Alaska's Library Community Includes:

- **Association of School Librarians (AkASL)**
AkASL promotes school libraries in Alaska through programs such as Battle of the Books.
- **Alaska Center for the Book**
The Alaska Center for the Book highlights and promotes Alaska's literary heritage by calling attention to the importance of books, reading, literacy and libraries.
- **Alaska Community Foundation (ACF)**
ACF cultivates, celebrates, and sustains all forms of philanthropy to strengthen Alaska's communities forever and has grant programs that exist to strengthen organizations.
- **Alaska Humanities Forum**
The Alaska Humanities Forum is dedicated to strengthening and connecting communities across Alaska using the humanities and has grant programs.
- **Alaska Library Network**
ALN serves as the primary contact to its members for programs such as the Alaska Digital Library, SLED databases and the Alaska Library Catalog, and assists libraries as a fiscal agent.
- **American Library Association**
The American Library Association is the oldest and largest library association in the world. ALA distributes professional recognition awards, provides grants and scholarships, and organizes two major conferences annually.
- **Friends of Libraries, USA**
Friends of the Libraries, USA provides resources, services and networking opportunities for friends, trustees, and foundations to increase and enhance their efforts on behalf of public, academic, and school libraries.
- **The Foraker Group**
The Foraker Group serves as the state association and capacity building organization for nonprofits and tribes across Alaska.
- **Institute of Museum and Library Service (IMLS)**
IMLS advances, supports, and empowers America's libraries through grant making, research, and policy development.
- **International Society for Technology in Education (ISTE) Connect**
ISTE's Librarians Network promotes librarians as leaders and champions of educational technology.
- **National Endowment for the Arts (NEA)**
NEA supports participation in the arts, exercising imaginations, and developing creative capacities. NEA awards grants for arts based projects.
- **National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH)**
NEH promotes excellence in the humanities and conveys the lessons of history to all Americans. NEH awards grants for humanities and collections-related projects.

PNLA serves as a professional and social forum for librarians, library workers and library supporters throughout the Pacific Northwest region.
