She was 65' long. Emp. 4/13/1927/6 New Game Comm.boat launched at Seattle "Beaver", christened by Mrs. K. Talmadge and two sons. Will be used on the Yukon. Christened with bottle of Fairbanks water. Will be shipped to the Yukon and launched there. Emp. 6/18/1927/6 Yukon str. "Keno" hit a rock four miles below Whitehorse last week and sank. No loss of life. It is expected she will be raised and repaired. Emp. 7/14/1927/6 A.R.R. bought the river steamers. "White Seal", "Alice", "Reliance" and Minneapolis" Brom the White Pass and Yukon Nav. Co. PWB. June 1955 pp. 21 "Discovery" being built at College for use as an excursion boat on the Tanana out of Fairbanks, for the Alaska Riverways Co. and will operate with their "Godspeed" this season. Powered with 2 671 G.M. diesels and is a sternewheeler.

YUKON RIVER STEAMERS

11/8/1928/6 Largest craft ever built on the Upper Yukon is the new frtr. being built by the White Pass & Yukon Co. at Whitehorse. It is the 9th craft in the service of the Company and replaces a smaller steamer which will be held in reserve. 210' x 42' x 18" 3/13/1929/6 The new Bureau of Fisheries river boat "Coot" which replaces the "Tern" is now being built. 8/26/1929/7 The new steamer "Klondyke" of the White Pass & Yukon Co. made successful trial runs on Aug. 1st. She is 210' long and was recently built at Whitehorse. She is the largest steamer on the Upper River and is command. ed by Capt. C.M.Coughlan. 5/17/1933/6 "Nenana" new Gov't. steamer on Yukon, launched at Nenana on May 15th. 5/17/1934/6 Yukon River strs. "Nenana" and "Alice" to start up river Sun May, 20th. 10/22/1934/6 New river str. "Wallace Langley" being assembled on the Kuskokwim River to replace the old "Tana" which is now over 30 yrs. old --- ready next season.

6/13/1936 Yukon River str. "Whitehorse" picked up the pass. of the sunken str. "Klondike", which sank yesterday morning enroute from Whitehorse to Dawson. Total loss, but all pass. and crew O.K. 7/10/1936 SS "Casca" sinks in Yukon River. Hit sunken hull of the str. "Dawson" below Rink Rapids near Yukon Crossing last night and sank in 5 mins. Her 16 pass and the crew safe and flown to Dawson 9/17/1937/6 W.E.Springstun tells how crew of old Yukon str "Monarch" walked her over a sand-bar in 1912. VG. "Adventure" New (1954) being built for Yukon---a diesel sternwheeler. Album 44; pp. 5. 10/16/1939/6 Capt. C. W. Adams who has been a Capt. on the Yukon River for 41 years, is heded south for winter. He was on the "Nenana" of the Alaska R.R. this season. 10/11/1941/6 The Yukon Rive str. "Yukon" hit a rock 3 mi. above Eagle while enroute from Tanana to Dawson, and had to be beached. Water in river is lowest in history and season has remained open longer than in many years. Ice is just beginning to form in the rivers.
