

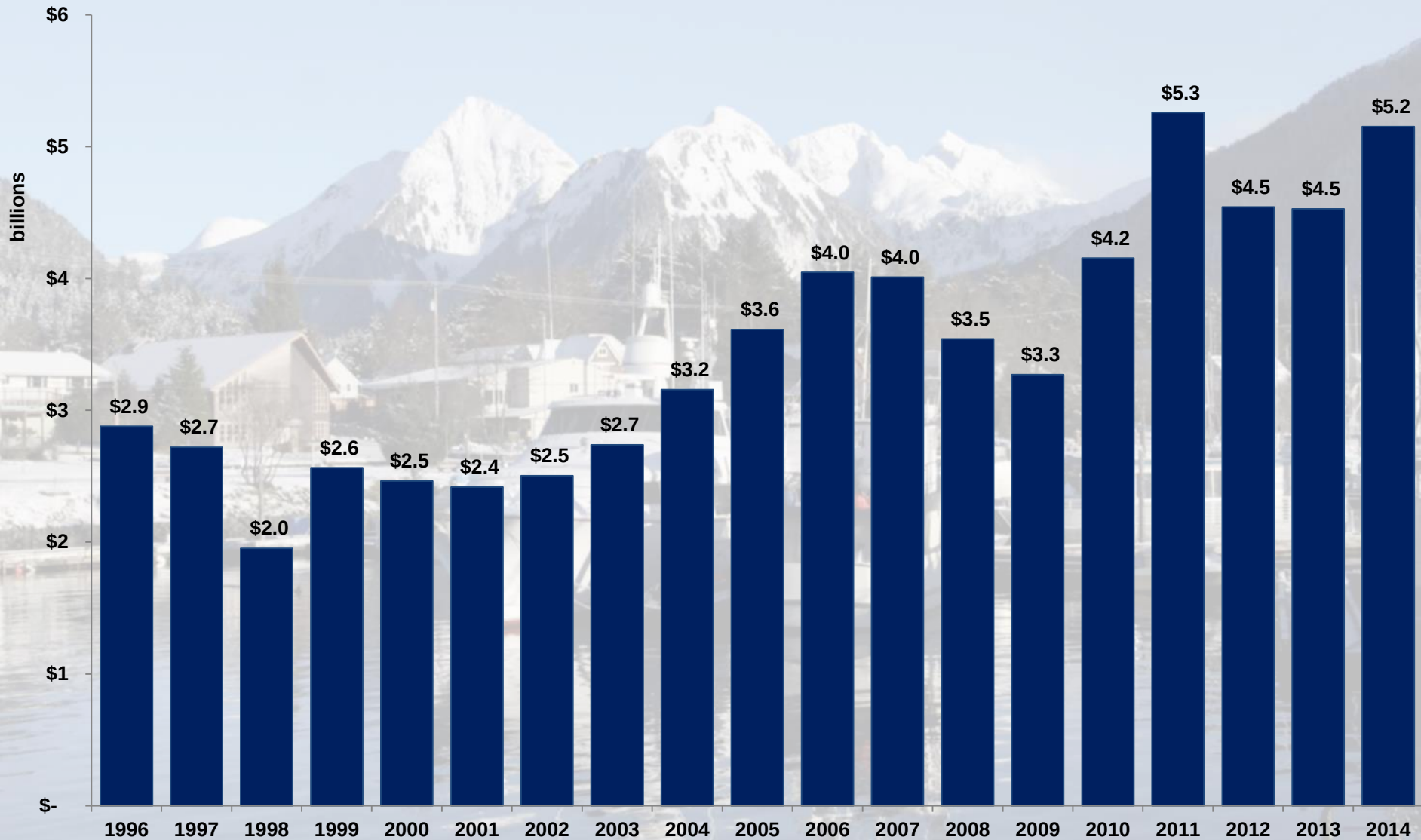

Alaska Total Exports—\$5.2 billion in 2014



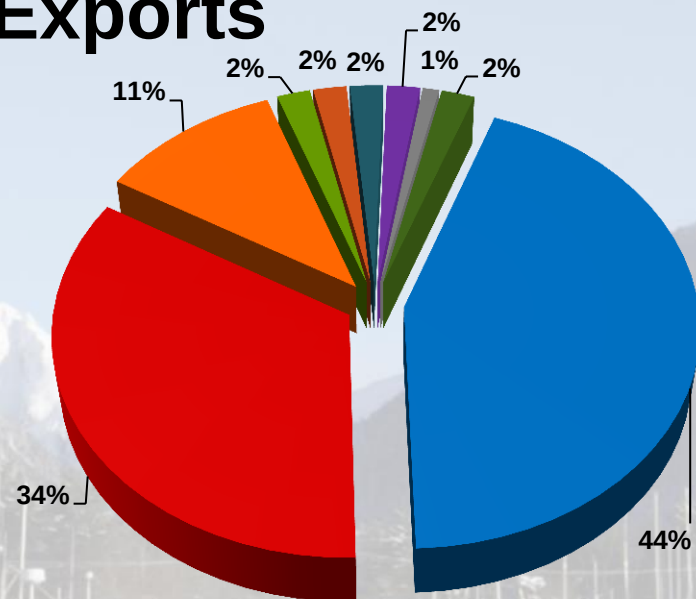
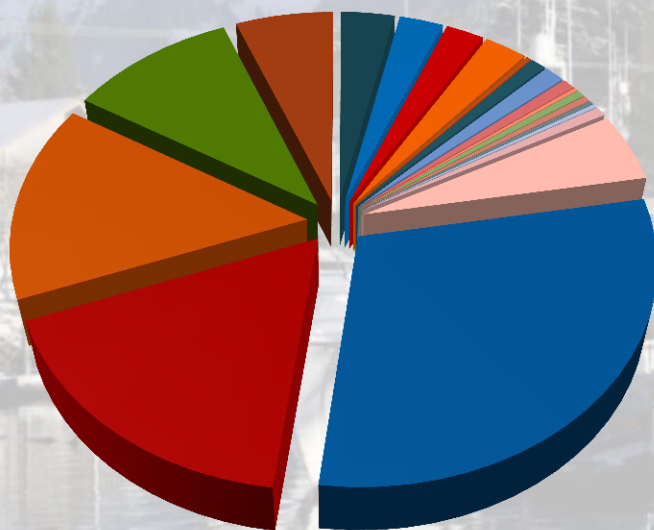

Alaska's Top Export Regions 1996 to 2014

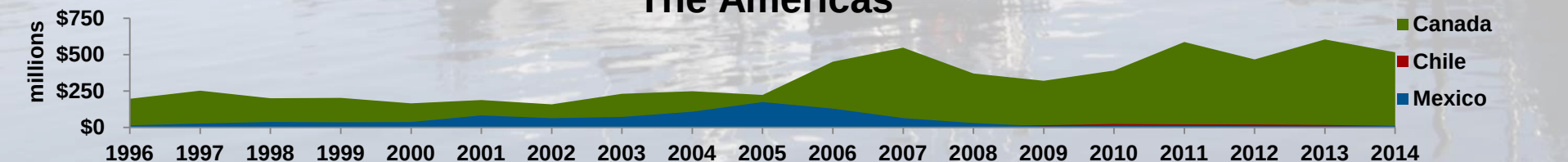

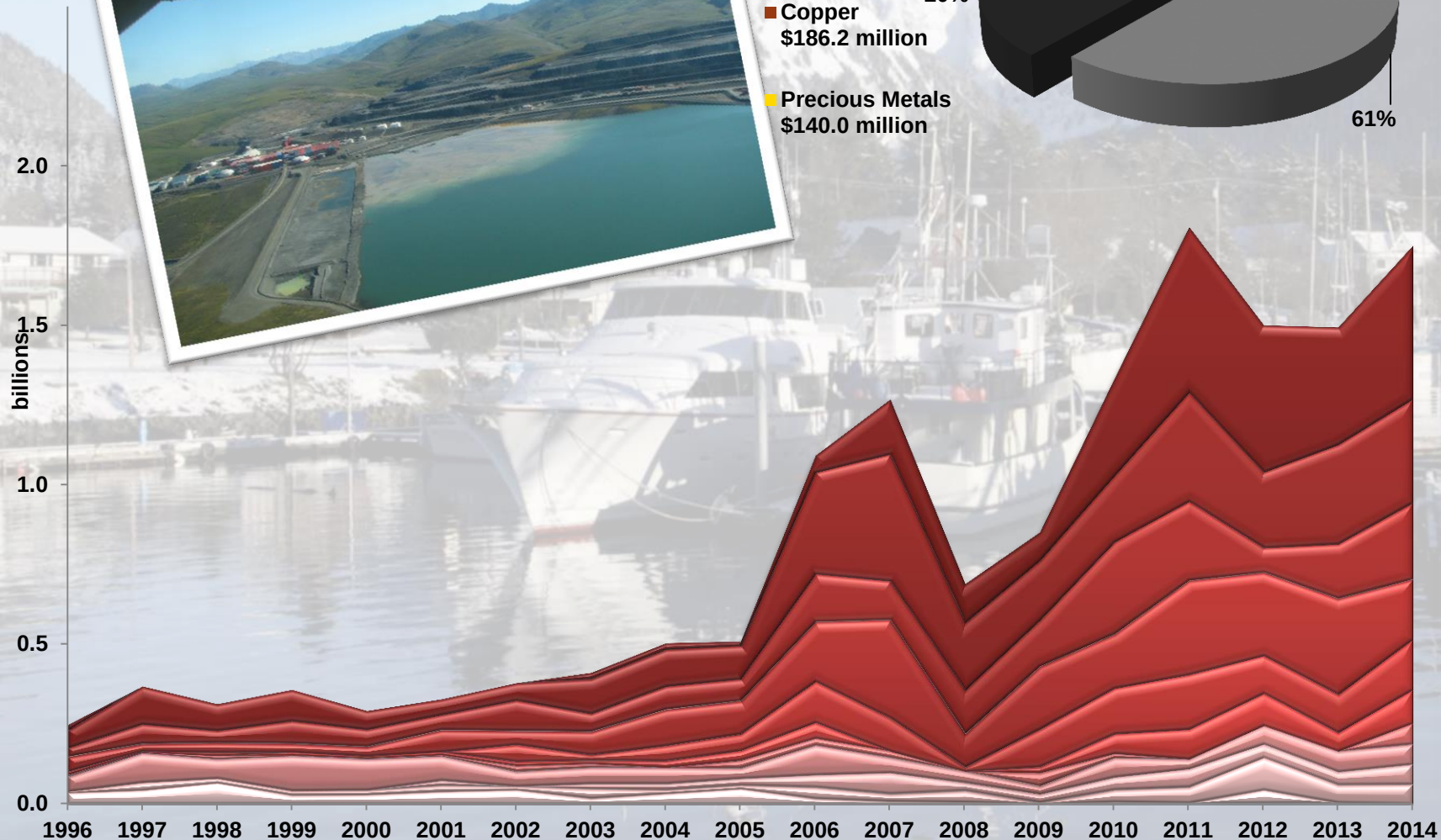
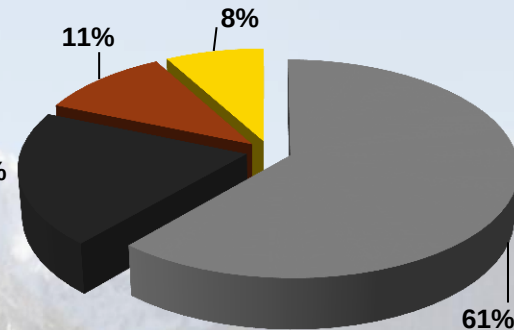
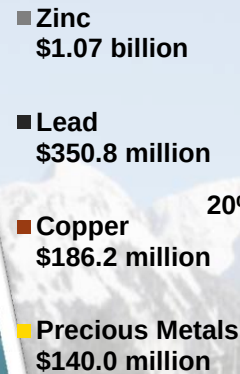
- **ALASKA IS THE PRIMARY CARGO MIDPOINT FOR ASIA/US FREIGHTER TRAFFIC**
 - Majority of Asia/US freighter operations are via Ted Stevens Anchorage International Airport
 - TSAIA creates one out of ten jobs in Anchorage.
 - Fairbanks International Airport is a key international alternate airport for freighters
- **INTERNATIONAL VISITOR DESTINATION FOR ASIA AND EUROPE**
 - Seasonal passenger service
 - Condor, Icelandair, Air Russia, Air North, Korean Air



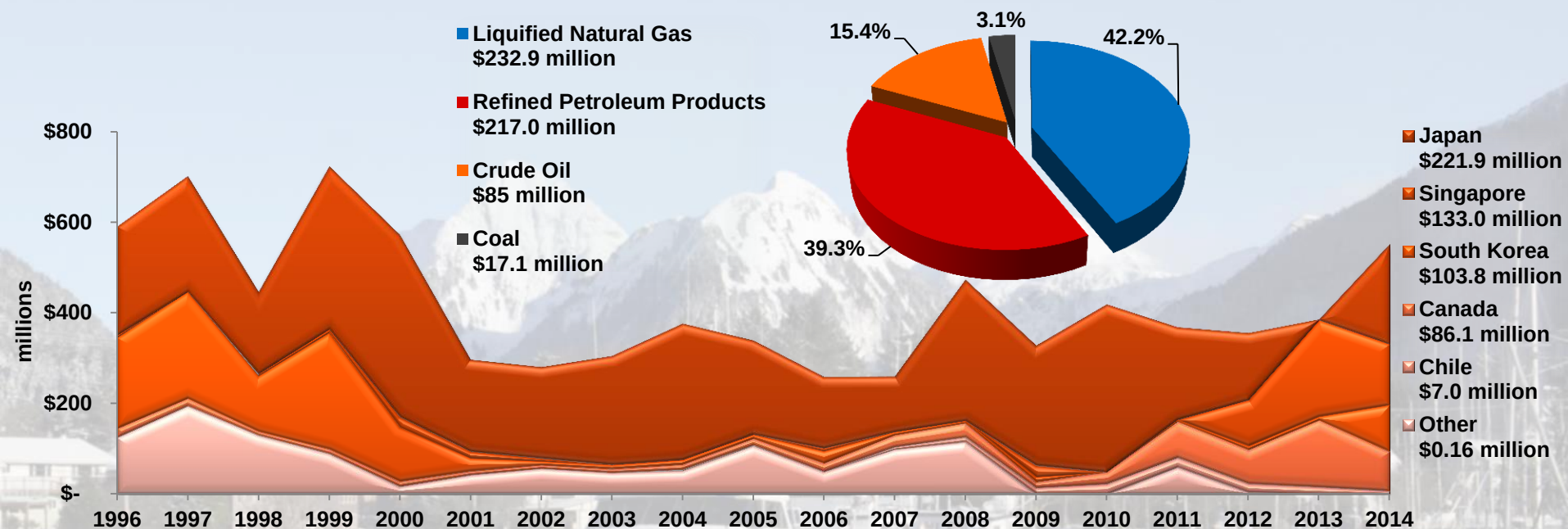
Alaska Seafood Exports—\$2.25 billion in 2014



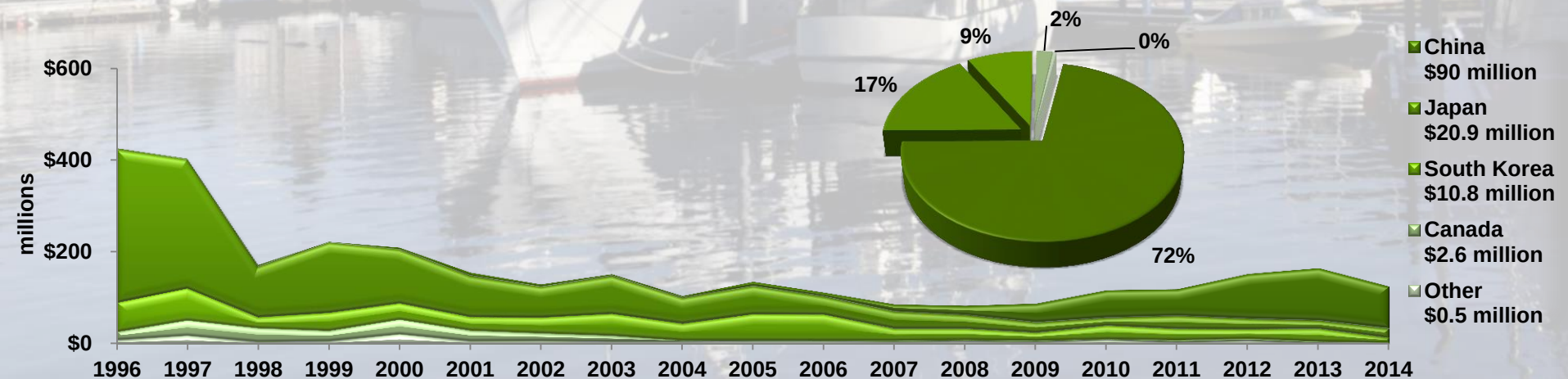
Alaska Mineral Ore Exports—\$1.75 billion in 2014



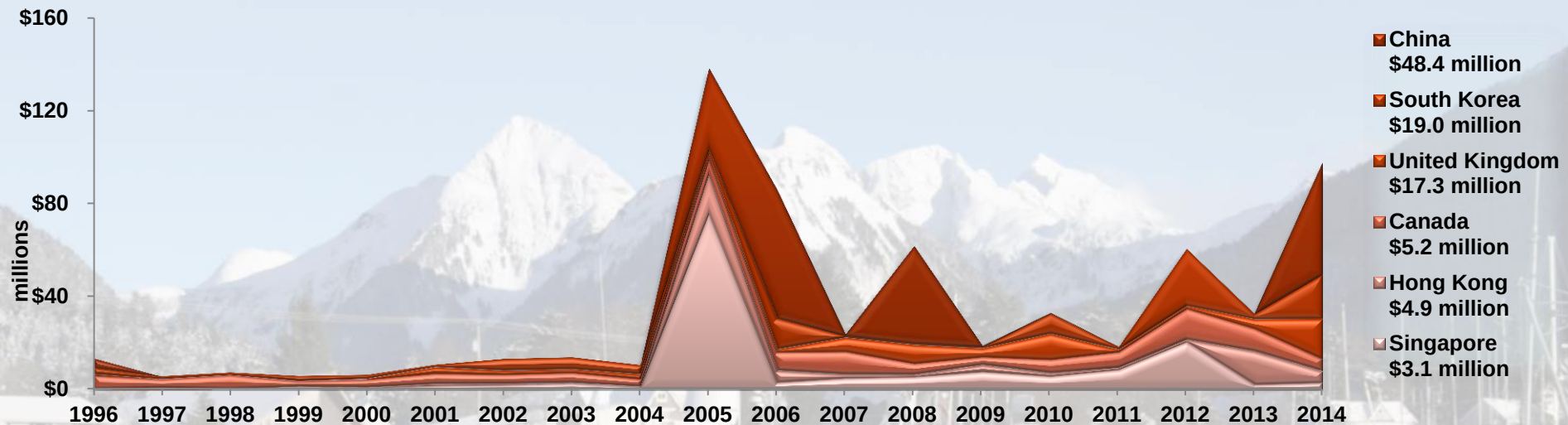
Alaska Energy Exports—\$552.0 million in 2014



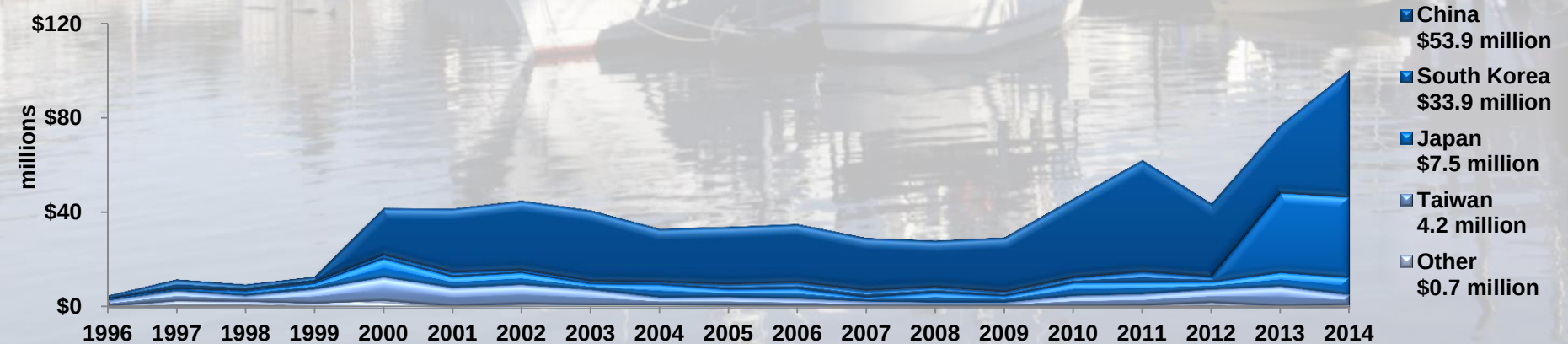

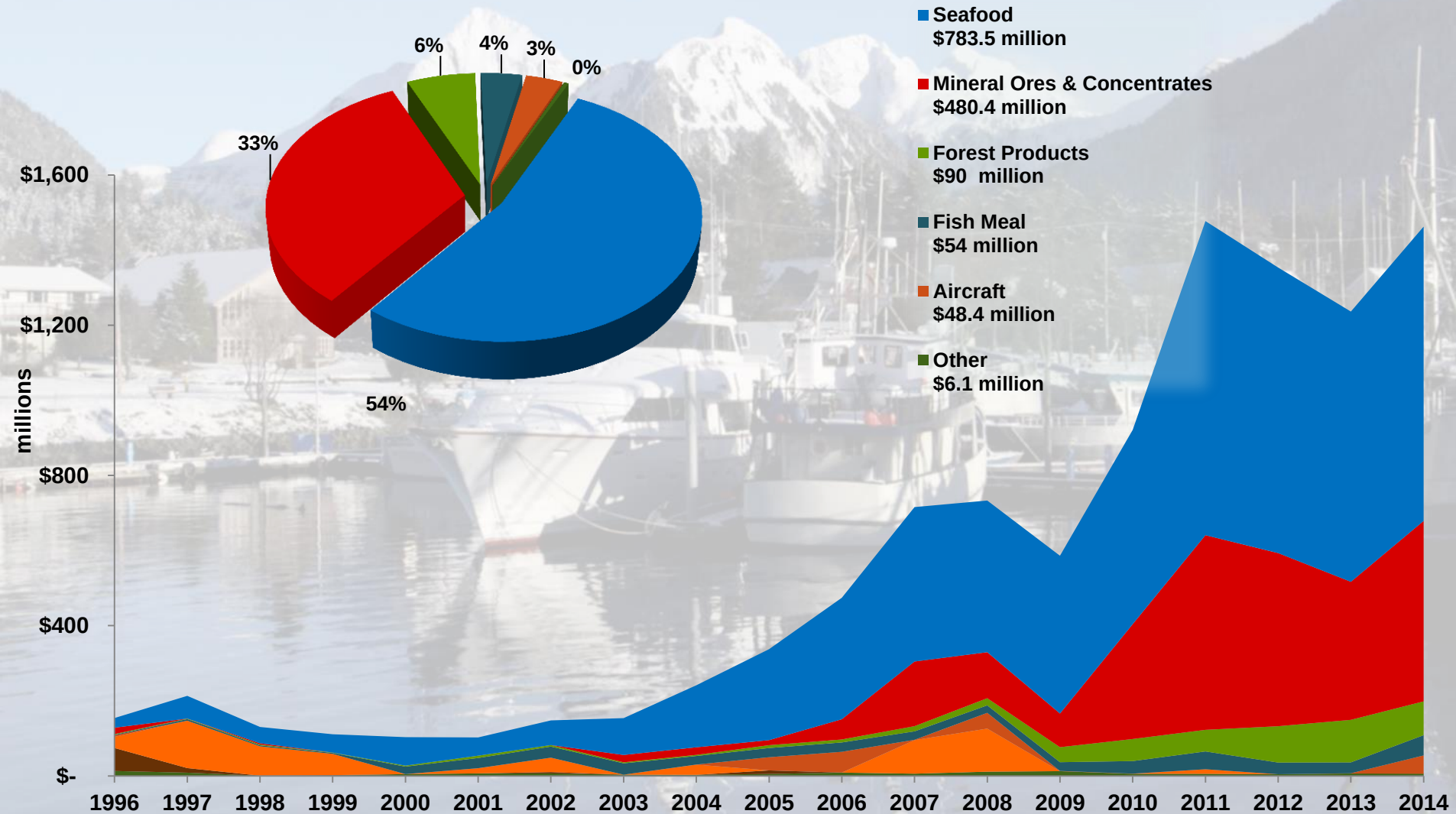

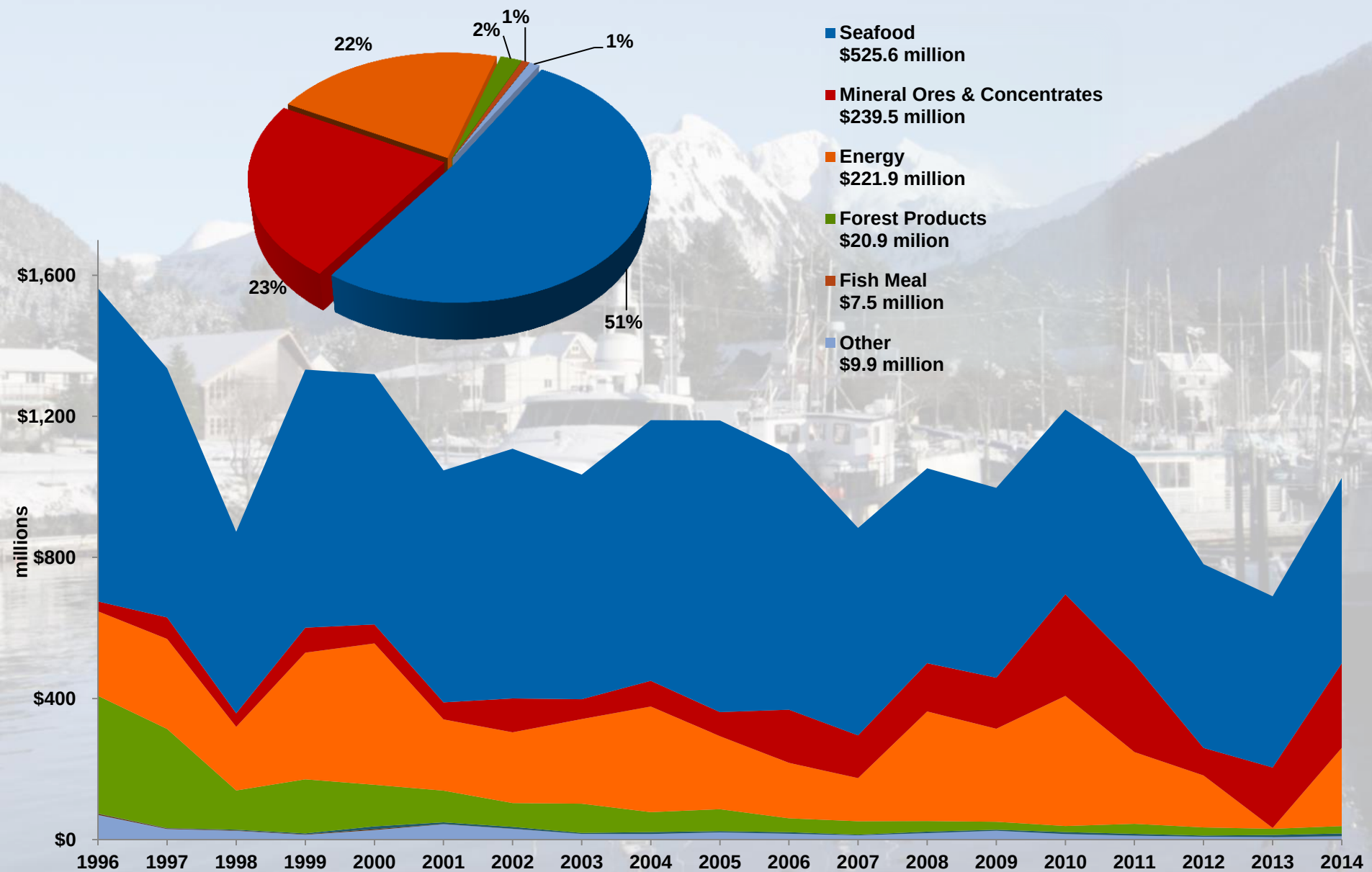

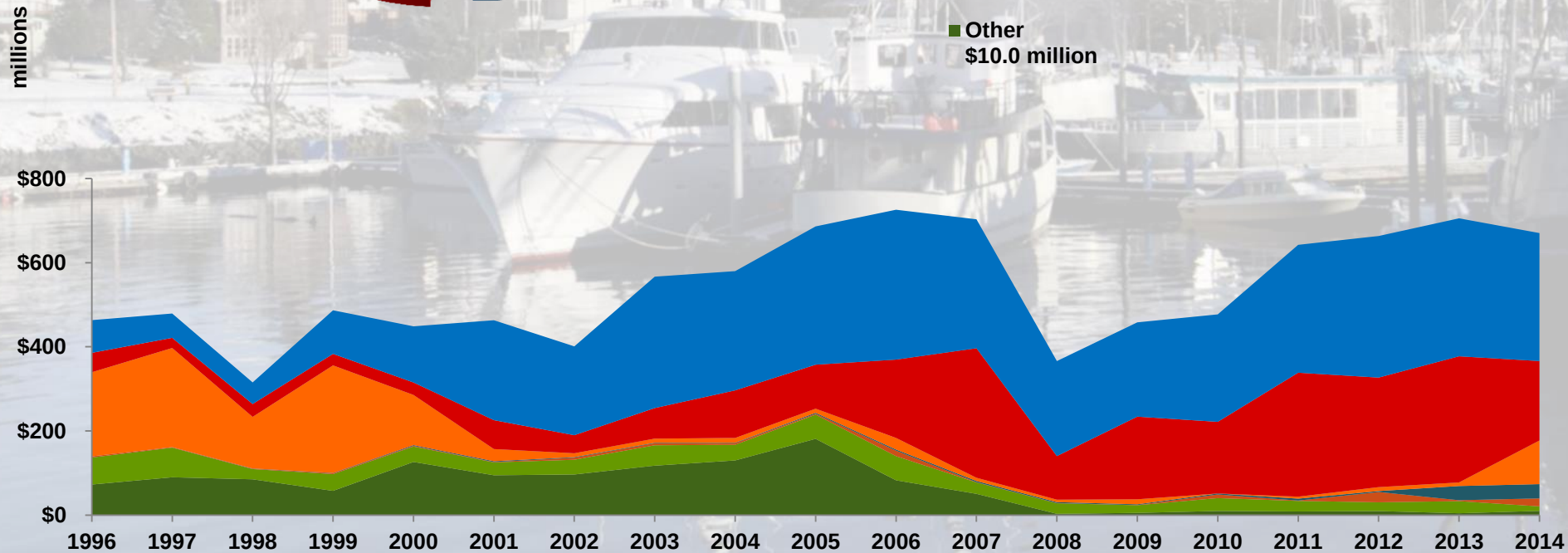
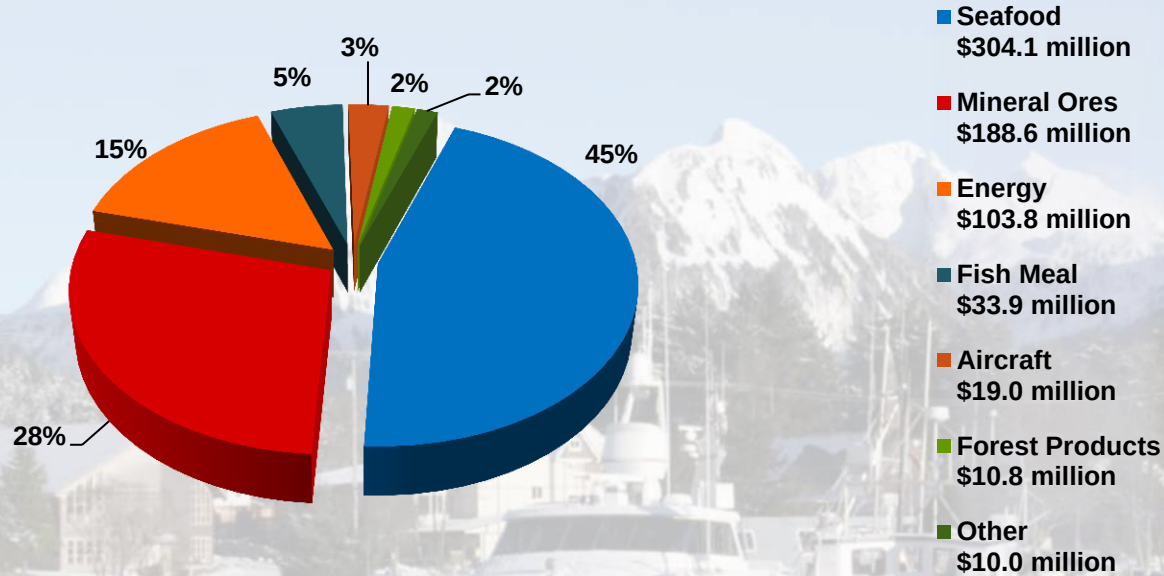
Alaska Exports to China—\$1.5 billion in 2014



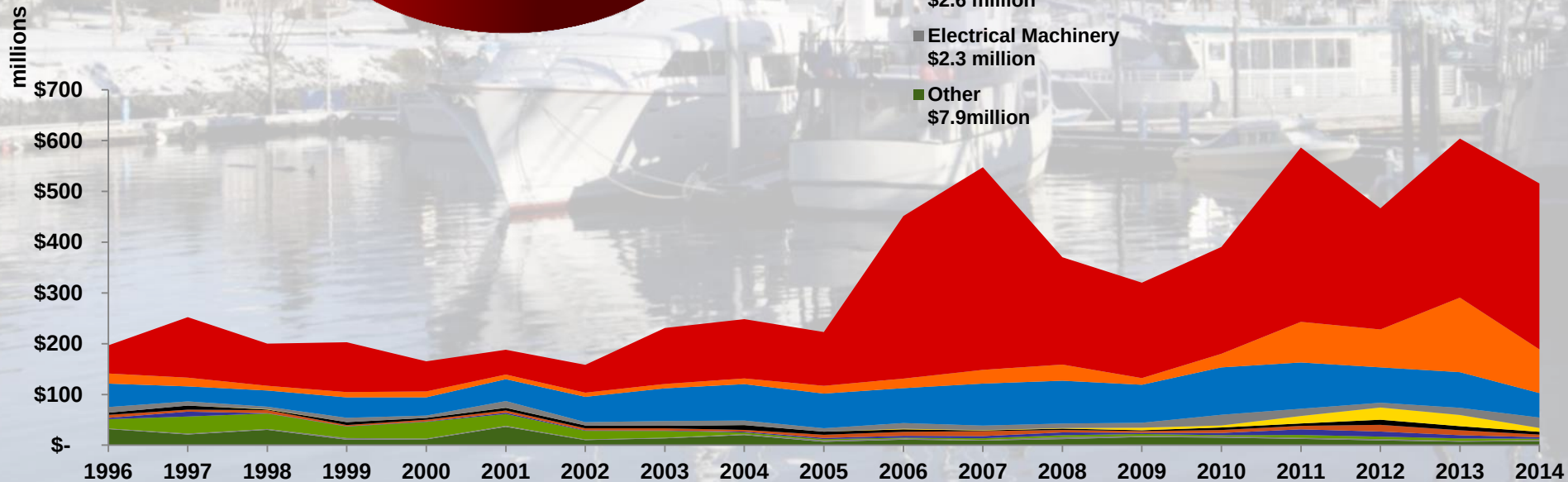
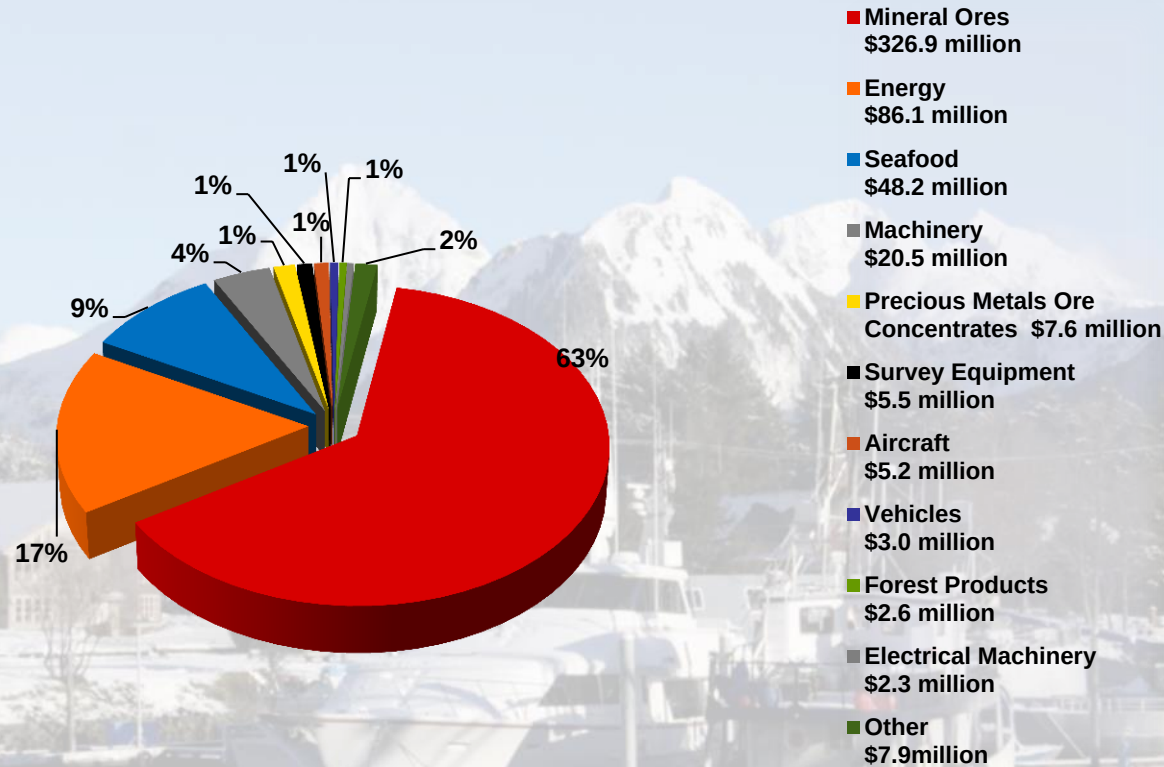
Alaska Exports to Japan—\$1.02 billion in 2014



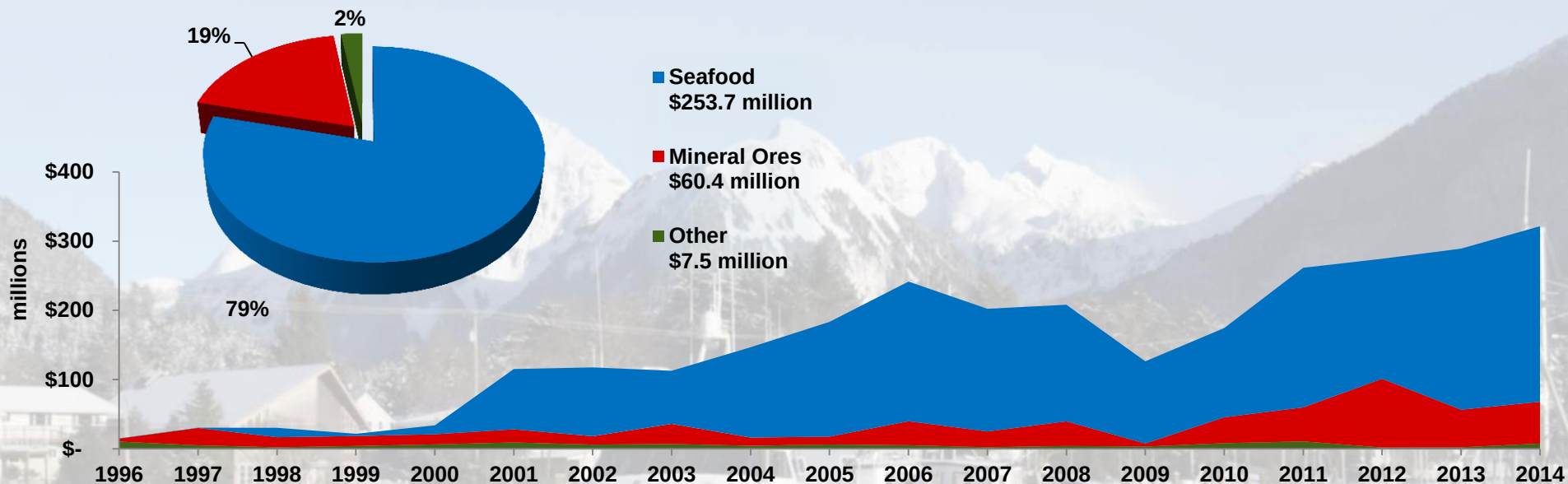
Alaska Exports to South Korea—\$670.2 million in 2014



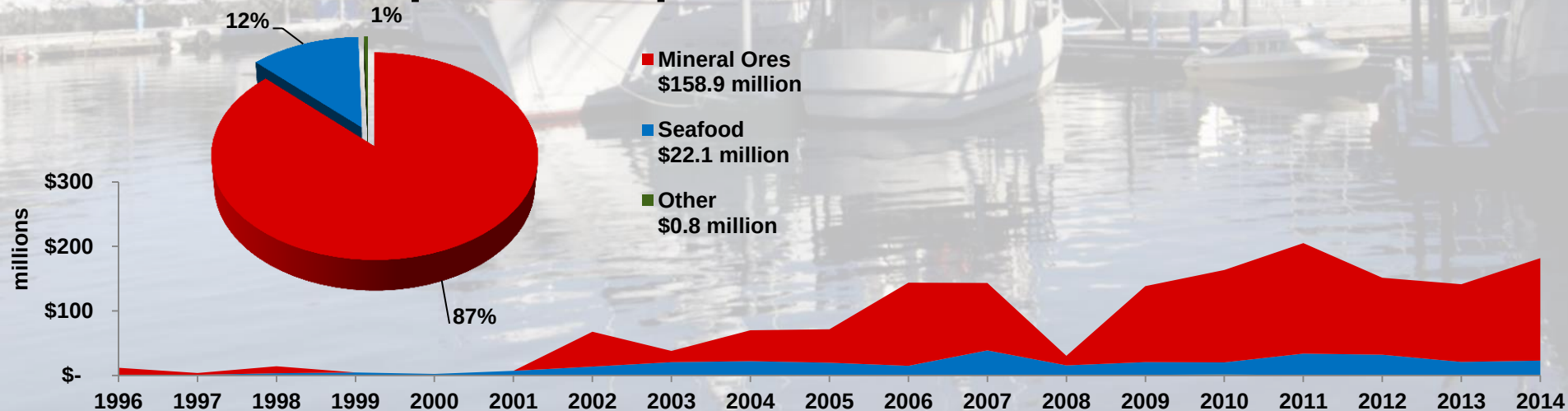

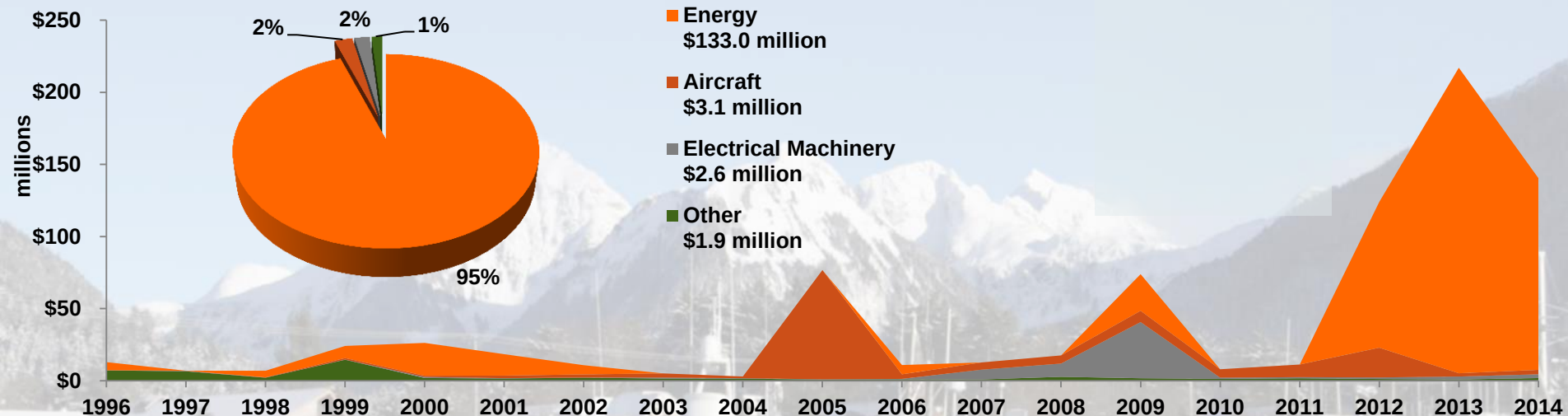

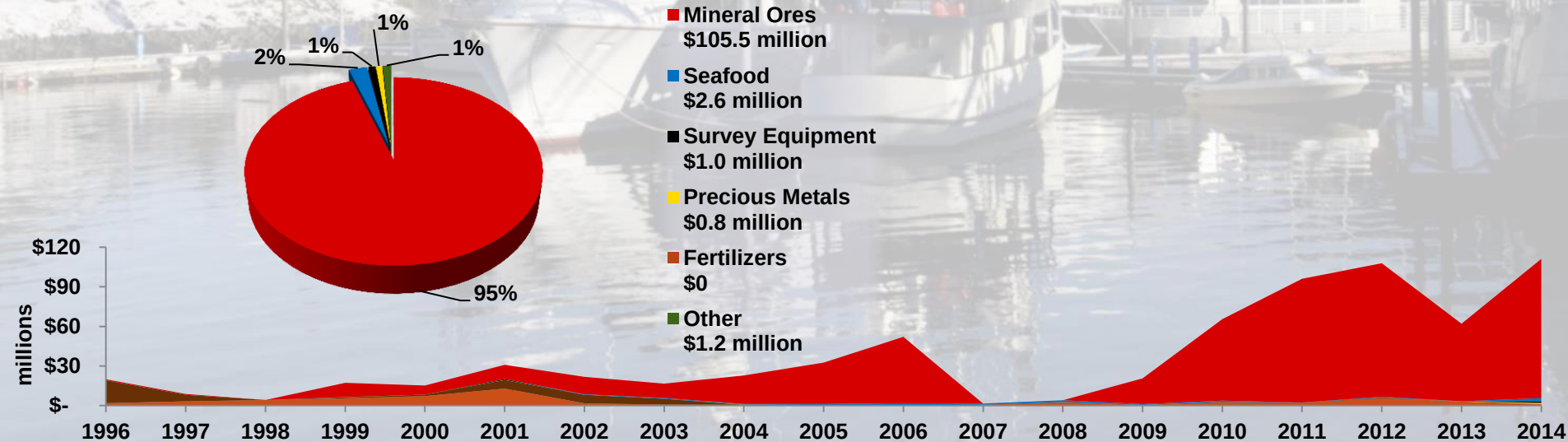

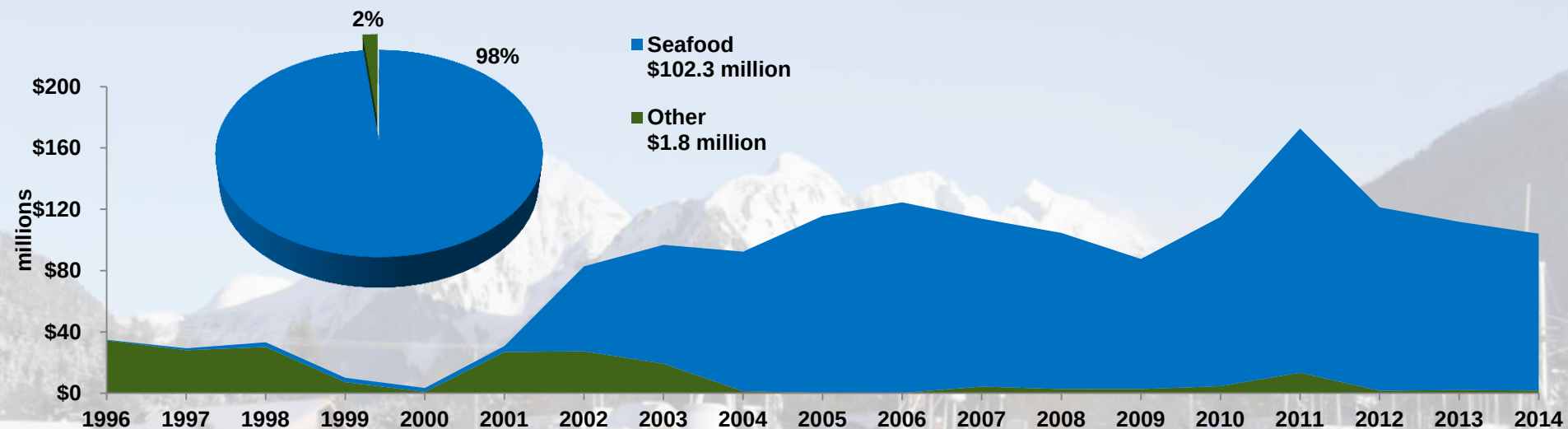

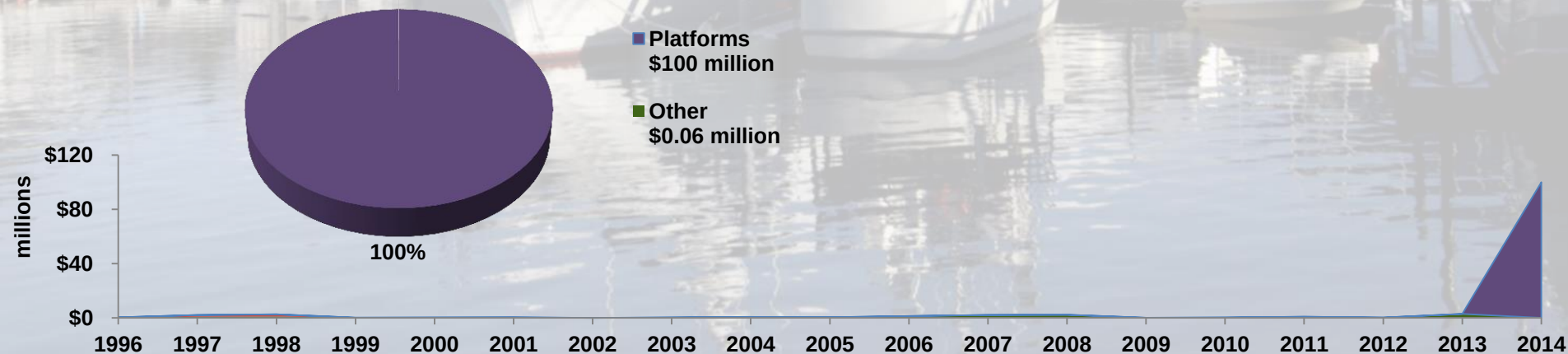

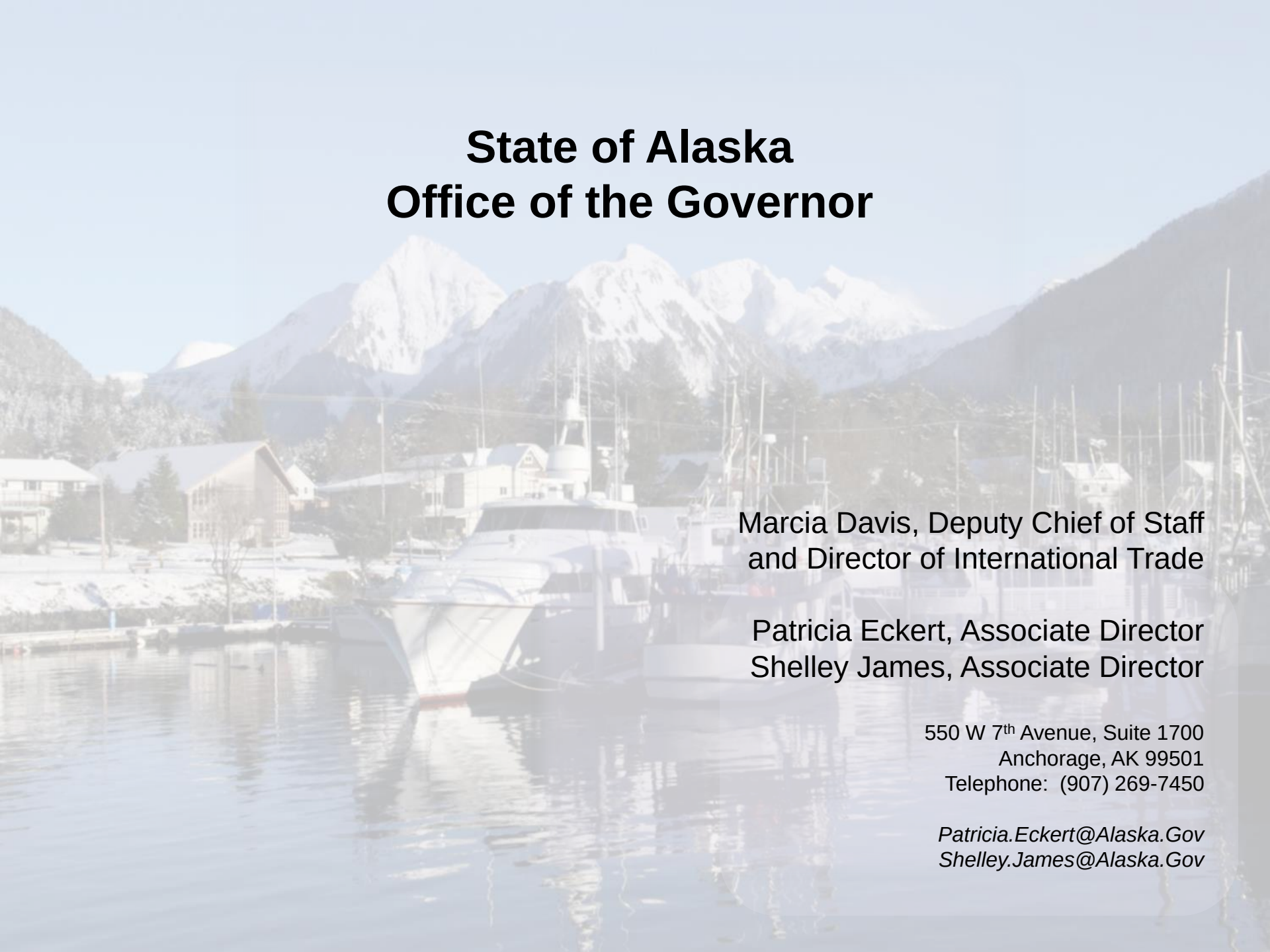


Alaska Exports to the Netherlands—\$104.1 million in 2014
