electric or telephone utilities grossing less than \$500,000 annually) (AS 42.05.711 and AS 42.05.712). The Commission may also exempt a class of utilities from some or all of AS 42.05 based on a finding that the exemption is in the public interest (AS 42.05.711(d)).



How does the Commission Regulate?

•Holding Public Meetings

• Investigating Consumer Complaints

Consumer complaints may be informal, and addressed by the Consumer Protection & Information Section, or formal and dealt with by a panel of Commissioners.

The Commission performs a quasi-legislative function by holding informational public meetings and adopting regulations considered in Rulemaking Dockets through a public process that complies with the Administrative Procedure Act. Public Meetings provide a forum to consider, discuss, inform about, and investigate matters that might not otherwise fall into a particular adjudicatory docket proceeding. The Commission's web page provides information regarding the public meeting schedule. In FY2014 the Commission held seventeen public meetings which included presentations by agencies, consumers and utilities. Some of the presented topics covered: Railbelt Electric Transmission Issues, Alaska Universal Support Levels, Discovery Regulations, and Liquefied Natural Gas markets.

Landing in Skagway:



In effort to provide ratepayers outside of Anchorage, better means to participate in the April 30, 2014 consumer input hearing, the Commission used a bridge conference to conduct a single consumer input hearing with Commissioners in both Anchorage, and Haines, as well as consumers gathered in Allakaket, Skagway and Tok and telephonic participants in the City of Craig and Slana. The Commission also held a consumer input hearing in Fairbanks.

• Commission Proceedings

The Commission's quasi-judicial functions include an informal public adjudication process to address utility tariff filings, and issuing written decisions to resolve docketed matters with or without a hearing.

- **TARIFF PROCEEDINGS**, with an adjudicatory docket opened if initial review results in suspension of the filing for investigation.
- **ADJUDICATORY DOCKETS** are used to address most issues involving the regulation of public utilities and pipeline carriers, with intervention limited to those parties demonstrating a legally sufficient interest in the outcome of the proceeding.
- **RULEMAKING PROCEEDINGS** are used to consider amending Commission regulations and allow interested parties the opportunity to comment on regulation proposals.

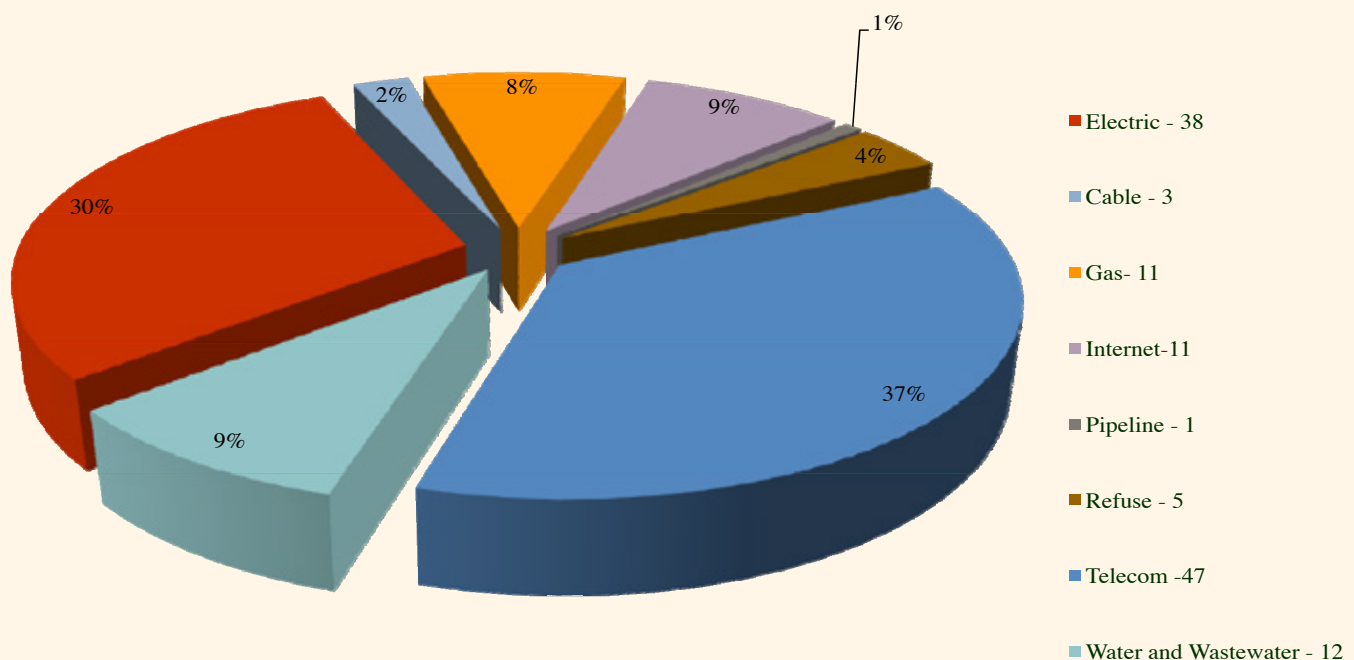
CONSUMER PROTECTION AND INFORMATION

The Consumer Protection & Information Section is an important interface between the Commission and the general public. Among its many duties the Consumer Protection & Information Section handles complaints from citizens and ratepayers about utility services and billings. Staff members work with consumers and utilities to informally and mutually resolve disputes where possible. If, however, a customer is not satisfied with the result, the section advises how a petition for alternative dispute resolution or a formal complaint may be filed with the Commission. The Consumer Protection & Information Section also conducts public outreach.

Of the 128 complaints filed in FY2014

93% were resolved in 30 days or less

CP DOCKET HIGHLIGHTS

Docket C-13-067 Customer complained a local electrical company was producing unbalanced power to its sewer lift stations. CP investigated the issue and determined that the electric company had not violated its tariff provisions. However, CP noted that utility records, such as voltage reports, were not available at the time of the complaint. CP required the company to comply with 3 AAC 52.460 (Quality of Service)

C-13-127 Customer complained a local gas company back-billed her for five years of service due to a meter mix-up. CP conducted an investigation. The utility agreed to reduce the customer's outstanding balance to \$197, which saved the customer \$550.

Docket C-14-052 Customer complained an electric utility had not billed her for several years before she received a bill for \$6,251. Customer stated the utility had a policy that it would discontinue service as of October 2012 if a customer owed more than \$500. CP investigated the complaint and determined the balance owing as of October 2012 was \$4,776. CP and the utility agreed the customer should only pay the amount owing as of October 2012.

Docket C-14-053 Customer complained that a local power company did not provide proper disconnection notice and that the utility disconnected his meter on a Friday proceeding Memorial Day. Customer made partial payment and power was restored. CP investigated the complaint and recommended that the customer make regular payments and adhere to his deferred payment agreement. CP also recommended that the utility update its tariff and shut off notices to comply with current state regulations and review its business practices associated with monthly billing and debt collection.

TARIFFS

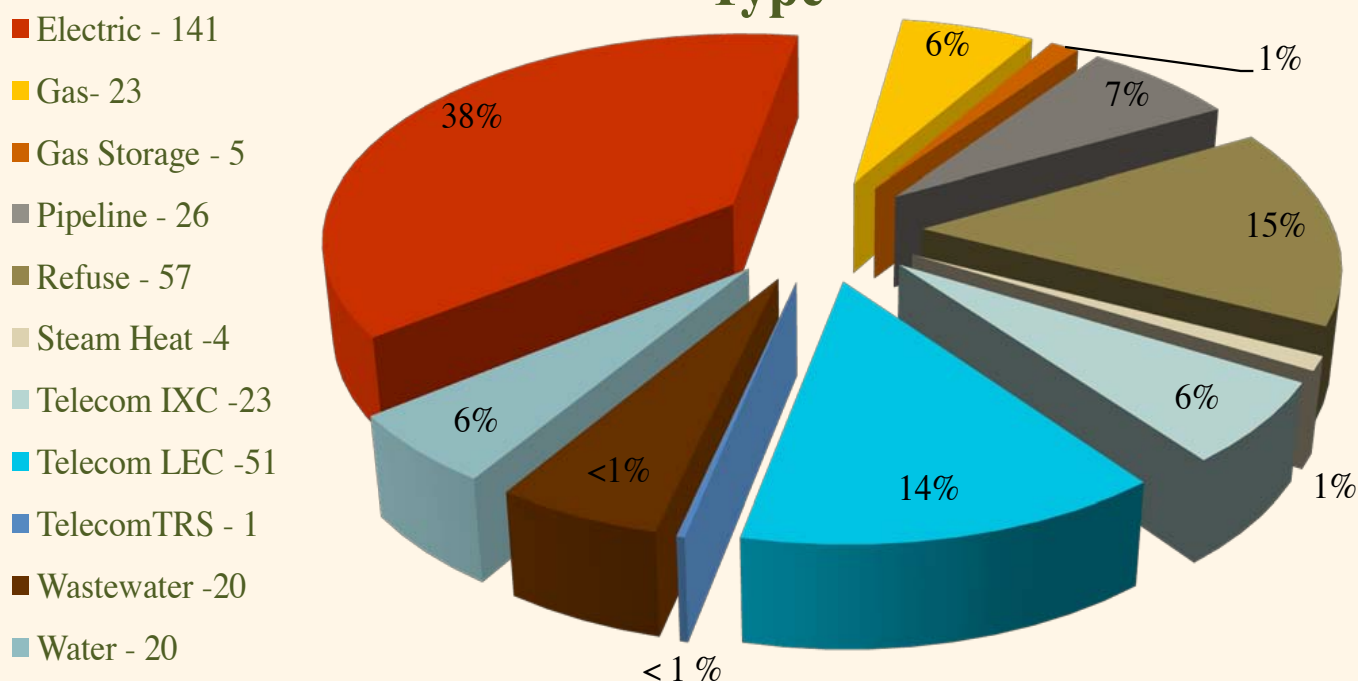
The tariff review process prescribed by AS 42.05.361 through AS 42.05.441, includes a public comment period and allows the Commission to approve, reject or suspend a tariff filing. Review, analysis and disposition of tariff filings are substantial elements of the Commission's workload. A tariff is an open contract between a utility or a pipeline carrier and the customer, usually the general public; it outlines and sets forth the terms, conditions, rules and rates governing a utility or pipeline carrier's conduct in providing the utility service, as well as a consumer's responsibilities in procuring the utility service. An effective tariff must set forth the rates, charges, terms, and conditions that apply to every service that a utility or pipeline carrier offers. Initial tariffs are submitted with certificate applications, registrations filed by eligible interexchange carriers, or provisional certification applications filed by eligible water and wastewater utilities.

Composition of 371 Tariff Filings by Utility Type



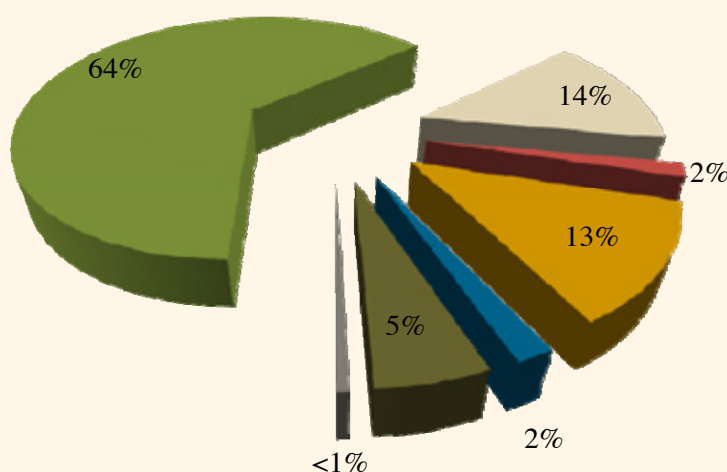

Tariff Highlights

TA246-13 Golden Valley Electric Association, Inc.

Golden Valley Electric Association, Inc. requested approval of a new cost element to recover the costs associated with the purchase of test energy from Alaska Electric and Energy Cooperative, Inc. which energy would displace higher-cost energy it would have otherwise purchased from Municipal Light & Power Department through its Cost of Power Adjustment surcharge.

TA354-32 Homer Electric Association, Inc.

Homer Electric Association, Inc. (HEA) requested approval of a new cost element to recover gas storage and related transportation, injection and withdrawal costs incurred under the Firm Storage Service Agreement between Alaska Electric and Energy Cooperative, Inc. and Cook Inlet Natural Gas Storage Alaska, LLC to its Cost of Power Adjustment surcharge. Additionally HEA removed the cost element for costs incurred under the all-requirements purchase agreement with Chugach Electric Association, Inc.

TA376-8 Chugach Electric Association, Inc.

Chugach Electric Association, Inc. requested approval to recognize revenues from the sale of Renewable Energy Certificates associated with energy purchases from the Fire Island Wind project in the determination of its Cost of Power Adjustment. Renewable Energy Credits can be sold separately from the electric power associated with a renewable energy generation source. The Renewable Energy Credit adjustment will act as a credit to retail purchased power costs in the calculation of its Cost of Power Adjustment.

TA381-8 Chugach Electric Association, Inc.

Chugach proposed a Gas Sale and Purchase Agreement between Chugach and Cook Inlet Energy LLC for firm natural gas delivery. This Gas Sale and Purchase Agreement will provide Chugach the opportunity to diversify its gas supply portfolio and will introduce a new mechanism into the Cook Inlet gas market.

TA838-2 Alaska Power Company.

Alaska Power Company requested approval of a Power Sales Agreement with Young's Fuel Logs and Pellets, LLC for the sale of interruptible excess power. The agreement will expire seven years from the date the Agreement is approved by the Commission. Alaska Power Company has committed to providing similar rates and terms to other potential interruptible service customers into the Cook Inlet gas market.

TA1-750

Sprint Communications Company L.P.

Sprint Communications Company L.P. filed its tariff as the new state of Alaska telecommunications relay service (TRS) provider. TRS permits deaf, hard-of-hearing, and/or speech-impaired individuals who use text telephone (TTY), or its equivalent, to communicate with persons who do not use a TTY, and vice versa. Sprint's Outreach Program provides educational programs, telecommunication accessibility equipment and assistance to Alaska consumers.

TA246-4 ENSTAR Natural Gas Company

ENSTAR Natural Gas Company requested approval of a special contract with Chugach Electric Association, Inc. for interruptible gas transportation service to the Beluga Power Plant. The term of the Special Contract runs from December 15, 2013 through December 15, 2014 and continues thereafter until canceled upon 90 days' written notice by either party.



POWER COST EQUALIZATION (PCE)

The Power Cost Equalization (PCE) program seeks to equalize power costs on a per kilowatt-hour (kWh) basis statewide by approximating higher rural electric costs closer to the average cost per kilowatt hour paid by customers in Anchorage, Fairbanks, and Juneau. To accomplish this goal, the PCE program provides economic assistance payments from the Power Cost Equalization Fund, which was established in 1993.

The Alaska Energy Authority (AEA) administers the both the PCE Fund and Program based on PCE level determinations made by this Commission. Participating electric utilities are required to reduce each eligible customer’s bill by the amount that is offset by the PCE funding. In addition to authorizing payment from the PCE Fund to participating electric utilities, based upon levels determined by the RCA, the AEA determines the eligibility of community facilities and individual residential customers. On an annual basis, the Commission establishes a base rate for the subsequent year.² Recent PCE base rates set by the Commission are shown in the table below:³

After the base rate has been determined, the Commission reviews the cost of power filings that each participating utility must file⁴ and then calculates PCE levels for each utility based upon these cost of power filings.⁵ The Commission then notifies each utility of the appropriate PCE level so that in turn, each utility can adjust billings to their customers.

² AS 42.45.110(c)(2) requires the Commission to annually adjust the calculation of power costs eligible for PCE reimbursement based on the weighted average retail residential rates in Anchorage, Fairbanks, and Juneau. In order for the Commission to determine just and reasonable PCE levels, participating utilities are obligated to file particular reports on an annual and monthly basis. In FY 2014, the Commission recalculated PCE levels, prepared tariff sheets, and reviewed 40 Cost of Power Adjustment filings for the fifteen economically regulated electric utilities eligible to receive PCE support set forth below:

AEA suspended both Diomedes Joint Utilities and the Native Village of Perryville from the PCE program on March 1, 2014, because required reports were not filed by the utilities.

In order for the Commission to determine just and reasonable PCE levels, participating utilities are obligated to file particular reports on an annual and monthly basis. In FY 2014, the Commission reviewed 176 Non-Regulated PCE Fuel and Purchased Power Cost Reports and reviewed 36 Annual Reports determining PCE support for the 74 non-economically regulated utilities eligible to receive PCE support as shown.

Docket Information

Information that the Commission collects, analyses, and uses as the basis for a decision in a formal proceeding involving matters of fact, law or policy is maintained in a docket. A docket is the listing of and records repository maintained for a formal proceeding. Thus it is in a docketed proceeding that the Commission reviews utility and/or pipeline carrier applications, i.e., an application for a certificate of public convenience and necessity; complaints that are not resolved informally; tariff filings that are suspended within the statutory notice period; and changes to existing or newly proposed regulations. Dockets are designated as “U,” for utility matters; “P,” for pipeline matters; and “R,” for rulemaking proceedings. Occasionally a docket is otherwise employed, for example an “I,” docket is for information gathering. Dockets are typically administered by a panel of three commissioners. Some proceedings involve all five commissioners.

When a docket is opened, an administrative law judge and advisory section staff member are assigned to work closely with commission panel. Rate cases, in particular, raise issues of law, economics, accounting, finance, and engineering that can establish legal precedent for future cases. In cases that go to hearing, parties present sworn testimony and documentary evidence on the matters at issue. Witnesses may be cross-examined and their opinions and the facts and basis for their opinions are carefully tested.

Formal proceedings afford all participants due process and decisions are based on evidence of record. Participants may include the subject public utility or pipeline carrier, the Attorney General’s Regulatory Affairs and Public Advocacy Section, and interested entities that have been permitted to intervene in a proceeding. In a regulations docket, any person is allowed to submit comments during the public comment period. One of the Commission’s most important duties is to reach decisions that consider competing interests of concerned parties and promote the public interest. Decisions may be appealed to state or federal court, and must be consistent with applicable law and supported by evidence in the record.

Docket Highlights

Electric

U-12-140~ McGrath Light and Power (MLPC) filed TA132-44, requesting permanent rate increases yielding an overall 48.47% increase in revenue, a rate redesign, implementation of a cost of power adjustment (COPA) and a 33.93% interim across-the-board rate increase. The Commission opened Docket U-12-140 to investigate the request and granted the interim rate increase on a refundable basis. The AG elected to participate as a party in the proceeding. The parties ultimately files a stipulation resolving all issues in the proceeding, including an overall, permanent 40.01% rate increase. The Commission accepted the stipulation by issuing Order U-12-140(13).

U-13-006~ The Municipality of Anchorage d/b/a Municipal Light and Power (ML&P) Filed TA326-121, requesting an increase to its demand and energy rates of 9.72%. ML&P also requested an interim and refundable rate increase of 7.78%. The Commission opened Docket U-13-006 to consider the request and granted ML&P's interim rate increase request on a refundable basis. The AG elected to participate in the proceeding and an evidentiary hearing was held. The Commission established just and reasonable rates and approved a permanent rate increase of 6.57%.

U-13-118~ The transfer of Bethel Utilities Corporation (BUC) to AVEC. AVEC will be able to provide service more efficiently and cost-effectively than BUC. Due to its size and organizational structure, AVEC is able to provide centralized management, accounting, engineering, logistical, and customer service functions at a lower cost than could be obtained by an organization serving only a single rural city or village. AVEC immediately reduced the base rate of the Bethel electric service customers by 9.2%.

AVEC projects in time they will be able to reduce Bethel energy costs by their enhanced buying power of bulk fuel purchases, increasing the sales of waste heat, thereby reducing the local high heating fuel costs. Also, AVEC will be able to use Bethel as an operations and maintenance hub saving transportation

and response costs. AVEC believes in the long term they may be able to construct transmission lines that would interconnect service areas around the Bethel area, which would allow more efficient generators to be sited in a location that has access to significantly lower-priced fuel than more remote communities. The transfer increased AVEC's total number of customers by approximately 25%.

Natural Gas

U-13-160~ Matanuska Electric Association, Inc. (MEA) filed a request for approval of a gas supply agreement (GSA) between MEA and Hilcorp Alaska, LLC (Hilcorp), and for permission to recover in rates all fuel costs associated with the GSA. MEA is currently an all-requirements customer of Chugach Electric Association, Inc. (Chugach). However, on December 31, 2014, MEA's power purchase agreement with Chugach expires. MEA has been constructing its Eklutna Generation Station (EGS) to supply its own power once the agreement with Chugach expires. EGS is expected to begin initial operations and testing in late 2014, in preparation for the December 31, 2014 deadline. MEA's GSA with Hilcorp is the first (and only) source of the natural gas MEA needs to operate the EGS power plant. The Commission issued Order U-13-160(2) approving MEA's request.

Natural Gas

U-13-083/U-13-103 ~ In Order U-13-083(19)/U-13-103(19), the Commission denied the application filed by FNG to amend its CPCN to expand its service area. The Commission also granted, with condition, a CPCN to IANGU to provide natural gas distribution service in the service area it applied for. These applications were the result of the 2012 proposed Interior Energy Project, a plan to liquefy North Slope natural gas and truck it to the Fairbanks area for space heating and electric generation. In April 2013, the legislature unanimously passed a finance package which included \$57.5 million in grant funding, \$125 million in loans for a North Slope plant, and \$150 million in loans for the build-out of a local gas distribution system in the Fairbanks North Star Borough (FNSB). FNG is already certificated by the RCA to serve as a natural gas distribution utility in Fairbanks. Within Docket U-13-083, FNG sought to expand its service area in all directions, including service down to North Pole, Alaska. IANGU is a wholly owned instrumentality of the FNSG. IANGU filed an application for a CPCN to provide service in many areas of the FNSB outside of FNG's service area, including North Pole. After reviewing extensive public comment and factual record established in the proceeding, the Commission determined to deny FNG's application and approve IANGU's application

Pipeline

P-13-006/P-13-007 ~ The transfer of ownership of the Badami Oil Pipeline and the Badami Utility Pipeline from BPTA to Nutaag Pipeline. While the transfers do not stand out as landmark cases, they represent the start of the larger exploration and production companies moving out of the North Slope and the smaller exploration and production companies moving in, just as we have seen in the Cook Inlet Basin.

Telecommunications

R-12-005 ~ Statewide Long Distance Service (Previously, any carrier offering 1-plus, direct-dialed intrastate long-distance service had to do offer the service on a statewide basis. The long distance market in Alaska has changed significantly since the IXC statewide service regulations were initially adopted. There are alternatives to traditional long distance telephone service and more facilities-based services are available than ever before. In 2013, in R-12-005, the Commission revised the intrastate interexchange (IXC) service requirements. IXCs are still required to provide 1-plus, direct dialed service where they have facilities, but the obligation that they are to provide service where they are simply resellers has been eliminated. The revised regulations should aid the smaller rural IXCs to compete regionally with the larger carriers' bundled service offerings, which will help ensure that consumers in rural locations do not have significantly higher long distance rates than consumers in urban markets.

DOCKET HIGHLIGHTS

U-12-135 ~ We recently approved the application of Cordova Wireless Communications, Inc. to be considered as an eligible telecommunications carrier (ETC) in the Yakutat area. Historically, when a competitive carrier is designated as an ETC it has sought to provide service in the entire service area of the incumbent local exchange carrier. However, the wireless carrier in this case had asked for service area redefinition, or to provide service at a level that is less than the entire service area of the incumbent LEC. Competitive ETCs seeking a service area redefinition must go through a creamskimming analysis. Creamskimming refers to instances in which a competitive ETC only serves the customers that are the least expensive to serve, leaving the ILEC to provide service to the higher cost customers of its service area.

Cost Allocation Manual ~ (U-13-010, U-13-084 thru U-13-094, and U-13-104) A Cost Allocation Manual (CAM) is a document that describes in detail how an incumbent local exchange carrier (ILEC) separates its costs between its regulated activities and its non-regulated activities. Traditionally, the Commission placed annual CAM filing and audit compliance requirements on an ILEC when it formed an IXC affiliate to begin providing long distance service within the state. The CAM requirements were established to safeguard against cross-subsidization between an ILEC and its IXC affiliate. Last year, the Commission granted several local exchange carriers relief of the annual CAM filing and audit requirements. The ILECs who received relief are still required to maintain a CAM, but in lieu of having to file it with the Commission every year, they now must simply file a one-page affidavit certifying that they are complying with the FCC's cost allocation rules. However, there is a caveat. If an ILEC ever comes in for a rate modification proceeding in which a Cost Allocation Manual is a required part of the filing, the carrier must submit an audit report showing that for the relevant test year that it was in compliance with its CAM.

Water/Wastewater

R-11-006 ~ The Commission opened Docket R-11-006 to evaluate potential new regulations to establish a Plant Replacement and Improvement Surcharge Mechanism (PRISM) for economically regulated water and wastewater utilities. The docket was promulgated to facilitate the faster recovery of costs associated with replacing or improving plant assets, while reducing excessive litigation and legal costs associated with cost recovery, which further increases rates to the consumer. Two technical conferences were held and several water and wastewater utilities participated, as did the AG. During the course of the docket several different iterations of PRISM regulations were proposed and commented on and discussed at multiple public meetings. The Commission adopted final PRISM regulations by issuing Order R-11-006(7), which were made effective by the Lieutenant Governor with an effective date of June 29, 2014.

STATUTORY EXTENSIONS

The Commission is tasked with rendering a final determination regarding docketed utility and regulations matters within the timelines set forth at AS 42.05.175. Docket timelines may be extended for various reasons; for example, a party may request the Commission to extend a timeline to allow for the party to prepare its case or accommodate witness schedules. There are occasions when more time is needed so that the Commission has adequate time to fully consider an issue. In FY 2014 the Commission issued fourteen (14) orders that either extended or stayed the AS 42.05.175 timelines of docketed matters. The table below provides additional details.

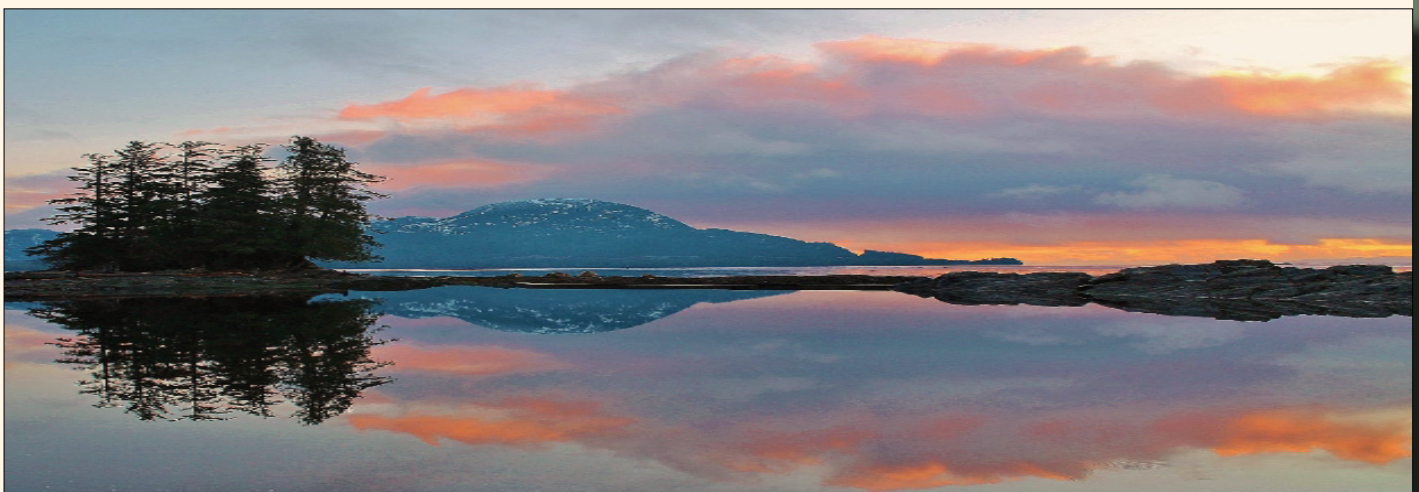
